




Back on to matters on the pitch and let's all get behind the lads this afternoon as we look to get this Easter period off to a winning start before we make the trip to Walsall on Monday.



On that note, your backing will once again be vital and if you can be as loud as you were last weekend then I know that could well prove to be the difference.





AFC WIMBLEDON

The Dons have enjoyed their first-ever season in the Sky Bet League One and they will now be looking to finish the 2016/17 campaign on a high.

Neal Ardley's men secured promotion from League Two via the Play-Offs last term as they continued their fairy tale rise.

Despite a slow start to this season, AFC Wimbledon's form picked up in October and they soon adjusted to life in the third tier of English football.

Arguably one of their biggest highlights this season was their 2-8 win at home to bitter rivals MK Dons last month, a victory which carried plenty of significance for everybody connected with AFC Wimbledon.

The Dons are able to owe plenty of their success this term down to their front-two of Lyle Taylor and Tom Elliott, who have combined to contribute 27 goals to their side's cause. The pair have struck up a fruitful partnership and are one of the most productive combinations in the division.

There is plenty to play for too with AFC Wimbledon still in with a shout of securing a top ten finish, which would represent a fantastic achievement given that this is the club's first time playing at this level.

Town and The Dons have met once already this season with the two teams playing out a hard-fought 0-0 draw at Kingsmeadow back in October 2015.



DANGERMAN

LYLE TAYLOR

R&W TAKES A CLOSER LOOK AT ONE OF AFC WIMBLEDON'S DANGERMEN THIS AFTERNOON...

The goal-getter arrived at Kingsmeadow in July 2015 after parting company with Scunthorpe United. Beginning his career with Staines Town and Millwall, Taylor really burst onto the scene with Concord Rangers, notching 34 goals during the 2009/10 campaign.

A move to AFC Bournemouth followed but Taylor couldn't

settle and had loan spells with Lewes, Hereford United and Woking before being released by the Cherries in 2012. Stints with Falkirk, Sheffield United and Partick Thistle followed, before he was snapped up by Scunthorpe.

Taylor has been a pivotal figure in AFC Wimbledon's recent success and he bagged 21 league goals last term, including the opener in the League Two Play-Off Final at Wembley, while he has helped himself to 14 goals and five assists so far this term.

MEET THE REST

JOE MCDONNELL

The young stopper joined AFC Wimbledon's Development Squad in July 2014 after impressing for Basingstoke Town. McDonnell is a regular on the bench for The Dons and he made three consecutive starts for the first-team in March 2015.

PAUL KALAMBAYI

Was snapped up by The Dons Academy after being released by Brentford, turning down offers from Millwall and Crystal Palace in order to sign a deal at Kingsmeadow. The talented defender impressed in the FA Youth Cup and was handed his first professional contract in February 2016.

SEAN KELLY

The Glasgow native made over 100 appearances for St Mirren after making his debut for the Scottish outfit in August 2013, before going on to have spells with Montrose

and East Stirlingshire. Joined AFC Wimbledon in August 2016 while he has been capped by Scotland at U21 level.

BARRY FULLER

The vastly experienced right-back joined The Dons from Barnet in May 2013 following The Bees relegation to the Conference. Fuller has enjoyed a successful career in the lower leagues having won the FA Trophy with Stevenage Borough, before securing promotion to League One with Gillingham in 2009. He also captained AFC Wimbledon to promotion via the League Two Play-Offs last season.

DAVID FITZPATRICK

The attacking midfielder, who can also play out on either flank, signed for AFC Wimbledon's Development Squad in September 2014 following a successful trial. Was once on the books of Fulham and QPR in-between spells in non-league with Staines Town and Hampton & Richmond Borough. He made his Dons' first-leam debut in December 2014.

DAN GALLAGHER

With AFC Wimbledon from the age of 10, Gallagher made his first-team debut for the club towards the end of the 2014/15 campaign, coming on as a late substitute against Plymouth Argyle just months after signing his first professional contract.

TOYOSI OLUSANYA

Was snapped up by AFC Wimbledon in 2015 after being spotted while plying his trade for Tooting-based 10 Coaching. The attacker impressed during the club's FA Youth Cup run last season and was handed a professional contract in February 2016, before scoring on his first-team debut against Newport County in May.

GEORGE OAKLEY

The towering centre-forward joined The Dons at the age of 12 and was rewarded with his first professional contract in May 2014. He scored over twenty goals at both U18 and U21 level and made his first-team debut in November 2014 away at Northampton Town. He has made a handful of outings so far this term.

JAMES SHEA



The stopper began his career with Arsenal and played a part in the Gunners winning both the FA Youth Cup and the Premier Academy League

in 2009. Shea once made the bench for a Champions League tie in 2012 but was released a year later. Was voted Harrow Borough's Player of the Year before signing for The Dons in July 2014.

JON MEADES



The left-back, who can also operate on the right side of defence and in midfield, joined AFC Wimbledon in June 2015 after leaving

Oxford United, for whom he made just eight appearances for. Currently in his second spell with The Dons having been crowned their Young Player of the Year in 2012. Has also represented Cardiff City and AFC Bournemouth.

WILL NIGHTINGALE



Has been with The Dons since the age of nine and is a powerful centre-back who has been tipped for big things. Nightingale turned down the

offer of an extended trial with Premier League outfit Crystal Palace and was handed his first professional contract by AFC Wimbledon in April 2014. Made his first-team debut in January 2015 against Carlisle United.

PAUL ROBINSON



A central defender with a wealth of experience in the EFL under his belt, Robinson is a key figure for AFC Wimbledon having clocked up 45 games so far this

season. Began his career with Millwall and made over 300 appearances for The Lions, scoring the only goal of the 2009/10 League One Play-Off Final to secure his side's place in the Championship. Helped The Dons secure promotion from League Two last term via the Play-Off Final at Wembley.

DARIUS CHARLES



The burly centrehalf has also been used as a striker throughout his career and contributed a number of crucial goals to help Stevenage win

Stevenage win promotion to League One in 2010 via the Play-Offs. Charles then joined Burton Albion but never featured for the Brewers before signing for AFC Wimbledon on loan, playing a vital role in their promotion from League Two which led to a permanent move in the summer.

GEORGE FRANCOMB



Francomb is predominately a midfielder but he can also play in defence, making him a useful asset for his club. Began his career with Norwich City but

found his opportunities limited at Carrow Road and he went on to have successful loan spells for The Dons, Barnet and Hibernian, before signing permanently at Kingsmeadow. Scooped the Young Player of the Year gong during his first full season with the club and he has now made over 100 appearances.

DANNIE BULMAN



The experienced central midfielder signed for The Dons in June 2014 and has established himself as a key figure in the engine room. Made over

200 appearances for Wycombe Wanderers and was part of the side that reached the FA Cup Semi-Finals. Bulman has promotions on his CV with both Oxford and Crawley and he added another one with AFC Wimbledon last season.

JAKE REEVES



Once on the books at The County Ground, Reeves joined AFC Wimbledon on a permanent deal from Town in January 2015 and has been a

virtual ever-present since. Reeves began his career with Tottenham Hotspur before joining Brentford, making his debut for The Bees at the age of 17. Was rewarded with a new contract in August 2016 thanks to his consistent displays in the middle of the park.

DEAN PARRETT



Arrived from Stevenage prior to the start of the 2016/17 campaign and will be looking to reignite a career that was once tipped for big things. Joined Tottenham Hotspur

from QPR in 2007 and the midfielder went on to make his debut against Shakhtar Donetsk in the UEFA Cup. However, Parrett couldn't make the breakthrough at White Hart Lane and he was released in 2013, paving the way for a move to Stevenage. He has been capped by England at every level from U16 to U20.

TOM SOARES



The reliable midfielder began his career with Crystal Palace and soon earned a move to Stoke City after impressing at Selhurst Park. Soares represented

his new club in the Premier League but he was soon on the move and went on to ply his trade for the likes of Charlton and Shelfield Wednesday. He signed for Bury in 2012 and became a firm fans' favourite, scoring the goal that secured promotion on the final day of the 2014/15 campaign. Signed for The Dons in January 2017.

DOMINIC POLEON



The speedy striker signed for AFC Wimbledon in July after parting company with Oldham Athletic. Poleon began his career

with Chelsea before going on to have spells with Southend United and Leeds United. The attacker has enjoyed a decent season with The Dons having contributed thirteen goals and three assists to the cause.

TOM ELLIOTT




The tall, pacy striker joined The Dons in July 2015 after being released by Cambridge United. A graduate of the Leeds United Academy, Elliott made just four

appearances in five seasons at Elland Road, during which time he was loaned out to Macclesfield Town, Bury and Rotherham United. Helped Cambridge to promotion in 2014 while he has banged in thirteen goals so far this term having struck up an impressive partnership with Lyle Taylor.



MANAGER

NEAL ARDLEY

The former midfielder has enjoyed great success with AFC Wimbledon since taking over the top job in October 2012.

Ardley actually began his playing career with The Dons in 1991 and rose through the Academy ranks before breaking onto the first-team scene during the 1991/1992 campaign.

He featured more prominently the following season, scoring four goals in 26 outings as Wimbledon finished 12th in the FA Premier League. Ardley went on to make a total of 245 appearances for The Dons, becoming their longest serving player before he departed in 2002. His best campaign for the club was arguably the 1996-97 season where he helped his side

reach the Semi-Finals of both the FA Cup and the Football League Cup, in addition to finishing eighth in the league.

Ardley then joined Watford in 2002, helping the Hornets to reach the FA Cup Semi-Final in 2003 and the League Cup Semi-Final in 2005. After leaving Vicarage Road that same year, he joined Cardiff City before hanging up his boots in 2007 whilst on the books of Millwall.

Ardley, who was also capped ten times by England at U21 level, was appointed as the new manager of the Cardiff City Academy on 30th August 2007, the same day that he announced his retirement from professional football. He remained with the Bluebirds for five years and helped the likes of Theo Wharton and Joe Ralls make the breakthrough into the first-leam.

AFC Wimbledon then came calling in October 2012 and opted to hand Ardley his first-ever first-leam managerial role. It has proved to be a match made in heaven with Ardley guiding The Dons to safety in his first season with the club, before leading them to glory in the League Two Play-Off Final at Wembley last term.

30 YEARS ON

BRISTOL ROVERS 3 SWINDON TOWN 4

11 APRIL 1987

Forced to leave Eastville in 1986, Rovers were playing their home games at Twerton Park in Bath. But, with limited capacity there, Rovers needing points to get out of the bottom four and Town needing them to stay in the top two, the fixture was switched to Ashton Gate.

The eventual outcome of the contest looked highly unlikely 27 minutes in, with Swindon struggling to contain a potent Rovers attack that had given them a two-goal lead through Gary Penrice and Robbie Turner.

But former 'Pirate' Steve White was quick to respond, heading in at the near post from Dave Bamber's cross for his 19th of the season.

Town were level four minutes after the break, after Bamber and Mark Jones were both denied by keeper Paul Bradshaw. It was Peter Coyne who unlocked the home defence by chipping the ball to the far post for Jimmy Quinn to send a downward header over the line.

However, Rovers went ahead again just shy of the hour when Dave Hockaday was adjudged to have fouled Phil Purnell as he scurried into the area. The number seven got up to hit the spot kick past Fraser Digby.

But Town soon shrugged off that set-back, netting twice in as many minutes to go in-front for the first time.

Hockaday sent a cross in from the right, Quinn headed on and Bamber applied the coolest of finishes.

The army of visiting fans had not stopped celebrating when Quinn drove in what proved to be the winner. This time it came from the left, Leigh Barnard sending in a corner that was only half cleared. Facing away from goal, the Irishman swivelled to send the ball through a sea of legs and past Bradshaw.

Signed on a 'free' by Ken Beamish, as an orthodox right winger, Dave scored twice in his first four games for Town. Lou Macari took over a year later, but Dave was unable to impress the new boss immediately after suffering an ankle injury in only the second






game of the season which kept him out for nearly three months.

In the spring of 1986, Dave was switched to full-back - a move which kick-started his career and saw him go on to celebrate back-to-back promotions under the Scot.

His two goals in 1986/87 - against Bournemouth and Darlington - came within the space of four days in April and were worth four priceless points to his side.

Dave missed just three League games in the followingtwo seasons but lost his place after suffering a fractured cheekbone in November 1989. David Kerslake was brought in by Ossie Ardiles and Dave would make just two more starts before departing after seven years at The County Ground.
















CONOR THOMAS

IT HAS BEEN A MEMORABLE FEW WEEKS FOR THE MIDFIELDER WHO CAME BACK INTO THE FOLD IN EMPHATIC FASHION AFTER SCORING A DRAMATIC LATE WINNER AGAINST MILLWALL. NOW A VITAL COG IN THE MIDFIELD, HE'S ONLY WORRIED ABOUT HELPING TOWN TO COMPLETE THE GREAT ESCAPE...

Conor, it has been a frustrating season for you in terms of your limited playing time but you came back into the side against Millwall at the last minute following an injury to Ben Gladwin, so how happy have you been to have been back in the thick of it?

"It is good to be back playing and any footballer finds it hard when they are not playing. It is tough mentally but you've just got to keep going and try and do everything right, so I was pleased to be back in against Millwall and it has only been three games but that's three undefeated now. We've now got to win as many games as possible."

Your last minute winner against Millwall has been talked about a lot, and rightly so, but just how much did it mean to you given the season you've had?

"I don't pop up with too many so it is a bit of a collector's item! I was obviously delighted for the team and hopefully it turns out to be an

important goal in keeping us up because that is the main thing at the end of the day. We just need to all pull together and hopefully that goal will mean something, if we go down then it is obviously irrelevant. We're just looking to win every game now and it is as simple as that."

Bearing in mind the fact that your goal against Millwall was your first in five years, it wasn't a bad strike at all! You must have been happy with that?

"I didn't even think about it to be honest. It fell to me quite nicely and I managed to slot it home, so hopefully it proves to be a big three points. We will be happy with whoever pops up with the goals, so if I got another one within the next five years then I will be happy! As I said, we just need to win as many games as possible."

That goal and your performance overall against Millwall has proven to be a bit of a turning

point for you personally and you are now a key figure in that midfield, so what is the aim for you now?

"There's not long left now and I'm not focussing on myself. Everyone needs to be a bit selfless and do what they can for the team given where we are and how the season has panned out. We need to do whatever needs to be done to keep us in the league, so it is important that everyone pulls together which they are and hopefully we will get the wins we need."

You have come in for plenty of praise from both Luke Williams and your team-mates in recent weeks for the way that you handle yourself day in and day out, so those kind of comments must be nice to hear?

"It is just something that I do and I look after myself as best as I can and I try to give myself the best chance. It wouldn't be fair on my team-mates and everyone else if I weren't trying my best and football is a crazy game, so when I was called upon late on against Millwall then I was ready. It is really nice to know that your team-mates and your boss thinks that of you and it doesn't go unnoticed. It is really nice praise from everyone."

On to last weekend and although a draw against MK Dons wasn't the best result, it keeps the unbeaten run and the momentum going, doesn't it?


"We've got to look at it as a positive and we're unbeaten in our last three after playing against three very good teams. Millwall were 16 unbeaten in the league


and we managed to get the win, Fleetwood were flying and it was a tough place to go and MK were safe and that can work either way. 
There are just four games left now this season, starting with today's clash against AFC Wimbledon.

Everyone believes we can do it and we'll be doing everything we can to make sure we get over the line. It is a quick turnaround so we've got to make sure that we look after ourselves and make sure that we prepare right, which I'm sure all the lads will do. If we get a positive result today then we'll be itching to play on Monday so we've got to take it one game at a time, but we know that we could give ourselves the best chance of getting over the line by the end of the Easter period."

Finally, the support at The County Ground was superb last weekend, so what would your message be to the Town faithful ahead of the final four games of the season?

"The support last weekend was fantastic and it was great to see The County Ground full. Hopefully they can continue to get behind us and we're all fighting and we will all do everything we can to make sure that we can get the results we all need."

ON THIS DAY:

14 APRIL

1897

At a meeting at the Mechanics Institute, Swindon Town first formed a limited company, with capital of £1,500 - three thousand shares being made available at ten shillings (50p) each.

1922

On Good Friday 95 years ago, Swindon returned from The Kursaal in Southend with both points from a 2-1 win. Bob Cooke netted the first and then grabbed two on the Monday in a 6-1 victory in the return fixture - which would complete a third successive League double over the Shrimpers.

1962

Goalkeeper Mike Turner, signed five months earlier from Dorchester, made his League debut in a 1-1 draw at Port Vale. He missed just six games the following season as Town gained promotion from the Third Division for the first time.

1970

Following a draw with promotion rivals Blackpool in front of a packed house a week earlier, Swindon went into a home game with Middlesbrough knowing that their chance of reaching the top flight for the first time had gone - the Seasiders having won at Preston 24 hours earlier. Boro cruised to a 3-0 win.

1978


Manager Danny Williams was given a 'vote of confidence' by the board after a home defeat by Walsall in front of less than four thousand at The County Ground had seen Town drift to eight points off the top three. Little more than four weeks later, Bobby Smith was installed as the new boss.

2007

Ten years ago today, a 1-0 win at strugglers Bury saw Swindon firmly on course for a top three finish. Substitute Lukas Jutkiewicz grabbed the all-important goal five minutes from time - maintaining a six point gap over MK Dons with just three games left.

It has been a memorable few weeks for the young centre-back who has excelled at the heart of the defence, and he has now set his sights on helping Town to make it a successful Easter weekend.

Town now face a huge Easter period starting with today's clash against AFC Wimbledon, before they make the short trip to Walsall on Easter Monday.

And Conroy has made it clear that he and his team-mates want nothing less than six points from their next two outings.

"They are massive and hopefully we can start it well with three points today," he continued.

"We want to then get the win on Monday and then keep pushing forward because hopefully that might even be enough to keep us up, but we're going to keep on fighting until the end.

"Hopefully we can win every game from now until the end of the season but everyone is focussed on today and we need the three points."

Finally, Conroy was forced off with an injury last weekend but he has insisted that he's fighting fit and raring to go for this afternoon's fixture against AFC Wimbledon.

"The injury feels fine so hopefully I'll be ready to play on Friday and be ready to help the team get three points," he concluded.







Town's Academy Manager provides an update direct from Holland with the club's younger age groups currently out on tour in the Netherlands...



It is a challenge for the players and the staff and we are currently out in the Netherlands with our U9's, U10's, U11's and U12's. We have also taken two U8's this year and that is a challenge in itself but it is one we knew the boys could cope with. One of the boys has literally just turned eight so that is credit to him to be able to cope with the physical demands of playing games every single day and also being away from his family at such a young age. So Josh Yenzu and Ollie Rowe are currently training and playing with our U9's this week and that is fantastic.

Our U10's and U11's played Willem II on Monday and we won both games. They played two 6v6 and two 8v8 matches and won all four. We played De Graafschap on Tuesday night where the U9's, U10's, U11's and U12's all played and we did something a little bit different with our 2007 group playing against their U11's, so it was a mixture of our U9's and U10's and they won 3-2 after being 2-0 down. We are just putting the boys into that environment where they are going to be challenged and exposed to lots of different scenarios and challenges, so that we can see if they can cope with it.

The boys will return today and then it is a quick turnaround with the U13's, U14's and U15's coming out to Holland on Sunday. They've got a tough schedule including games against Ajax and Gravesande, so that will be a good challenge for them. The older groups will then return next Friday and we've got a big tournament the following day, which will see twenty clubs compete.

A week Sunday will then see our U13's play Manchester United so the Easter period is a really busy time for the Academy. We've got lots of different games and challenges and there are lots of other elements to take into consideration too. It is just making sure that the boys are developing nicely for their long-term futures at Swindon Town Football Club.



Swindon Town U18's Manager Alan McLoughlin was full of praise for his young charges following their 3-2 win away at Gillingham in the Merit League last weekend...

It was a fantastic performance and it should have comfortably been 7-3 in terms of how we played on the day. We kept the same system and I asked for the players to carry out instructions, which myself and Andy Rowland had talked through. They did just that and it was a great performance, especially in the first-half.

We were 3-0 up by half-time and it was an exceptional display. We played a 3-5-2 and we really, really played well. There were some fantastic goals and a set-piece which we work on diligently worked perfectly and it was the fifth time we have scored from that this season. The second goal arrived after some good work by Will Christopher and Seb Martinez and a lovely cross towards the far post was put away by Scott Twine, who was in the right place at the right time to produce a clinical finish. And Louis Spalding put away a beautiful finish into the bottom corner for our third goal.






GUEST COLUMN

BBC Wiltshire's Sam Parkin shares his favourite memories from the Easter period as Town gear up for two crucial fixtures...

The Easter weekend is a pivotal time in the football season. Six points are up for grabs and a lot of teams will have had their destiny decided come Tuesday morning.

Swindon Town's current situation means that there's very little margin for error and today's game is another huge one as they try and scramble to safely. The players have shown great resilience in the last few games and I'm sure they're prepared to take it to the final couple of fixtures now to achieve their goal.

I'll take you back to April 1993 for my favourite memory from this time of year. On the Saturday, I watched Les Ferdinand hit a hat-trick for QPR as they beat Nottingham Forest 4-3 in West London. On the Monday I remember kicking a ball about in the front room listening to Jonathan Pearce (or maybe Tony Incenzol on Capital Gold as they reported on a Rangers 4-3 win up at Goodison Park where incredibly Sir Les notched another treble. If he wasn't already, my hero was confirmed over those 3 days. Many years later when I was a Swindon



Town player I had the honour of playing alongside the great man in a charity match. Despite having carved out a career for myself, I was a nervous wreck and even took my Mum along for this momentous occasion in my life! My performance alongside him was a shambles but it's a lovely memory and my brother still owns a framed picture and signature from that day.

One of the current crop at Swindon Town still has the opportunity to come out of this challenging season as a hero. Danny Invincible is still revered in these parts after his volley against Peterborough kept Town up in 2001. I'm sure Alan Reeves for one still feels that way lowards everyone's favourite named Aussie. It was his mix up with Steve Mildenhall that led to Peterborough equalising on that famous April afternoon. Reevesy will of course be back at The County Ground today with AFC Wimbledon, Afternoon male!

Although rather a lot has happened at the club since, the opposition today played a small part in my development. Around the time that I was worshipping Mr. Ferdinand. I was actually on Wimbledon's books. I'd train on a Monday night in their School of Excellence in Roehampton and played matches in the school holidays at their Training Ground just off the A3, Yes, the very facility where footage of burning clothes and John Fashanu falling off walls became common place. My time as a Don was brief although I do remember leading the line with a young Wayne Gray who went on to play for both Wimbledon and Swindon's first teams.



My dad used to occasionally take me to Plough Lane as a kid and of course it was a club I knew all about growing up in South West London. Their rise back into the Football League has been a tremendous story and I can only imagine the hard work that's gone on in the background. When the new club was formed, an old Chelsea teammate of mine, Joe Sheerin attended the trials, became captain and was then very important in their early rise back through the levels. At that stage I'm sure it was a dream for many but one that has quickly become a reality.

They've adjusted very well to life in the division and it's another difficult game for Town with them almost certainly guaranteed League One football next season.

It was brilliant to hear of the success of the Pack The County Ground initiative last weekend and I've been told about the collective roar that went around when the 4th official's board went up.

Keep it going this afternoon and here's hoping for a very Happy Easter.


We all know what is needed from these final four fixtures so let's all get behind the boys and really help to push them over the finishing line.
