

their support by buying tickets for Wembley in April, but we also need your presence at all of our 14 remaining league games. That could be the difference.




injuries today - with competition for places stronger than ever.


Lastly, the fans played a huge part last week.

Coventry City FC ticket details have been confirmed for the visit to Wembley on Sunday April 2nd, as the Sky Blues meet either Luton Town or Oxford United in the Checkatrade Trophy Final.

City have fought through five rounds of the competition, maintaining a 100% win record throughout, and scoring a total of 18 goals in the process.

Revisiting the famous national stadium for the first time in 30 years - and for the very first time since it was rebuilt in 2007 - City make the trip to Wembley on the first weekend in April, in a 2:30pm kick-off.

Tickets went on priority sale at 9am, on Monday 20th February to Season Ticket holders, and to date the club have sold in excess of 20,000 tickets! Given the overwhelming nature of sales, we are now selling tickets for Wembley Level 5.








SWINDON TOWN

HEAD COACH



LUKE WILLIAMS

Robins head coach Luke Williams has worked his way up from grassroots coaching right up to the higher levels of football management, going from working in the community to managing a League One outfit in the space of ten years.

Although Williams spent time on the books of Norwich City and Bristol Rovers as a youth, he was not retained by either club, soon dropping down into non-league football. A disastrous knee injury incurred at Ashford Town hospitalised Luke, but more importantly, kept him out of the game for three full years.

Williams was forced into premature retirement, but would look to forge an alternative path within football. He started out

with Kickz, a partnership between West Ham United and the police to keep teens off the streets, before working as an FA Skills Coach, combining the role with part-time coaching at Leyton Orient.

Still a relatively obscure name within the game, Williams nevertheless impressed bosses at Brighton and Hove Albion, who appointed the 29-year-old ahead of other experienced candidates as their new youth coach. His fresh approach to player development had a decisive impact on some of the Seagulls' up-and-coming stars, including England Under-21 internationals Jake Forster-Caskey and Solly March, as well as firstteam mainstay Lewis Dunk.

After three years on the coast, Williams was appointed as first team coach at Swindon Town under Mark Cooper, and would

ultimately work his way up to an assistant manager role at the County Ground. This management team led the Robins into the play-offs, only to be comprehensively defeated by Preston North End in the final.

By October that same year, Swindon were hovering over the relegation places, and Cooper was dismissed from his post. Williams stayed on to assist the incoming Martin Ling, and took the reins himself on a caretaker basis when Ling abruptly resigned before the turn of 2016.

Under the caretaker's stewardship, the Robins won their next two games, leading to the full-time appointment of Williams in late January. Swindon won eight and drew a further seven before the close of play, securing a relatively comfortable mid-table position of fifteenth.

However, Town have struggled during the first full year of Williams' tenure, having won just once in the league since late November. Like Coventry, Swindon currently occupy one of the relegation places, and supporters in Wiltshire will be looking to their young head coach to turn it around.

THE VISITORS **SWINDON TOWN**

The 2015 play-off final may feel like a distant memory to the Swindon Town faithful, who have watched their side slip down the League One table over the past two years. Now, similar to City, the Robins find themselves embroiled in a relegation battle, having picked up just six points since the turn of the year.

The season started well enough for Luke Williams' men, triumphing over Coventry City courtesy of Yaser Kasim's late strike. After a 3-1 defeat on the road to Chesterfield, the Robins embarked upon a three-game unbeaten run, draws at Gillingham and Peterborough United coming either side of a 1-0 home win over Port Vale.

However, Town would go on to lose their next three games on the bounce, including home defeats to Bury and Bristol Rovers. Victory at Oldham Athletic stopped the rot, but wins remained scarce at the County Ground. Further draws at Shrewsbury and AFC Wimbledon went some way to mitigating more home losses to Northampton Town and Bolton Wanderers.

Fortune was on Swindon's side against visiting Rochdale, who missed a penalty and had a man sent off during a 3-0 defeat at the County Ground. November proved a more productive month for the Wiltshire outfit, losing just once in four games. Wins to nil against Charlton Athletic and Bradford City helped to elevate the club out

of the drop zone, but that triumph over the Bantams would be Swindon's last of 2016.

A 1-1 draw at home to Fleetwood Town was Swindon's only crumb of comfort in December, as losses at Sheffield United, Millwall and MK Dons kept the club perilously close to the bottom four. 2017 began with a goalless stalemate in Wiltshire against Southend United, and only a late Mat Sadler goal denied the Robins all three points against Shrewsbury Town five days

Kasim was the hero for Swindon once more at Bolton Wanderers, coming up with the goods again in the 89th minute to snatch a priceless victory at the Macron Stadium - their first victory in six games.

However, Swindon could not build on their triumph in the North West, losing their next five games on the bounce. The Robins have lost by the narrowest of margins on every occasion, including a late 2-1 defeat at Northampton Town. where Luke Norris' late leveller was cancelled out by John-Joe O'Toole one minute later.

Despite their barren run, Swindon Town remain within touching distance of Bury in 20th - and will be looking to take a large step towards safety this afternoon.

Oldham goalkeeper Connor Ripley was the difference after Swindon were held to a goalless draw with the Latics last weekend, Nicky Ajose coming close on numerous occasions, but denied by the gloves of the Oldham stopper.

SWINDON TOWN

Opposition goalkeeper Connor Ripley - who is leading the division's clean sheets tally - was the difference after Swindon were held to a goalless draw with Oldham last weekend, despite fan favourite Nicky Ajose going close on a number of occasions.

Swindon re-signed 25-year old forward Ajose on loan from Charlton in January, after his summer departure, while also acquiring the services of Rohan Ince and Jesse Starkey from Brighton on deadline day to boost their firepower.

And with both Darnell Furlong and Michael Doughty - Swindon's top assist providers with four apiece - recalled by QPR, Luke Williams was forced to further dip in to the transfer market in January. Interestingly, the Wiltshire outfit

haven't fielded a player over the age of 26 all season.

Ajose made the switch to the Addicks in June but returned for a third spell at the Wiltshire club.



on the final day of the transfer window, with the trio taking Swindon's signings for the month to eight. Ince has since featured twice for the Robins, starting in their 0-0 draw with Oldham, while Starkey is yet to feature.

In a much changed line-up since day one of the season, where midfielder Yaser Kasim bagged a late winner, only five of those XI starters featured in Swindon's last fixture.

Nathan Thompson has been a near constant, making 27 appearances at the heart of the Robins defence, and was partnered by Liverpool loanee Lloyd Jones last time out, with Swindon having lost traditional centre-half Jamie Sendles-White to an ACL injury in September.

Twenty-three-year old Lawrence Vigouroux is Swindon's no.1 choice stopper, but has seen red twice this season, ironically in both the away and home ties against Oxford United, although the latter was subsequently rescinded by the FA.


Ex-Arsenal man Brandon Ormonde-Ottewill tends to occupy the left full-back position, and was mirrored by Bradley Barry on the right against Oldham - the 22-year old's first inclusion since early January.

Chelsea U23s starlet Fankaty
Dabo will also be in contention if
Swindon opt to play an expansive
3-5-2 formation, with the Blues
loanee playing as part of a back
three against Northampton
recently.

Ben Gladwin is a sure fire starter in midfield, with his versatility allowing him to play centrally or out on the wing. Gladwin and Swindon teammate Massimo Luongo joined Queens Park Rangers in 2015, but the 24-year old has since had two loan spells back at the Robins. Standing at 6ft 2', the combative midfielder has accumulated five yellow cards in his last six outings, and will be a threat if allowed to drift forward undetected.

Another product of the famed Cobham academy, Chelsea loanman Charlie Colkett is likely to play centrally, with James Brophy out wide. Colkett, 20, has represented England from U16 level to U20, and is another highly thought of youngster in West London.





Having transitioned from Non-League football, Brophy can play wide midfield or as a wing-back, should the Robins formation dictate. The 22-year old has made 24 appearances this term, scoring once against QPR in the EFL Cup.

Finally, the Sky Blues will have to nullify the threat of Jonathan Obika and Nicky Ajose up top, and despite the no.9 only netting three times this season, he is a constant presence in an opposition box.

Obika, now 26, has been used more sparingly this season, only featuring 18 times. Ajose however has made 32 appearances, but is yet to find his scoring touch since he was reunited with the Robins in January.



The Swindon skipper has been at the club since a trainee, making his professional debut in the formally named Johnstone's Paint Trophy against Torquay United in 2010.

Thompson was announced as captain ahead of the 2014/15 season and has since been a regular in the side, making over 150 appearances in the EFL to date.

The 26-year old has been on target twice this season, scoring in the 3-0 win against Rochdale and the 4-1 defeat at Scunthorpe in October.



LAWRENCE **VIGOUROUX**

The Chilean-born shot stopper was signed by Premier League side Liverpool in 2014, spending two-years at the Merseyside club before switching to the Robins.

After two successful loan spells at the club, in which he made over 60 appearances, Swindon paid a reported £400,000 for his services in the summer.

Vigouroux has kept eight clean sheets so far this season, but has also been dismissed twice in the home and away legs of league ties against local rivals Oxford United.

Using their strong connections with Premier League leaders Chelsea, Swindon acquired young midfielder Charlie Colkett onloan during the January transfer window.

The 20-year spent the first half of the season at fellow League One side Bristol Rovers, scoring three goals in his 17 appearances.

Colkett has featured seven times since signing, most recently in the goalless draw with fellow strugglers Oldham Athletic.



NICKY AJOSE

After leaving the Robins in the summer to represent fellow League One side Charlton Athletic, Ajose rejoined the club in January on-loan.

The frontman had a stellar season with Swindon last year, scoring 25 goals in 40 appearances, and the club will be hoping he can make a similar impact this time around.

The 25-year old has featured on four occasions since resigning on a short term deal, and is yet to open his scoring account.



BEN GLADWIN

Having begun his EFL career at the Robins, Gladwin joined Queens Park Rangers in 2015 for a reported £1.5million fee alongside teammate Massimo Luongo.

After two further loan spells in Wiltshire, Gladwin resigned for a third time in January and made an immediate impact against high-flying Bolton.

He hit a 65th minute equalizer before Yaser Kasim scoring a dramatic 89th minute goal to earn the Robins a valuable three points.

Swindon's joint-second top goalscorer in the league this season with three goals, Obika has featured on 17 occasions. His most recent strike earned his side a point in the 1-1 draw with Southend in November.

The striker begun his career with Premier League side Tottenham, but after 11 different loan spells he signed for the Robins in 2014 on a permanent deal.

Samuel Ricketts


Swindon Town (2015) - 11 games, 1 goal Coventry City (2015-17) - 50 games, 1 goal

By 2015, Sam Ricketts had earned a steadfast reputation as a dependable and versatile defender. The ex-Wales international had featured extensively for Swansea City in his early career, before enjoying four seasons in the Premier League, helping Hull City earn promotion prior to a three-year spell with Bolton Wanderers.

However, having skippered
Wolverhampton Wanderers to the
League One title, Ricketts was
deemed surplus to requirements by
Kenny Jackett. He was allowed to
move on loan for the final months of
his Wolves contract, joining up with
Swindon Town for the latter part of their
promotion campaign. Sam made eleven

appearances in total for the Robins, featuring in their play-off bid, notably scoring in the semi-final first leg at Sheffield United.

Having become a free agent in the summer of 2015, Ricketts opted to remain in the Midlands with Coventry City. The 33-year-old's vast experience saw him appointed captain of the side under Tony Mowbray, often marshalling the side from a more central role in a Sky Blues back three. Ricketts missed just three league games over the course of 2015/16, but was sidelined early in the following season with a knee injury, which ultimately forced the defender into retirement in late 2016.



Conor **Thomas**

Coventry City (2010-2016) - 117 games, 1 goal Swindon Town (2016-present) - 28 games, 0 goals

One of many young players to emerge from Coventry City's academy setup, midfielder Conor Thomas showed very early promise at the Alan Higgs Centre. A tenacious young centre-mid, Conor turned out six times for England's Under-17 side and earned a single cap at the next age bracket. He made his debut in the FA Cup at the age of just seventeen, and had a short loan spell at Liverpool in the early months of 2011, only for a hamstring injury to scupper any potential permanent move.

Nevertheless, Conor made the breakthrough at his hometown, starting 24 league fixtures as Coventry slipped out of the Championship. Having been handed the number four shirt, big things were expected of the teenager in League One, but an injury-plagued year limited his impact on the pitch. Although Thomas bounced back to feature prominently for the Sky Blues throughout 2013/14, he found game time harder to come by in the next two seasons, with John Fleck and later Romain Vincelot preferred names in midfield.

When his contract at the Ricoh expired in May 2016, Swindon Town took him in on trial, ultimately offering him a three-year contract in July. Since joining the Robins, the defensive midfielder has been tasked with occupying a number of unfamiliar positions, including centre-half and right-back, in order to compensate for the mounting injury list at the County Ground.



Jack Stephens

Swindon Town (2014-2015) - 51 games, 1 goal Coventry City (2015-2016) - 16 games, 0 goals

England Under-21 international Jack looks set to break into the first team at Southampton, but the promising defender has spent much of his senior career on the road. The rightback was snapped up by the Saints from Plymouth Argyle at the age of seventeen, moving down to the South Coast in January 2011. After making his debut in early 2012 - against none other than Coventry City in the FA Cup - Stephens would not feature for the next year and a half.

In order to aid his development and gain exposure to first team football, Southampton sent Stephens out on loan to Swindon Town in March 2014. Having turned out ten times during an initial loan spell in Wiltshire, the Robins moved to re-sign him the following season, ultimately keeping the centre-half for the entire campaign. The defender endeared himself to supporters with a series of good performances



throughout 2014/15, but did not enjoy a similar run at Middlesbrough the following year, making just a handful of appearances before his premature recall.

Eager for Jack to feature with more prominence in the Football League, Ronald Koeman sent his young charge to the Ricoh in February 2016. Stephens took advantage of a series of injuries across the Cov backline, turning out sixteen times in the final three months of the season.


Jordan Turnbull

Swindon Town (2014-16) - 97 games, 1 goal Coventry City (2016-present) - 33 games, 2 goals

Like Jack Stephens, centre-half Jordan Turnbull was loaned out from Southampton to Swindon Town for the duration of the 2014/15 campaign. However, Turnbull had affiliation with the Robins prior, playing their youth team until he reached his teens, before the Saints swept in to poach the developing defender. Unlike Stephens, Jordan did not make his bow for the Premier League outfit before heading out on loan - but he certainly showed promise at the County Ground.

Lining up in the heart of defence, Turnbull was often partnered with his clubmate or Raphael Rossi Branco. The youngster shone as part of the Robins' back four, earning the club's Player of the Season gong for 2014/15. Swindon managed to stave off competition from Championship clubs to secure his loan signature for a second year, and Turnbull soon added versatility to his game, filling in at leftback for much of his second year.

Turnbull left Southampton in 2016 without making a first team appearance for the club, joining Coventry City on a long-term deal. The 22-year-old has been a consistent



performer for the Sky Blues despite their current predicament, and will be looking to play his part in the fight against relegation.





Yaser Kasim struck four minutes from time to deny Coventry City a point on the opening day of the season, Swindon Town clinching a narrow victory at the County Ground.

Date: Saturday 6th August 2016

Attendance: 9,023 (1,956)

The Sky Blues were the first to threaten, twice seizing on defensive mistakes in the early stages of the tie. James Brophy was pickpocketed on the left when trying to play out of defence, allowing the ball to break into the path of Marvin Sordell. The former Bolton hitman took aim from the edge of the area, but could only clatter the ball against the far post.

George Thomas scuffed off target from close range, before Sordell fed the ball expertly down the right into the path of Dion Kelly-Evans, the full-back's fierce drive tipped over well by Town 'keeper Lawrence Vigouroux.

Swindon could only muster half-chances in response, Anton Rodgers, Brophy and Jonathan Obika all failing to unduly test Reice Charles-Cook. At the other end, Thomas spurned another gilt-edged opportunity to put City





ahead, played in down the left but failing to beat Vigouroux with a tame shot.

Although Coventry started the second half brightly – Jones twice going close for the visitors – Swindon gradually started to come forward themselves. Ryan Haynes had to charge down a close-range effort from former Cov Kid Conor Thomas, who later sidefooted well over when found unmarked ten yards from goal.

Tony Mowbray threw on Ruben Lameiras and Kwamwe Thomas, but the hosts continued to fashion the better opportunities. Sub Michael Doughty should have opened the scoring fifteen minutes from time when through on goal, but the QPR loanee dithered in possession, allowing full-back Jordan Willis to recover and make the decisive challenge.

Luke Williams' side continued to press for the winner, and came desperately close five minutes from time when another substitute,




Jordan Young, shook off his marker and moved into shooting range. His well-struck effort from the edge of the box was always rising, but clipped the top of the crossbar on its way over.


Town were not to be denied, though, and with time running out,



Kasim grabbed all three points for the Wiltshire outfit. Rodgers burst down the left and squared into the City area, where the ball was helped on by Doughty into the path of Kasim. The Iraq international made no mistake from eighteen yards, and though Charles-Cook got a hand on the strike, it wasn't enough to keep the ball from finding the back of the net.







aking the move from Premier League outfit Southampton, the 22-year old has strong connections with today's League One opposition Swindon Town, with just shy of 100 appearances for the Robins across a two-year spell.


In the defenders first season in professional football, he wracked up 51 appearances, a near constant in Swindon's quest to reach the Championship in 2015. Falling short at the play-off hurdle, Turnbull was named Swindon Town's Player of the Season, and subsequently recalled for a second spell in Wiltshire.

Turnbull said: "From a very young age I joined Swindon, really enjoyed my time there and it's a great club. I got scouted for Southampton, ended up joining them and played for a fair few years before rejoining Swindon on loan, which was a little strange and quite funny.

"It was a fantastic season for me and the team did really well. We made it to the play-offs and in my first ever pro season I got to play at Wembley which was amazing.

"It was incredible – no matter the result you've got to enjoy the experience and embrace the chance to play at the national stadium. Coventry get the chance to play there this year and hopefully it is second time lucky for me."





In need of further first-team exposure, and encouraged by a successful previous campaign, the Saints youngster rejoined Swindon ahead of the 2015/16 season.

Tasked with extending his footballing repertoire, the leftfooted defender was pushed out on to the flank, playing the majority of the season at full-back.



He commented: "It was a big change, I started at centre-back and played a fair few at left-back after that.

"It was different for me but I felt I adapted to the role quite well. I got to go past the halfway line [nosebleed alert] on crazy runs but I enjoyed it and added a position to my armoury."

Looking ahead to today's crucial League One encounter, with five points between the two clubs as it stands, Jordan added: "It's going to be an exciting game, I keep in touch with some of the players and I was friendly with the staff.

"It is going to be good to play against them, but I'll be doing everything I can to get the three points for Coventry."

Growing up as part of the infamous Southampton FC academy, synonymous with a host of Premier League starlets, Turnbull learnt his trade alongside the likes of Callum Chambers, Luke Shaw and Alex Oxlade-Chamberlain.

Talking about the value of sharing

a training pitch with now-Premier League elite, Jordan said: "I was playing with Callum Chambers who is now at Arsenal, and Jordan Pickford who has come onto the scene this season and been fantastic for Sunderland.

"Players like Chuba Akpom and Callum Harriot, there were some good names, big names, who will all have good careers in the game. You learn as much off good players as you do off coaches and managers."

Another product of the south-coast youth system, Jack Stephens spent a half-season loan in Coventry last term, making 16 appearances.

A fellow centre-back, the 23-year old made his Premier League bow this season, and has been entrusted to fill in for the injured Virgil van Dijk by Saints boss Claude Puel.

Turnbull commented: "It was quite funny because a lot of people my age graduated from their scholarships and played for the first team. I'm still really close with Jack Stephens who Coventry fans are

familiar with. I keep close contact with a lot of people actually.

"Fantastic for Jack, I wish him really well. He has taken his chance with both hands and hopefully he can continue to improve and stay in and around the side for most of the season.

"I think I was at the club when it wasn't the best of times as well, so to see that transition was fantastic. It was a winning mentality that got the club back to the Premier League. I wasn't part of the first team, but to be amongst it was a great feeling."

After the best part of ten years on the books of Southampton, the 22year old made the journey north, to sign for the Sky Blues ahead of the 2016/17 campaign.

Despite his debut being marred by a red card - the second dismissal of his career - Turnbull has made a subsequent 33 appearances, scoring twice in the EFL Trophy victory over West Ham.


He said: "I think my debut may be one to forget. I felt I was doing really well, the team was doing well and it is one of those things that happens in football. You pick yourself up and move on.

"I don't think I've ever scored two goals in a game, in fact I rarely score! It was good to help the team out, and in this competition we've done really well and got a trip to Wembley at the end of it."

Turnbull has also represented the young Lions at U19 and U20 level, and finished by talking about fulfilling the dream of playing for his country.

He said: "I didn't really see it coming and then I got a phone call telling me I had been selected for the U19s, and it was a fantastic feeling and a great day for me and my family.

"We went abroad and played a couple of games and I started, so it was an unbelievable experience and one I'll never ever forget."





"I still believe I can still do it. Why not? Even if I don't score I can try to help the team but I believe I can score goals in this league.

"I'm fit, I'm ready to go and I believe I can score goals and help the team."

Since his return to England, the 'Yak' has been training with National League South side Boreham Wood to improve his fitness, and the former Nigeria international believes he is ready to be back on the competitive stage.

"For me even when I'm not playing I always like to keep fit. In football you never know what's going to happen.

"If you just sit at home and don't train then it's going to be so difficult to come back. But I've still kept my fitness by training every week, doing some important gym work.

"It's good to be training everyday with these guys now and getting more fitter everyday. Hopefully I can help the team."

Many people in the footballing world saw the signing of Yakubu as something of a coup for the Sky Blues, especially given their current position nine points adrift at the bottom of League One - albeit with a game in hand.

The former Middlesbrough, Everton and Blackburn striker, who scored 96 goals in 253 Premier League appearances, admitted he had been tempted by offers both in the UK and abroad, but Coventry ticked all the boxes for Yakubu who plans to end his career in England.

"My agent called me and said for me to go to Coventry and to give it a go. I said 'why not'.

"I've been in England for so many years. While I have been free I've had some offers outside of England but I decided to stay in England and look for the best option.

"I spoke to a couple of clubs but none of them were right for me. I think Coventry was good for me, to play every week and to help the team and get my fitness back, then we'll see how we go for next season as well.

"I came here last week and spoke to the manager. He was really pleased to see me and he wants me. It's good to go to a place where they want you and I didn't think twice.

"This is the best place for me to be at the moment to train and to play. I like it here so it's been good."

Yakubu is no stranger to the environment of a relegation battle. While at Portsmouth his goals helped Harry Redknapp's side maintain their Premier League status back in 2005, and seven years later at Blackburn he experienced the drop as Rovers were relegated to the Championship.

Despite having been with the Sky Blues for a short period, Yakubu is convinced he has seen enough to believe the club can retain its precious League One status.

"It's not going to be easy but you have to believe, he added. "You have to give everything in the game."

"Every home game you need to win if you want to stay up. There's lots of good young players here as well, they listen and it's good to be here.

"These guys need to keep working every day in training, keep giving the same again and I think we can stay up this season. The confidence is there with the players and hopefully we can get three points this week.

"Coventry was one of the bigger clubs in the country. It's a shame to see them in League One – they need to get back to where they belong."

Over the course of the 2016/17 season, we will be profiling all of the back room staff at the training ground in Ryton. Today is the turn of Football Operations & HR Coordinator, Tatum Foster.

Q. Give us a rundown of your dayto-day responsibilities...

A. I assist with the football department, organising the scouting requests and generally assisting Vicki Gough in her role as Chief Operating Officer. I also oversee the HR operations for the entire club, which is a huge task.

Q. Have you worked at other clubs before, and how did you get into the role?

A. I was at Birmingham City, but actually worked outside of football for a bit before beginning at Coventry. It seems I kind of go wherever Vicki goes because she was also at the Blues. We have a good working relationship and work well as a team.

I've done a little bit of HR when I was at the Blues, but nowhere near as much as I am doing now. Thrown

in at the deep-end, you could say.

Q. Did you go to University to be able to work in this role?

A. I went to University, but I actually studied Graphic Design and Advertising, which of course is totally different to what I am doing now. I graduated and actually started at Birmingham City FC in the club shop as a retail Christmas temp and worked my way up.

HR Administrator, Stadium Administrator and it was then I learned more the HR based work that has helped me with the role I currently have now at Coventry.

Q. When you first went to University, what was it you wanted to do as a career?

A. I wanted to do technical drawing and I think I chose the wrong course, in hinds sight. It focused more on the marketing side, but I wanted to do the drawing and the angles, so it didn't really end up that way.

After University I had my daughter, so that is where everything

stopped. I am part-time here because I look after her as well.

Q. Imagine that's a big change in your life?

A. It really does. I want this place to work and I can only be here a certain amount of hours a week, but I always want my family life to continue so it's about striking a balance.

I work 24 hours a week, but with an hour commute it does take time. I do enjoy it and I think everyone works really well together, and there is a real team ethic. We all muck in.

Q. How long have you worked in this role or industry?

A. Well I started at the Blues around ten years ago and spent four years there. I was actually made redundant twice, once at Birmingham and then at an Asbestos company because they went bust – so it's been an interesting journey.

Q. And finally, will you be looking at staying in football in the future?

A. I think once you're in football, it is very hard to get out of football. It is such a varied role, that if you go into an office job you're not going to get the same buzz as you do working for a football club.

There are definitely highs and lows, but it is fun. We all get along really well and it is like a little family. I would like to continue doing this for as long as I can, but I'm not ruling out going down different avenues in the future.


Cian Harries wrapped up the points in the second-half, as he swept a Bilal Sayoud cross into the bottom corner to give City an unassailable two-goal lead.

UNDER-18S REVIEW - JASON FARNDON



City's U18s side continue to go from strength to strength, stretching their winning run to eight games, keeping six straight clean sheets in the process.

Jason Farndon's young charges travelled to south London to face a Millwall side lying in sixth place in the PDL, but goals from Kyle Finn and Jordan Ponticelli's 20th of the season were enough to see off the Lions' threat.

Farndon said: "Like Millwall at all levels, they were very big and very strong physically, so it posed a different threat to us. It seemed like they were the first side to study our strengths and aimed to stop us playing.

"Andy Crabtree played an important part at half-time, calming the lads down and explaining that not every game would be dominant and they responded. We scored two goals and ground out an important win.

"It's good that we have demonstrated a different side of our game, because throughout a season that is needed. We were forced in to changes, Tom Bayliss and Dan Smith both went off with illness, but overall it was a professional performance."

With goalscorers traditionally hogging the headlines, and clean sheets hard to come by in academy football, Fardon was quick to shine a light on the efforts of his teenage backline, after some resolute defending has yielded a run of six games without conceding a goal.

U18s stopper Konrad Skuza has also delivered a string of mature performances to ensure City's remarkable defensive record stays in tact.

Farndon added: "Lewis Green, a first year scholar, came into the defence against Millwall and he is only just recovering from injury himself. We've had Jordan Thompson who is a second year scholar doing really well and others filling in.



"Ross McMahon and Chris Camwell have also been involved so it's particularly impressive that we've managed to build on this run, in spite of the changes being made.

"Konrad Skuza has been the number one all season and playing like he deserves to maintain that position, he has been fantastic this year. In my head I have an idea of the strongest starting XI, but performances recently have made me question that, which is a only good thing."

ELDIN JAKUPOVIC Leyton Orient (2014)

Eldin Jakupovic began his career in his native Switzerland with Super League outfit FC Than, but failed to make a first-team appearance.

The 'keepers first move to England came with Hull City in 2012, but it was a loan spell at Leyton Orient in 2014 that meant he played alongside Clarke in League One.

STEVE **JENKINS**Huddersfield (2001-2003)

A former Welsh international, Jenkins spent eight years with Huddersfield Town, where many would deem him as a club legend. He would make over 250 appearances for the Yorkshire outfit, before having spells at Notts County and Swindon Town, among others, in the latter stages of his career.

CHRIS LUCKETTI Huddersfield (2001-2003)

Despite beginning his career at Rochdale, it was his six-year spell at Bury and five-year stay at Preston North End that shaped Lucketti's playing days.

Now 45, Lucketti made over 400 appearances for both clubs, including a play-off final at the Millennium Stadium in Cardiff, in which Preston were defeated against West Ham United. He has twice acted as caretaker manager of Fleetwood Town.

TOM CLARKE Huddersfield (2005-2012)

The first name on the list, and not simply because they happen to be related, the Clarke brothers shared seven years at Huddersfield Town together.

After loan spells at local sides Halifax and Bradford City, Tom has firmly established himself as a key figure in the Preston North End side after moving to the Championship club in 2013.





MOSES ODUBAJO Leyton Orient (2012-2014)

A product of the Leyton Orient youth academy, Odubajo impressed enough to earn a rumoured £1million move to Championship side Brentford in 2014.

He would only spend one season at the Bees, making 45 appearances, before Hull City acquired his services after relegation from the Premier League ahead of the 2015/16 season.

KENNY IRONS Huddersfield (2001-2003)

A Football League veteran, Irons made over 500 appearances during a 17 year career with Tranmere Rovers and Huddersfield Town.

Signed up as a trainee at Tranmere, he represented the club for over ten years before moving to Steve Bruce's Huddersfield Town side for £500,000 in 1999.

ROMAIN VINCELOT Leyton Orient (2013-2015)

Despite only spending one season at the Ricoh Arena, Vincelot



endeared himself to the Sky Blue Army with his commitment and no-nonsense attitude towards the game.

After moving to England initially with Dagenham & Redbridge in 2010, the Frenchman made the switch to Leyton Orient, where he played alongside Clarke, whilst the pair also teamed up briefly at Bradford City for the first half of the 2016/17 campaign.

ANTHONY PILKINGTON Huddersfield (2009-2011)

A full Republic of Ireland international with nine caps, Pilkington impressed at non-league Stockport County before a move to Huddersfield in 2009.

He spent two years at the club, making just shy of 100 appearances, but later joined then-Premier League side Norwich City in a deal worth up to £3million.

ANDY BOOTH Huddersfield (2001-2009)

Now retired after a 17 year career in the game, Booth had two spells at Huddersfield, either side of a permanent move to Yorkshire rivals Sheffield Wednesday.



The striker made just fewer than 400 appearances for the Terriers, scoring over 130 goals and remains at the club as an ambassador.

MARCUS STEWART Huddersfield (2000)

A glittering career in which Stewart represented a total of eight different clubs, including spells at then-Premier league sides Ipswich Town and Sunderland.

It was at the Tractor Boys Stewart had his most productive season, finishing as the Premier League's second-highest scorer behind Jimmy Floyd Hasselbaink.

He is now the assistant manager at League One side Bristol Rovers.

JORDAN RHODES Huddersfield (2009-2012)

A prolific goalscorer in the Football League, Rhodes scored an incredible 170 goals during his time with Blackburn Rovers and Huddersfield Town in just over 270 appearances.





Now 28-years of age, the ex-England youth international is enjoying a superb season at Gigg lane, second in the division's scoring charts behind Sheffield's Billy Sharp.

On the books of Premier League side Everton as a youngster, the frontman made 38 appearances in the top tier, as well as a host of cup appearances for

Loan spells at Derby County, Leicester City and Crystal Palace followed, before a permanent switch to Norwich in 2011. A brief stint at Birmingham City was less successful, as Vaughan failed to register a goal for the Midlands outfit.

That baron spell initiated a move away from St Andrews and League One outfit Bury won the battle for the striker's signature in August 2016. Having made 29 appearances to date, Vaughan has netted an impressive 18 goals for the Greater Manchester side, greatly aiding their bid for League One survival.

The 28-year old scored four in the club's 5-1 mauling of Peterborough in mid January, and last netted in a 1-0 win over fellow strugglers Swindon in Feb gifting his side a much needed three points.







Two more wins push City closer to promotion



A week after dropping leading scorer Bobby Gould, Jimmy Hill restored him to the starting line-up to face Preston at Highfield Road on 11th February. At the start of play North End lay fourth in the table, four points behind the Sky Blues, having lost just one league game in eight. Ian Gibson returned with Brian Lewis wearing the number 7 shirt in place of the injured John Key.

Gould had taken a lot of criticism from fans after the Newcastle game but manager Hill had faith in Gould who, to be fair, had netted 15 goals already, despite a four-game drought since Christmas.


Once again City's unbeaten run looked vulnerable as Preston's strong arm tactics in the first half unsettled the Sky Blues. When a Ross free-kick wasn't cleared Nobby Lawton cracked home a low drive to give the visitors a half-time lead. Preston then made the mistake of defending in depth and rarely came out of their own half. The Sky Blues were well below their best but continued to press for an equaliser. Gibson was being shadowed by two or sometimes three Preston players and had a good shout for a penalty then Ron Farmer had a vicious shot

blocked before Mick Kearns hit the rebound over the bar. Rees had a header beat the keeper but a defender cleared off the line before City got the breakthrough in the 80th minute.

From the right by-line Gibson's chip found Machin's head and the scores were level. Two minutes later Dietmar Bruck was clean through but sliced his shot wide from 12 yards. The noise from the 29,000 home crowd was now deafening and four minutes from time Highfield Road erupted as Gould netted the winner. Howard Kendall, a tower of strength for Preston, was caught napping when he pushed the ball too far ahead of


himself, Machin whipped the ball off him, fed Farmer who teed up Bobby to finish from 15 yards.

City's refusal to be beaten had been illustrated yet again and it was an inspirational selection from Hill to recall Gould. Wolves won 3-1 at Charlton and City's lead was still two points.

A week later City travelled to the

Valley to face Charlton with an unchanged team and supported by 4,000 Sky Blue fans. With Charlton close to the relegation zone it was always going to be tough but noone expected a game of 41 fouls and three bookings (in an era when bookings were as uncommon as red cards today). City had the better of the first half but failed to find a goal but five minutes into the second half they took the lead. A superb Gibson dribble was helped on by Clements and with the home defence in tatters Gould scored from three yards. Brian Lewis, playing in a defensive role despite wearing the number seven shirt, was the first name in the book for a knee in the back of Matt Tees which prompted loud booing from the home fans. Minutes later Curtis won an aerial challenge against Tees which saw the Charlton man's impetus take him off the field and he seemed to collide with the touch-line wall. It didn't seem that the referee was going to take action until Charlton manager Bob Stokoe angrily protested and suddenly Curtis' name was in the book.

Three minutes from time Gould wrapped up the points with a



second goal. Curtis, booed constantly after the Tees incident, broke up an attack in his own half and fed Machin who spotted Bobby racing through the middle. Ernie's great high pass split the home defence and the centreforward ran on to plant it past Wright in the Chariton goal.

Myers scored a consolation goal with virtually the last kick of the match as City recorded their first ever win at the Valley (at the eighth attempt) and extended the unbeaten run to 13 games. The London press were hyper-critical of City, many reporters describing them as a 'rough' team.

With Wolves involved in FA Cup action the Sky Blues extended their lead at the top to four points but Wolves now had a game in hand. Third-placed Carlisle were six points back.





THIS WEEK IN 21-25 STORY



Saturday 21st February 1987 FA CUP SUCCESS

The Sky Blues travelled to the Victoria Ground, home of Stoke City, in an FA Cup fifth round tie.

With over 30,000 fans in attendance, including 8,000 travelling from the West Midlands, City advanced to the quarterfinal as cup fever gripped the City.

Michael Gynn scored the only goal of the game with 19 minutes remaining, when his low shot found the corner to give City victory.

Wednesday 24th February 1965

BIRTH OF LLOYD MCGRATH

Lloyd McGrath, who represented the club between 1984 and 1994, was born in Birmingham.

He progressed through the youth system at the Sky Blues and was known as a 'ball winner'. In 1987, his foray down the right wing and subsequent cross-deflected in by Gary Mabbutt, earned him a place in City folklore.



Sunday 16th February 1986 LITTLEWOODS CUP DISAPPOINTMENT

The television cameras were again present for the second leg of the Littlewoods Cup semi-final against Nottingham Forest.

Looking to recover from a 2-1 defeat in the first leg, the Sky Blues could only battle to a goalless draw, watched on by 25,500 people.

Forest would go on to beat Oldham Athletic 1-0 at Wembley in the final with a goal from future City loanee Nigel Jemson.



Thursday 22nd February 1979 VICTORY AT THE BRIDGE

Three goals in five minutes saw the Sky Blues to an impressive 3-1 victory against Chelsea at Stamford Bridge.

lan Wallace and Mick Ferguson (2) took the side up to eighth in Division One and provoked a stern response from Chelsea manager Danny Blanchflower.

Speaking to the Daily Mirror he said: "We lost it in those five minutes, it's disappointing because for half an hour we had looked good."
