They have enjoyed an upturn in fortunes following the return of John Sheridan to Boundary Park and will arrive here full of confidence, but we have had a good couple of days on the training pitch and if we do what we do best then I see no reason why we can't get back to winning ways this afternoon.

Please get behind the lads this afternoon and enjoy the game.

OLDHAM ATHLETIC

The Latics have been struggling at the wrong end of the Sky Bet League One table all season but have shown plenty of signs of improvement in recent weeks.

Beginning the 2016/17 campaign under the guidance of Stephen Robinson, Oldham got off to a disastrous start and only recorded just the one victory in August and September. Results failed to improve and they were without a victory in the league since 18th October, leading to Robinson's dismissal in January 2017.

Add to that the fact that Athletic were the lowest scorers in the English Football League with 12 goals in 24 games up until the New Year, then new boss John Sheridan certainly had his work cut out. However, back for his third spell in charge at Boundary Park, the former midfielder has sparked an upturn in fortunes.

Since beating Gillingham 1-0 in his first game back, Sheridan has guided his side to crucial victories against fellow strugglers Chesterfield and Coventry City, huge results which has lifted

them away from the relegation zone with the second-half of the season now in full swing.

However, they still have plenty of work to do in order to retain their League One status and they've struggled in the goalscoring department this term with centre-back Peter Clarke leading the Latics in scoring with five strikes. The likes of Josh Law and Ryan Flynn have also chipped in with goals from midfield and they will be expected to continue to do so between now and the end of the season.

Town came out on top the last time these two sides met earlier this season with well-crafted strikes from Jon Obika and Brandon Ormonde-Ottewill handing the Reds a richly deserved 2-0 win at Boundary Park in September 2016 – a feat they will be looking to repeat on home soil this afternoon.



DANGERMAN

PETER CLARKE

R&W TAKES A CLOSER LOOK AT ONE OF OLDHAM ATHLETIC'S DANGERMEN THIS AFTERNOON...

Although a defender, Clarke could well turn out to be one of the visitors' most influential figures at both ends of the pitch today.

The vastly experienced centreback began his career with Everton but made only nine appearances for the Toffees before joining Blackpool on a permanent basis in 2004. A move to Southend United followed in 2006, before Huddersfield Town came calling three years later. Clarke was a pivotal figure for the Terriers and was a key figure in their promotion out of League One via the Play-Offs in 2012, while he was twice crowned their Player of the Year, an honour he also received while with Bury (2015/16), Blackpool (2004/05) and Southend (2008/09).

Blessed with bags of experience, Clarke leads Oldham in scoring with five goals this season and he will be relied upon to deliver at both ends of the pitch this afternoon as his side aim to secure a big three points in the Sky Bet League One.

MEET THE REST

CHRIS KETTINGS

The keeper started his career with Blackpool before moving to Crystal Palace, although he failed to make a senior appearance for the Premier League outfit. Has also had loan spells with the likes of Birmingham City, Morecambe, York City and Stevenage, before joining Oldham in 2016. Has been capped five times by Scotland at U21 level.

KALLUM MANTACK

Progressed through the Academy ranks at Boundary Park and signed his first professional contract in April 2016, before making his debut for the first-team against Wigan Athletic earlier this season. Has gained valuable experience on loan at Alfreton Town this term.

GEORGE EDMUNDSON

Another product of the Athletic youth set-up, the defender was offered a twelve-month contract following the U18's 4-0 win against MK Dons in the 2015 Youth Alliance Cup Final. Played a handful of games at the end of the 2015/16 season and is both good in the air and with the ball at his feet.

CAMERON DUMMIGAN

Joined Oldham during the 2015/16 season initially on loan from Burnley, going on to make 26 appearances before making the move permanent in the summer of 2016. Was an unused substitute against Chelsea on the opening day of the 2014/15 Premier League campaign for the Clarets and has represented Northern Ireland at U17, U19 and U21 level.

AIDEN O'NEILL

Born in Brisbane, the Australian midfielder played his youth football for Brisbane Athletic before moving to these shores at the age of sixteen and signing for Burnley. O'Neill put pen to paper on his first professional contract in January 2016 and made his professional debut in August 2016 against Liverpool in the Premier League.

AARON AMADI-HOLLOWAY

Was released by Cardiff City as a youngster before joining Bristol City in 2011, although he was released three years later. Spells with the likes of Bath City, Newport County and Wycombe Wanderers followed, before he had a short stint on loan at Oldham in 2016. Returned to Boundary Park on a permanent deal last month.

TOPE OBADEYI

The much-travelled striker joined Oldham on Transfer Deadline Day until the end of the season and will hope to find his groove for the Latics. Began his career with Bolton Wanderers in 2008 but went on to rack up a string of loan spells with the likes of Town, Rochdale, Shrewsbury, Chesterfield, Plymouth Argyle and Dundee United.

DARIUS OSEI

Oldham snapped up the young forward from non-league side Stalybridge Celtic in July 2016 for an undisclosed fee. Regarded as a hot prospect, Osei has scored two goals in 23 appearances this season.

CONNOR RIPLEY



The 23-yearold spent last season on loan at SPL side Motherwell, making 36 appearances. At 6' 3" he commands

his area well and has made five appearances for England at U20 level. Ripley has been in inspirational form this season and has singlehandedly won points for Athletic.

CHARLES DUNNE



The tall fullback came through the ranks at Wycombe Wanderers and signed professional terms in 2011.

Spells with Staines Town and Blackpool followed before Dunne returned to Wycombe on loan. Signed for Oldham on a short-term deal in August 2016 and has represented the Republic of Ireland at U21 level.

ANTHONY GERRARD



The central defender started his third spell with the football club, signing a two-anda-half-year deal in the January transfer window. Gerrard, cousin

of former Liverpool captain Steven, has a wealth of experience in the game and is a no nonsense centre-back. The 31-year-old was instrumental in keeping the club in the Sky Bet League One last season and will want to do the same this term.

JAMIE RECKORD



Quick paced fullback who likes to take on defenders down the flanks. Spent the last two seasons in Scotland with SPL side Ross County

where he made 46 appearances. Had loan spells at Plymouth Argyle, Coventry City, Northampton Town and Scunthorpe United, in addition to spending a brief stint with Town. Now looking to settle in the North West with Oldham.

BRIAN WILSON



With over 400 senior games under his belt, Wilson has bags of experience in the EFL. Is also hugely versatile and can play anywhere across the back-

four. Recovered from niggling injuries in the 2015-2016 season and was one of the outstanding players for Latics as they escaped relegation with a magnificent late run last term. Signed a 12 month extension to his contract in July 2016.

CHRIS TAYLOR



Taylor came through the youth system at Oldham Athletic and made over 250 appearances during a seven-year spell between 2005-12.

He joined Millwall in 2012 and scored four goals in 26 appearances before moving back north to join Blackburn Rovers and then Bolton Wanderers. Rejoined Oldham until the end of the 2016/17 campaign on Deadline Day.

RYAN MCLAUGHLIN



Northern Ireland U23 international who started his career at Liverpool before joining Barnsley. Spent last season in the

SPL with Aberdeen. Adds pace down the right and has two goals to his name so far this term.

PAUL GREEN



The vastly experienced central midfielder joined the Latics in August 2016 from Rotherham. Green is a proven performer in the Football League

and helped Doncaster Rovers secure three promotions in five years, in addition to capturing the Football League Trophy. Has also featured for the likes of Derby County and Leeds United and has won over twenty caps for the Republic of Ireland.

RYAN FLYNN



Signed for Athletic in July 2016 having previously plied his trade for Sheffield United. Joined the Blades in 2011 and played a

huge role in helping United embark on lengthy runs in both the FA Cup and the League Cup. An exciting midfield player who has three goals and four assists for Oldham so far this term.

OUSMANE FANE



French-born midfield player who joined the Latics for a five-figure fee in August 2016 from Kidderminster, putting pen

to paper on a two-year deal. The 23-year-old is highly-rated at Boundary Park and provides plenty of hustle and bustle in the middle of the park.

OLLIE BANKS



Banks began his career with Rotherham United, scoring on his professional debut in May 2011. In September 2013, Banks signed a

professional contract with Chesterfield and won the Football League's Young Player of the Month Award in November 2013. Signed for Athletic in July 2016 and has two goals and four assists for the Latics so far this term.

LEE ERWIN



Lee Erwin joined Athletic on loan for the 2016-2017 season from Leeds United in July. The ex- Motherwell Academy striker

has played for Scotland at U17, U19 and U21 level and provides plenty of height and strength up top for the Latics.



MANAGER

JOHN SHERIDAN

The experienced EFL gaffer is back with the Latics for a third spell and he will be hoping to help retain their League One status between now and the end of the 2016/17 campaign.

Sheridan put pen to paper on a twoand-a-half-year deal back in January 2017 and has already made a positive impact, guiding Athletic to crucial wins against sides below them in the table.

Rewinding back to his playing days, the former midfielder began his playing career with Manchester City but failed to make the grade and sealed a switch to Leeds United in 1982. He enjoyed great success with the Whites and bagged 47 league goals in 230 appearances, helping his side reach the Semi-Finals of the FA Cup.

Sheridan was a hugely popular figure at Elland Road but he fell out of favour under Howard Wilkinson in 1989 and was snapped up by Nottingham Forest for a fee of £650,000. However, he made just the one outing for Forest and was soon on the move to Sheffield Wednesday, for whom he arguably played his best football for.

He scored a stunning goal to help Wednesday defeat Manchester United in the 1991 Football League Cup Final and also played a key role in their promotion that same season. Spells with Birmingham City, Bolton Wanderers and Doncaster Rovers followed before Sheridan finished his playing career with Oldham in 2004, in addition to winning 34 caps for the Republic of Ireland and scoring the 100th Irish international goal at Lansdowne Road against Bolivia in 1994.

Sheridan has carved out a long and distinguished career as a manager in the Football League with a number of different clubs. In his first spell at Oldham, he guided the Latics to the League One Play-Offs during the 2006/07 season, where they were defeated by Blackpool in the Semi-Finals.

Chesterfield was Sheridan's next destination in June 2009 and promotion from League Two followed in April 2011 after a memorable campaign, which ended in the club being crowned Champions following a 3-1 victory against Gillingham on the final day of the season. Chesterfield won the Football League Trophy the

following term but relegation back to the Football League's basement division soon followed and Sheridan was relieved of his duties in August 2012.

However, Sheridan wasn't out of work for too long and he returned to football with Plymouth Argyle in January 2013, winning the League Two Manager of the Month Award in March of that year. Eight wins and four draws secured the Pilgrims' League Two status, which led to Sheridan being rewarded with a three-year contract.

After suffering Play-Off disappointment in 2015, Sheridan departed and went on to have spells with Newport County and Oldham Athletic and Notts County, while he was Northern Ireland's Assistant Manager during Euro 2016.

Having guided Oldham to safety last term, Sheridan will be hoping to repeat that feat this time around and has made a positive start to life back at Boundary Park ahead of today's crunch showdown at The County Ground.







"It has been difficult with the results but it has been good to get back into the group and settle into the way of playing again. Hopefully we will get some results soon."


You came back here to play regular first-team football, which is exactly what you have been doing, so how important has it been for you to be back out in the thick of the action?

The results have been far from ideal in recent weeks, but what are your thoughts on our current performances and where can we improve?





Is remaining focused also key as we saw against Northampton


on Tuesday that a slight lapse in concentration after we equalised ultimately cost us?


I think everyone can see that it is not that. It is our job to keep that belief strong and it doesn't waver for us. It starts with the Captain and his belief is paramount and that transcends to the rest of the squad. But, as I said, once the level of performance improves then the results will come."

On to today's game against Oldham Athletic and it is another huge game at the bottom of the table. What do you expect from them?

"They are right with us at the bottom of the table and every game is a big one now. We need to win the game and that will breed confidence and hopefully we can then go on a bit of a run."

Finally, we're back at The County Ground following two away games on the bounce and the home fans will have a huge role to play this afternoon, won't they?

"The fans have been brilliant with me personally and hopefully they can turn out again and support the whole team. We might not score until the 92nd minute or we might score in the first minute, but we need them to stay behind us the whole way. We will give them everything and hopefully that level of performance will be there and we will get the three points."

Jesse, you have been here for a couple of weeks now so how have you found things at SN1 so far?

ON THIS DAY:

18 FEBRUARY

1905

Freddy Wheatcroft, in his first season with Swindon, made it six goals in six appearances in a 2-1 Southern League victory over Bristol Rovers. Jimmy Poppitt - whose brother and son both signed for the club - grabbed the other.

1950

One of three brothers to sign for Town, Roy Onslow spent almost nine years with the club. He netted his first League goal in a 2-1 win at Newport - watched by over 10,600! The other goal came from winger Jimmy Bain.

1967

Fifty years ago today, Swindon beat Bury 2-1 in front of a 24,452 gate to earn themselves a place in the last sixteen of the FA Cup. Wing-half Keith Morgan headed the first on 18 minutes and just after the interval some typical trickery from Don Rogers doubled the lead. Bury's reply came from Barry Lowes, who would sign on at The County Ground 18 months later.

1978

With Third Division opponents Wrexham in FA Cup action, Town took on Fort Lauderdale Strikers in a friendly at The County Ground. Former England keeper Gordon Banks turned out for the US side. The 1,173 who braved the icy conditions were rewarded with nine goals! Chris Guthrie (two), Chris Kamara, 'Chic' Bates, David Moss and Roy Carter all found the target in a 6-3 win.

1989

Swindon came back from an early Gordon Armstrong goal to go 3-1 up at the break against Sunderland - all three coming in the space of 17 minutes. Duncan Shearer grabbed a brace and Alan McLoughlin also found the target. Steve White added a fourth ten minutes into the second period.

2012

Five years ago today, Town secured their seventh successive League win - 2-1 at Hereford - courtesy of Paul Caddis (penalty) and Paul Benson. Arsenal loanee Daniel Boateng made his debut.

Following a blank weekend - when Walsall's visit was called off with seven Swindon players suffering from flu - Town travelled to Millmoor.

With the gentle slope there in the home side's favour in the first half, Macari's men battled to make any headway and it was not until the final 35 minutes that they stamped their authority on the game to secure all three points.

There were just five minutes of normal time remaining when Phil King - impressive in his first full game - overlapped down the left flank and sent in a perfect far-post cross for Dave Bamber to head into the bottom corner for his 16th strike of the season.

The hosts had opened brightly; Fraser Digby being





forced to leap to push away a rasping effort from Mick Gooding after only five minutes. The England under-21 stopper then denied Daral Pugh the opportunity to put his side in front.

Swindon were unable to produce an effort on target before the break but that soon changed after the switch of ends. They twice went close before Jimmy Quinn made the breakthrough on 57 minutes.

Chris Kamara charged towards the area before floating the ball into the centre for the Irishman to head home.

Town should have doubled their lead with 12 minutes left, when Colin Douglas upended Peter Coyne in the area. Coyne took the penalty himself, but his shot hit the outside of the keeper's right-hand post.


Fortunately, Bamber popped up to rectify matters - which was just as well, as only two minutes after that Gooding hit home a spot kick for Rotherham following

a foul on Gareth Evans by Colin Calderwood.



Just 19 when he arrived at The County Ground, Phil was signed following an initial one-month loan. After a very brief appearance from the bench 24 hours after signing, he slotted into the left full-back role and started all 25 remaining games as Town went on to celebrate play-off success.

Phil then played in all 58 games in 1987/88 and only injury and suspension prevented him from posting another maximum the following season.

Following a victory at Brighton early in November 1989, Phil moved to Hillsborough in a deal valued at £400,000, although Swindon netted only two-thirds of that as the remainder was due to Torquay in a sell-on agreement.

Some 180 appearances and seven years later, Phil returned to Wiltshire. By his own admission "unfit and overweight", he played in just a handful of games under Steve McMahon before a knee injury put paid to a career that had taken him to an England "B" callup in 1991.

Having become a regular fixture in Town's starting XI in recent weeks, the flying full-back is confident results will start to improve sooner rather than later.

After missing a chunk of the season through illness and injury, Brophy is back to doing what he does best and has been a real bright spark for the Reds despite recent results.

The 22-year-old embarked on a magical run against Northampton on Tuesday evening before laying on a superb cross for Luke Norris to head home the equaliser.

However, that joy was short-lived as John-Joe O'Toole notched what proved to be the winner for the Cobblers just seconds later, inflicting a fifth straight defeat on Town.

But Brophy is refusing to get too downbeat and he believes there were positives to take from the defeat to Northampton.

"We created a bit more against Northampton than we did against Bury but naivety crept in a bit where we've worked so hard to get ourselves back in the game and we've let it slip less than a minute later," he said.

"We all know our jobs and there was maybe an adrenaline rush from the goal but it was probably just a bit of naivety from us to let it slip so quick.

"I am much better going forward than I am going back and running at players is what I like to do best and I was able to do that quite a lot against Northampton. "The team keep the ball well, keep it for long periods and it allows the wing-backs to get high up the pitch and attack the defence and going from side-to-side and pushing the ball through to the wing-backs to deliver it into the box is where we believe we'll get our goals from.

"I thought we defended better and more as a team on Tuesday and we've just got to go back to the drawing board and make sure that we cut out the little mistakes. I don't think there was too much wrong on Tuesday and it could have gone either way, so we've got to go back to training and cut out those mistakes.

"We've had a run of bad luck and everyone says that it evens itself out over the course of a season, so hopefully in the next few games we'll get a bit of luck on our side."

Oldham Athletic are the visitors to SN1 this afternoon and Brophy has admitted that it is a must-win fixture for Town.

"It definitely is and we've needed to get our act together for the last two games and we've come out of both games disappointed, so today is an even bigger game," he added.

"We need to make sure we are fully prepared for it and we're going for the three points and nothing less."



WITH JEREMY NEWTON

It has been a busy week for Town's Academy Manager who handed scholarships to a number of the club's U16s...



















It was decision time upon the U16s last week and we are pleased to announce that Archie Matthews, Elliott Duggan, Harry Stanley, Jacob Bancroft, Joe Blackwell, Luke Haines, Ralph Graham, Teo Atik and Wilf White will all be joining us next season.

Again, with any decision, it is one that takes a long time as we consider everything and the offers we've done for the boys are subject to a medical and screening, which Tom Holmes, our U18s Physiotherapist, and Dan Watson, our U18s Strength and Conditioning Coach, will do and they will screen the boys before contracts are offered to make sure that there are no problems with them both short-term and long-term.

There are certain things that can be corrected through their individual programmes once they come on full-time and we then liaise with the schools to maintain their education targets. It is getting harder and harder now for the scholarship agreement to be fulfilled with their education requirements due to the education reforms. They need three core subjects now of English, Maths and Science, A-C, before they are even considered for gaining a youth contract. It will be five core subjects in

the future and that goes hand-in-hand with our Day Release Programme.

The Merit League for our U16s and U18s starts this weekend and we'll have fixtures all the way up until the first week of May, so the second part of the season starts now and some of the U15s will have to step to the U16s and that will give them a taste of what it is like at the level above. Subsequently, that will happen with the U15s, U14s, U13s, U12s and so on as well.

Finally, decisions on our Second Years will be made shortly and again it is important that they complete their framework before a decision is made. Their college is going smoothly at the moment and they've got their Level Two Coaching to complete, so it is important that they get all of that through. The players receive a cash bonus for completing the framework and the club will also receive an amount per player and per framework, so it is in everyone's interest to get these boys through before making decisions upon them. Alan McLoughlin, the First-Team Management staff and myself will then sit down and discuss the futures of these players and we hope that we

> can certainly offer some of the players a professional contract at Swindon Town.



understand why they play different formations so if they do reach the first-team at any point then they are familiar with different shapes, different systems and it is an education for them.





SUPER SAMMY SAYS

BBC Wiltshire pundit and Town legend Sam Parkin reflects on Tuesday's outing at Northampton Town and looks back on his time with today's visitors, Oldham Athletic...

In terms of the League position, today's game is as big as they come at The County Ground. Tuesday's result at Sixfields was a sickening blow after the team had rallied well in the second-half.

The equalising goal was right up there as one of the best of the season. Brilliant incisive wing play from James Brophy and an excellent finish from Luke Norris. To concede the winner straight away was very hard to stomach and the players have to banish the memory of that when they step out of the tunnel to face a resurgent Oldham Athletic team this afternoon.

After Northampton on Tuesday, it is another game against one of my former clubs. Unlike my year with the Cobblers, I have very happy memories of a loan spell at Boundary Park the previous season. The team was in a similar predicament to that of now but managed to gather enough points to escape relegation to the bottom



tier. I had a slow start but managed to force my way into the side and score a few goals.

Oldham's new manager John Sheridan was in his final days as a player and it was a brilliant experience for me as a teenager to be on the same team-sheet as him. Growing up I was completely obsessed with the game. Playing it, watching it and talking about it. When I started getting the opportunity to play with some of the fellas I'd watched on the TV it was an incredible feeling. John was probably one of the first I lined up with that falls into that category. Later on people like Jim Magilton, Kevin Horlock, Don Hutchison and Kevin Gallen are players that I'd also put on that list. All I ever dreamt of as a child was to play professional football in a packed stadium.

It seemed so unthinkable at a young age that when it became a reality it was actually quite strange meeting those chaps as I almost felt they were superheroes back then! I even had a QPR shirt with Kevin Gallen's name on the back so becoming teammates with him and then pals was all very odd.

Times have changed. There's so much football on the TV now from all corners of the globe that I think less children are going to watch their local team. Therefore, I think the interest in clubs away from the elite has suffered. Kids are more likely to hail Lionel Messi as their hero rather than Ray Wilkins or Roy Wegerle as it was for me.

If you add to that the social media explosion, I think there's a wider range of interests for young people to pursue. It's not necessary a bad thing it's just how the world is changing. For me it was football, football, girls, football in that order!

I noticed as I got older that the young players in the dressing room didn't have the knowledge of the game like I did growing up. And that surprised me. I know I may be at the extreme end of the scale [I once made my mum stop the car in the pouring Hammersmith rain so I could run after Butch Wilkins] but I do think it's a clear indication of how our sport is changing and not always for the better.

Before I actually turn into a fossil I'll return to today's game and leave you with this.

Whatever your feelings are at the moment towards your club - the players and the staff need your backing for the whole 90 minutes today. The league table tells you that results haven't been good enough but we're a funny breed us footballers. One win can make everything feel so much better. There's still a lot of action to come over the next few months so I urge you all to sing up today and support the club that you love.

 As a general rule, SAS Travel have to order coaches one week before the fixture date. Therefore if you leave booking until within this time, they cannot always guarantee that there will still be spaces available.

- After this time, SAS Travel will always try (alongside) their coach provider) to source further coaches and meet all the demand for spaces, although they cannot run a coach unless economically viable to do so.
- SAS Travel tend to open games for booking around three weeks before the fixture date and usually have three fixtures booking at any one time. This may increase to four due to fixture rearrangements.
- SAS Travel advise that the best policy is to book as early as you can to ensure that you get the spaces that you want.


