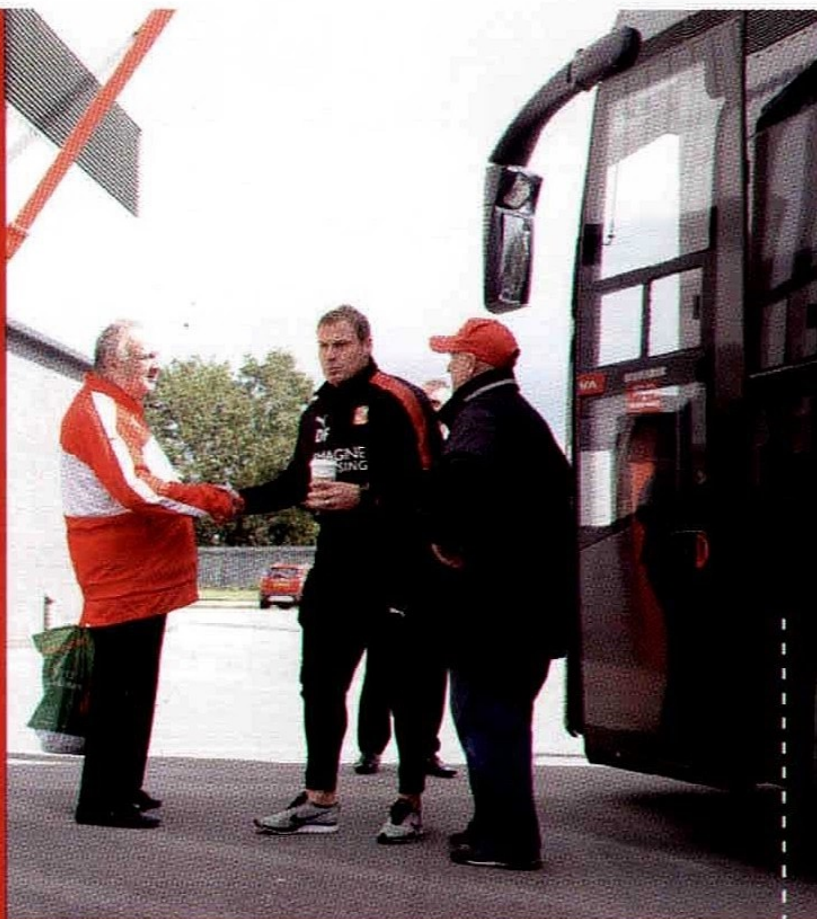
It is a 46-game season and we will go through some low points but it is how we respond to them that matters. The response from the boys in training has been outstanding.

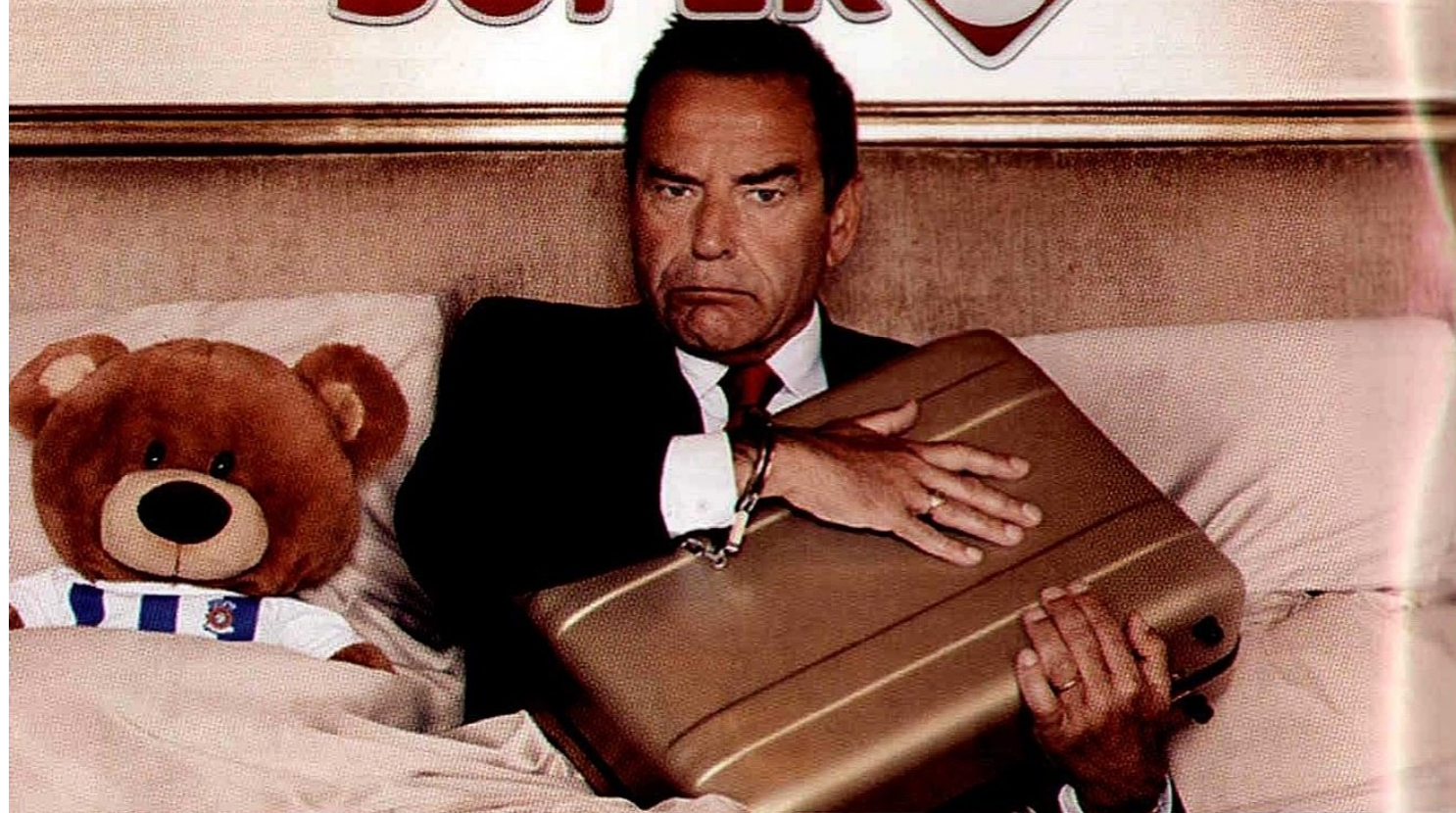

Moving forward on to today's game against Barnet and our visitors had a good start to the 2017/18 campaign, drawing with Forest Green Rovers before

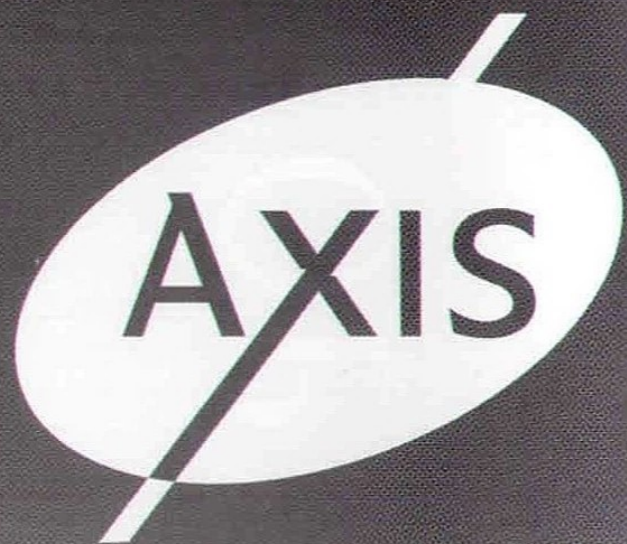
recording an excellent victory against one of the league's top sides in Luton. Since that win though their form has been indifferent, but I am sure they will provide a stern test this afternoon.

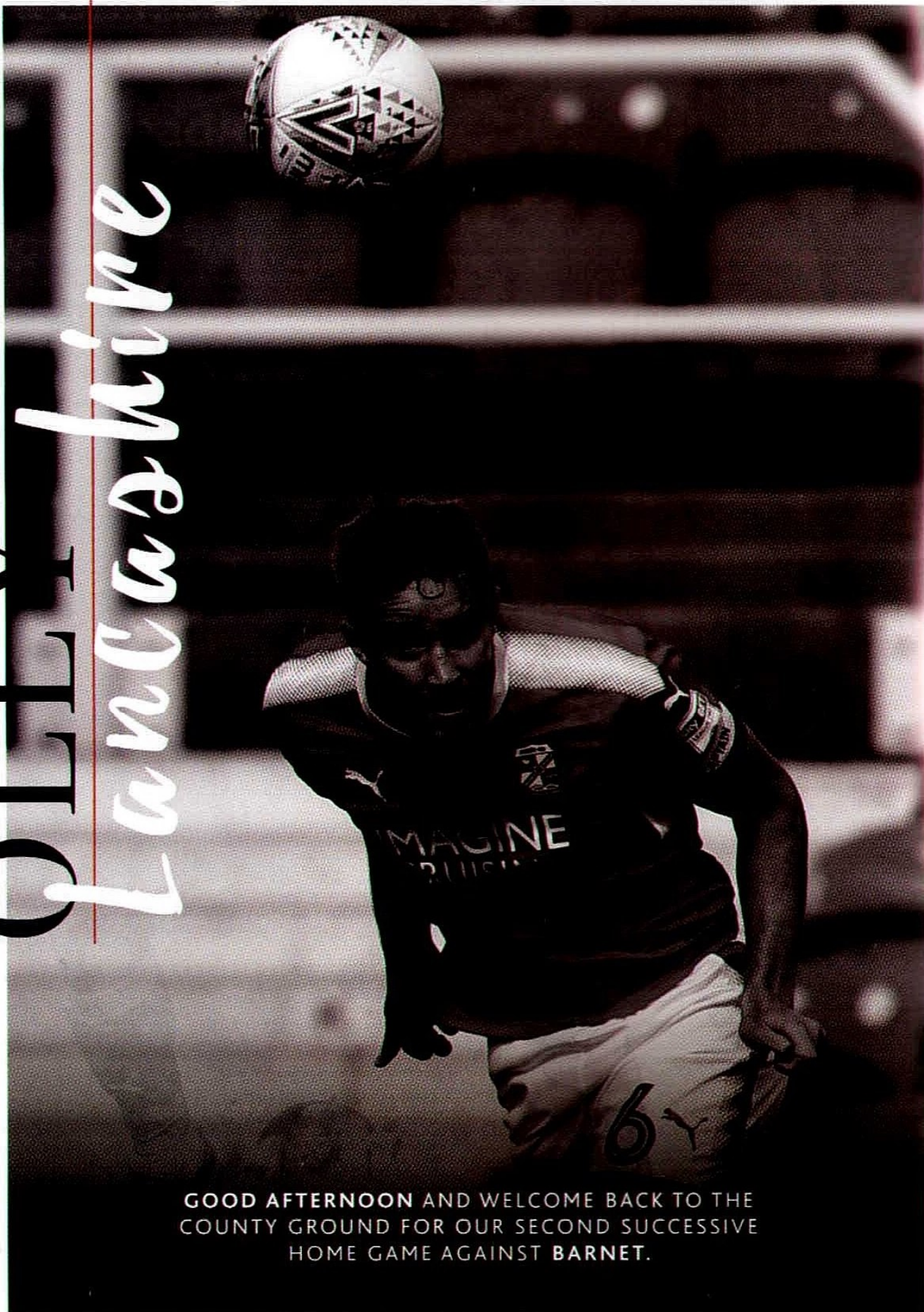

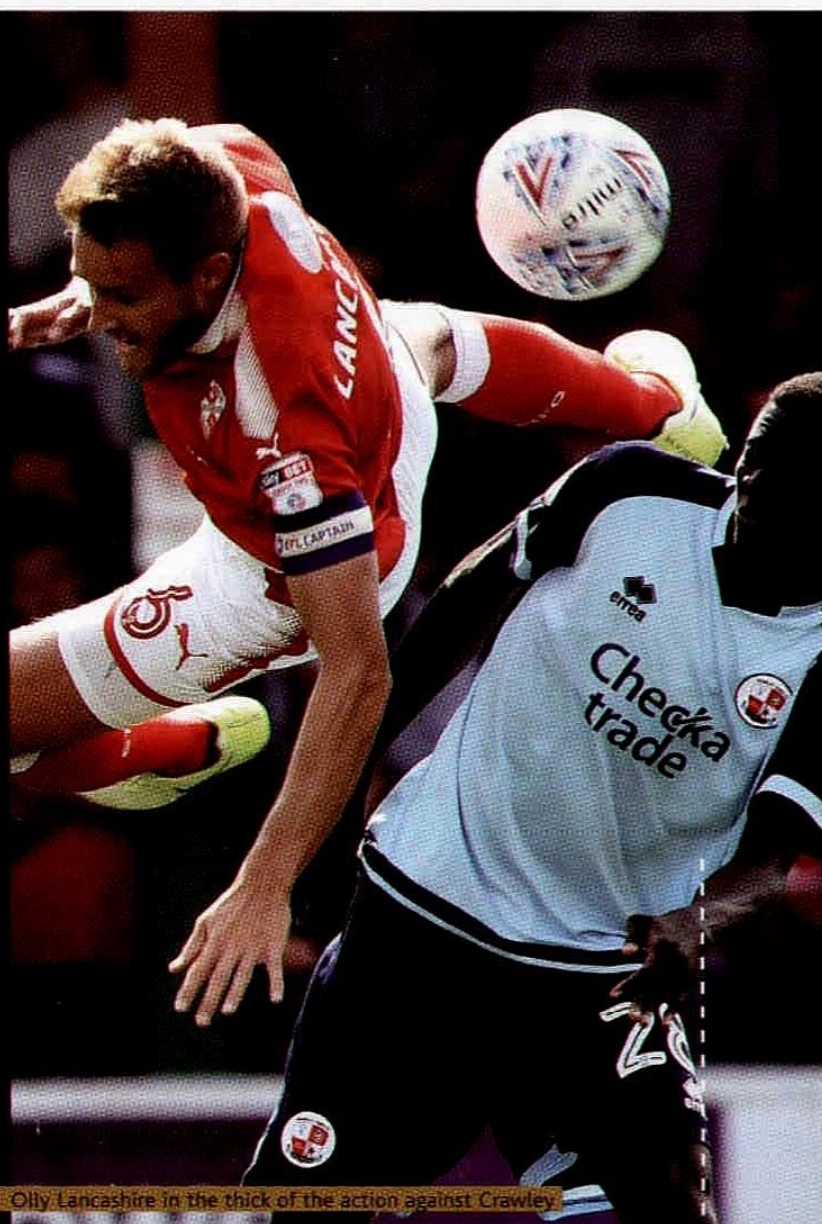
Last Saturday was hugely disappointing and it was a result we didn't see coming. We went into the game sitting nicely at the top of the table after three good outings and confidence was high.

BARNET



Barnet will arrive at The County Ground today looking to bounce back after a mixed start to the 2017/18 Sky Bet League Two campaign.

The Bees endured a turbulent 2016/17 season after losing Martin Allen midway through the term, before Kevin Nugent was sacked in April 2017 following a poor run of form. Rossi Eames, who took charge of the club on an interim basis twice, was handed the reins on a permanent basis in the summer and he'll be hoping to bring some stability to The Hive Stadium.

It was a busy summer for Barnet who oversaw a number of outgoing and incomings, with Richard Brindley, Shaq Coulthirst and Craig Ross among the new faces. They were also able to keep hold of powerful frontman John Akinde,

who finished as the joint top goalscorer in League Two last season with 26 goals to his name.

Barnet kicked-off the new campaign with a 2-2 draw away to EFL newcomers Forest Green Rovers, before dumping League One outfit Peterborough United out of the Carabao Cup. That was backed up with an impressive 1-0 victory against Luton Town, although Eames' side have now suffered back-to-back defeats in the league following losses against Crewe Alexandra and Stevenage.

Today's game will be the first meeting between the two sides since April 2012, where efforts from Ronan Murray and Oliver Risser were enough to hand Paolo Di Canio's Town side a 2-0 win and push them closer to the League Two Title.

THE MANAGER

ROSSI EAMES

Barnet appointed Rossi Eames as their new Head Coach in May 2017, with the 32-year-old becoming the youngest Head Coach in the top four divisions of English football.

With a sporting background in gymnastics, Eames competed at the British Championships before moving to Slovenia at the age of 16 for two years in order to coach. He opted to retire from the sport in his early 20's and moved into football, representing Amersham Town and Chesham United.

After studying Sports Science and Coaching at Leeds University and following placements with Bradford City and Leeds United, Eames moved back down south and joined Barnet as a Video Analyst, in addition to coaching the U13's.

It wasn't long before Rossi was brought into Martin Allen's First-Team Coaching setup after progressing through the ranks at The Hive Stadium, and he was asked to step into the breach on an interim basis on a couple of occasions following Allen's departure to Eastleigh.

Under his guidance, Barnet won four games out of eleven before Kevin Nugent was brought in as Head Coach, and they went on to record victories in two of their final four matches after Eames was once again asked to take temporary charge following Nugent's sacking.

Eames guided The Bees to a 15th place finish in League Two last term, eleven points above the relegation zone, and he was awarded the top job on a permanent basis shortly after being presented with the Lester Finch Award for his outstanding contribution to the football club.

JAMIE STEPHENS

Beginning his career with Forest Green Rovers, the young keeper joined Swindon Town's Academy in 2007 and his impressive displays for the youth team soon caught the attention of Premier League giants Liverpool, who snapped up the youngster in April 2010.

A loan spell at Airbus UK Broughton followed before he was released by the Reds in 2013, opting to sign for Newport County on a free transfer. Stephens made his Football League debut in August 2013 and he joined Barnet in 2015 on a free transfer following a spell in non-league. He has emerged as The Bees' number one and he's featured regularly so far this season.

RICHARD BRINDLEY

Brindley arrived at The Hive Stadium on a free transfer in the summer of 2017 after departing Colchester United. Once on the books of Norwich City, the right-back has played for a host of clubs including the likes of Rotherham United, Scunthorpe United and Colchester United. Despite being just 24-years of age, Brindley boasts plenty of experience and he was part of the Rotherham side that clinched promotion to the Championship in 2014.

CHARLIE CLOUGH

Barnet shelled out an undisclosed fee in order to land the centre-back from Forest Green Rovers in January 2017. The 26-year-old scored seven goals in 78 National League appearances at the New Lawn, having previously plied his trade for Bristol Rovers and Sutton United. Clough is an ever-present in the league for The Bees so far this season.

**MICHAEL NELSON**

The vastly experienced defender signed for Barnet in August 2015 following a successful trial and is now Club Captain, in addition to helping to coach The Bees' U23's squad. Nelson is a formidable presence at the heart of the defence and is a proven performer at this level.

Starting his career with Leek Town back in 1997, Nelson spent a chunk of his career in non-league before going on to have spells with the likes of Bury, Hartlepool United, Norwich City, Scunthorpe United, Kilmarnock, Bradford City and Hibernian. The centre-back has various promotions on his CV as well as a Scottish League Cup winners medal.

**CURTIS WESTON**

The combative central-midfielder, who spent a season at The County Ground between 2006 and 2007, has been with Barnet since 2012 and has racked up just shy of 200 appearances for the club. Known for his crunching tackles and tireless work-rate, Weston is a firm fans' favourite at The Hive while he has also represented Leeds United.

**JAMAL CAMPBELL-RYCE**

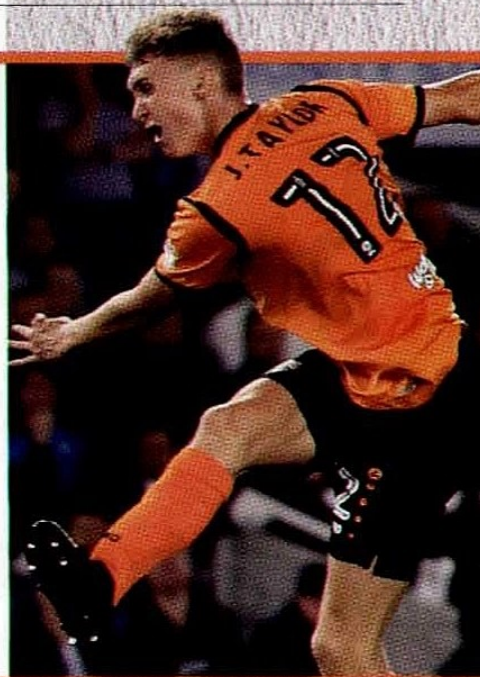
The experienced attacker has been there and done it in the EFL and he will be hoping to enjoy success with Barnet, whom he joined in 2016. Campbell-Ryce has experience of Championship football under his belt and his leadership has seen him captain The Bees this season.

Barnsley, Bristol City, Notts County and Sheffield United are just some of the clubs the winger has represented, while he also has experience on the international stage having won 18 caps for the Jamaican senior side.

JACK TAYLOR

The young midfielder was once on the books of Chelsea as a boy and joined Barnet in 2016 following his release by the Premier League champions. Jack, who's brother Harry is also at The Hive Stadium, is known for his ability on the ball and he scored his first professional goal against Luton earlier this month. He has also been tracked by both West Ham United and Southampton.

MAURO VILHETE

The winger, who can also play centrally and as a full-back, arrived at Barnet in 2009 after leaving his native Portugal. Vilhete scored both goals in a 2-0 win against Gateshead in April 2015 that secured the Conference Title and promotion back to League Two for The Bees. He's been a regular starter so far this term.

JOHN AKINDE

The powerful frontman joined the Bees in 2014 and he's been in sparkling form in-front of goal ever since, scoring 82 goals in just 142 appearances prior to the start of this season. That translates to a goal every 1.7 games over the last three campaigns and he is a threat to anyone he plays against due to his sheer size and remarkable eye for goal.

Akinde has plied his trade for the likes of Bristol City, Bristol Rovers, Wycombe Wanderers and Brentford while he became Barnet's highest-ever league goalscorer in April 2017.

JEAN-LOUIS AKPA-AKPRO

Barnet snapped up the striker in August 2016 following a successful trial spell after the striker had parted company with Shrewsbury Town. Beginning his career with Toulouse in his native France, Akpa-Akpro moved to England with Grimsby in 2008 following stints with Brest and FC Brussels. He has also featured for Rochdale, Tranmere Rovers and Bury while he spent a short spell on loan with Yeovil Town last term.

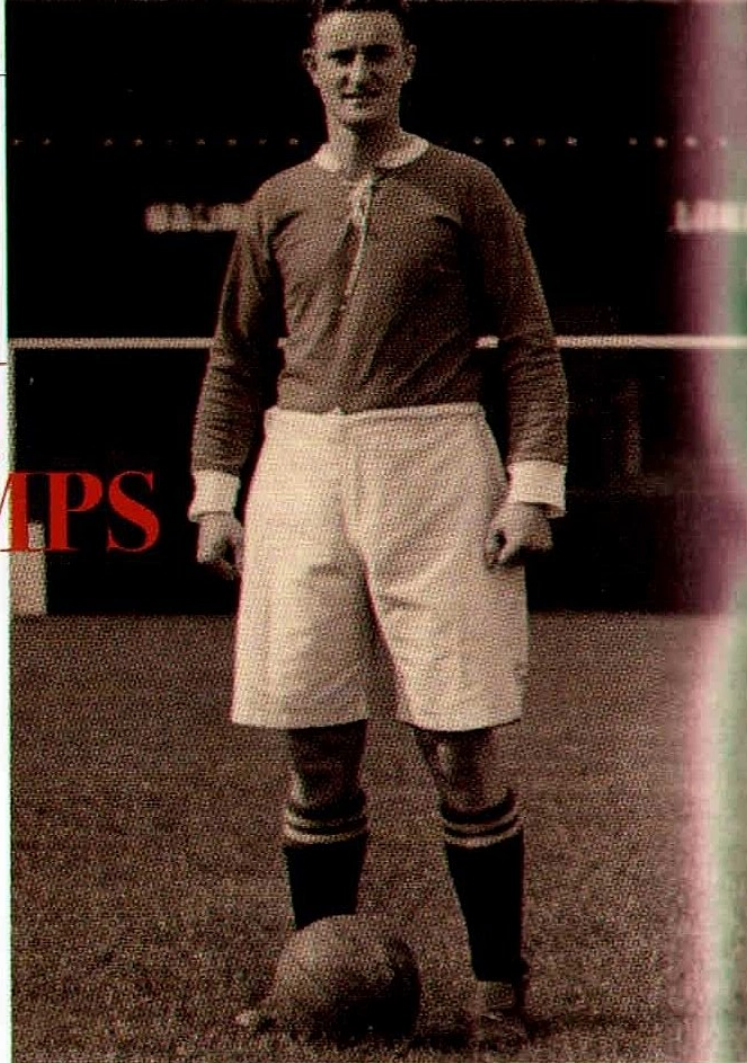

KEVIN DEARDEN

The keeper, then 20-years-old, came to The County Ground on loan from Tottenham in March 1990 as cover for Fraser Digby. Kevin made just one League appearance - a 2-1 win at Bournemouth before returning to White Hart Lane. He also made a single appearance for Barnet. That came during another loan spell, in February 1999, although on that occasion he conceded five at Peterborough. STFC 1 appearance / BFC 1

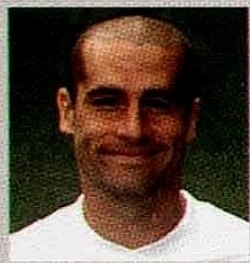


RONNIE HOWELL

A former Millwall midfielder, Ronnie joined Town on trial in April 1972 before Dave Mackay gave him a contract in the summer. But following the Scot's departure in the November, Ronnie fell out of favour with Les Allen. Early in 1976, he was part of a Tooting side which knocked Swindon out of the FA Cup and he went on to spend the 1982/83 season as player-coach at Barnet. STFC 25 apps / BFC 19

PAUL MITCHELL

Paul arrived in Wiltshire on loan from Wigan following the departure of Andy Gurney early in 2004/05. Normally seen in a central midfield role, he filled in at right-back for Town and his performances prompted manager Andy King to extend his stay. However, his parent club soon recalled him and he was on his way to MK Dons. A broken leg in February 2007 virtually ended his career, his final first team appearances coming while with Barnet. STFC 7 apps / BFC 4



NICKY NICOLAU

A free transfer signing from Southend, Nicky endured an injury-ridden season at Swindon. On recovering from a hernia repair in January he was loaned to Hereford for three months before being released. He signed for Barnet in the summer and went on to spend three seasons at Underhill. A Cypriot under-21 international. STFC 6 apps / BFC 98



JOE DEVERA

A solid defender, Joe came through the ranks at Underhill to earn a pro contract in 2006 before becoming one of Paolo Di Canio's first signings for Town in 2011. He started in a central role but enjoyed a run at right-back in the absence of Paul Caddis. Joe scored on his final appearance in the play-off semi-final at Brentford as Swindon went out on penalties. STFC 66 apps / BFC 201

**KEVIN WATSON**

A midfield playmaker, Kevin had made a handful of Premier League appearances for Spurs before joining Barnet on loan in February 1995. Steve McMahon signed 'Chipper' on a free transfer in the following year. He spent three seasons at the County Ground but was constantly in and out of the side and registered only one goal - although another came in an abandoned game against Grimsby in December 1996. STFC 70 apps / BFC 13

**ROY AGAR**

Inside-forward Roy made his first team debut for Barnet before his 17th birthday in 1953 and briefly signed as an amateur for Tottenham later that year. He came to The County Ground late in 1955 during his national service while stationed at Devizes with the Army Pay Corps. 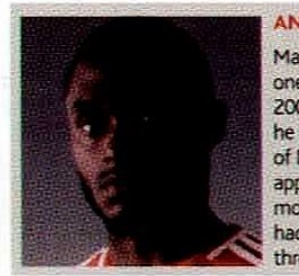

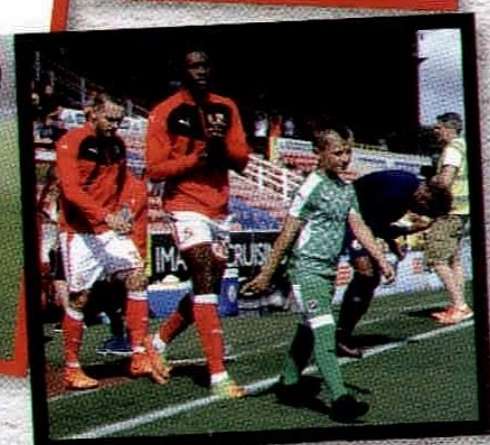

MATTY *Taylor*

IN-DEPTH WITH...

Firstly, Matty, how have you settled into life as a Swindon Town player so far?

I've settled in very well. All the lads have been very welcoming to me and it is a really good group of men and that's important. I've really, really enjoyed it and it has been quite an intense week in terms of training. I had physical testing on my first day but it has been an enjoyable first week, obviously bar the result last Saturday.

As you have touched on the Crawley defeat let's go there next. Obviously it was a proud moment for you making your Town debut, but where did you think it went wrong in terms of the loss?

It is difficult for me to comment having only just joined and I haven't witnessed the other performances, but we started the game really well, had quite a few chances, their keeper pulled off three or four really good saves and in my experience when you are on top in games you need to score and unfortunately for us their keeper had a really good game. We got a bit too stretched in our shape in the second-half, we were chasing the game and therefore we left quite a few gaps that the opposition exploited. But the good thing is that we've got time now to learn from it, to digest it, to go through it and to rectify any issues. You only learn by making mistakes and we made too many mistakes on Saturday so learning from it is vitally important and we will do that.

Promotion is the main aim this season so was that the main factor behind you signing here and dropping down a league to join us?

It was and it was also the way in which the manager spoke very highly of the football club and his infectious character in terms of what he wants to do and how hard he works, along with Futch as well. I thought it was an opportunity that was too good for me to turn down. The dropping down a division to League Two wasn't an issue for me because I want to be part of something that is going somewhere this season and, albeit that we suffered a bad result last weekend, I still believe that promotion is achievable for us

this season. Saying it publicly is one thing and the next thing for us is to back that up and actually do it.

You have been part of promotion winning sides before in your career so are you looking to draw on those experiences to help this Town team this season?

Of course you draw on your experiences in your career to shape your future, but one thing I will say is that football from the time I got promoted from League Two with Luton Town has moved on a lot. However, it was only two seasons ago that I got promoted to the Premier League with Burnley and what we had there was a good group that had a real togetherness, they wanted to run that extra mile for their team-mate, tackle and put their body on the line and, from what I've seen so far, we have got that at Swindon Town.

As a midfielder what qualities are you looking to add to the mix during your time at Swindon Town?

Hopefully a calmness to our play at times and I think that can be quite difficult in the heat of the game. As a midfielder you are judged on your assists and your goals and scoring goals and creating them is something I still thoroughly enjoy, but all I can guarantee to my team-mates and the fans is that I'll give everything I've got. I will make mistakes along with probably everyone else in the team, but it is learning from those mistakes and even at my age you still learn and you don't know everything. I want to bring as much as I can and I'm very eager for us to succeed this season. I can be at times a little over the top and overzealous because I'm so desperate even at my age to be part of something successful. All I can say is that I'll give everything I can whenever I'm asked to do so on the football pitch. That's all I've done over the last 18-years and I'll continue to do that.

there, so how do you look back on that time in your life?

My time at Luton was a wonderful grounding for me and it gave me a platform to play football. It was a really, really fantastic football club in terms of the grounding that it gave me because even when I was playing in the first-team, I was still treated as a YTS player and I would clean boots. It just exposed me to what men's football is and I wouldn't have had the career that I've had since then if it wasn't for that. The manager at the time, Lennie Lawrence was fantastic and he looked after me extremely well.

You then went on to Portsmouth and there's one game that really stands out during your time there, which was the win over Sunderland in a vital six-pointer where you contributed two goals and two assists. Does that one moment sum up the wonderful time you had at Fratton Park?

That was a big result for us at the time but we didn't build on it and the manager at the time got sacked. Harry Redknapp then came back and, as Harry does, he made a few shrewd signings and from memory I think we were 12 or 13 points adrift with 12 or 13 games to go, but we ended up staying up on the penultimate day of the season. The best memory for me was the fact that I managed to score the goal that kept us in the Premier League away at Wigan, so that would probably be my fondest memory because it was a wonderful day, everyone had written us off and we were dead and buried. I remember going to West Ham and we won 4-1 and we won games that we shouldn't have. We beat Manchester City in the last couple of minutes, it was 1-1, we had to win and Pedro Mendes smashed a volley in so I've got lots of fond memories from my time at Fratton Park.

You also had spells with Bolton Wanderers and West Ham United, both very big clubs, so what were those experiences like for you?

Bolton was good because it was the first time as a family we moved away from where we live now because I used to commute from where I lived to Portsmouth. I felt Bolton was the right fit for me and I really enjoyed three-and-a-half-years there. To be perfectly honest, at the time I didn't want to leave because West Ham had just been relegated to the Championship, Bolton were still in the Premier League and I was really looking forward to a successful season there. The club was going in a different direction and I got the opportunity to sign for West Ham and, very naively on my part,



I didn't realise how big a club they are. I will never forget the first time I walked out at Upton Park to the bubbles – it is something that still makes the hairs on the back of my neck stand up. I've been really lucky, I've played for some really good football clubs and probably had a career that is better than anything I could have dreamed of.

You have picked the number 31 shirt this season, a number you wore last year with Northampton, is there any particular reason behind that choice?

Not really, no. I did pre-season on my own last year because I left Burnley and I didn't want to be away from home anymore and I didn't want to travel anymore. The opportunity came up to go to Northampton and the 31 was just a number that was left when I signed. Numbers aren't hugely important to me and 31 was a number I quite liked last season, so I decided to stick with it this season. There's nothing superstitious behind it!

We know you have scored a number of wonder goals throughout your career, but just how much work goes in on the training ground to perfect that technique?

It is plenty of practice. My eagerness to play football and the way I am means that I am more than happy to grab a bag of balls after training. It is something that you have to practice and it is something I do practice quite a lot, albeit obviously not

enough because I stuck one in the stand on Saturday! But it is all about practice, practice, practice and that is something I keep telling my son. He's left-footed and I keep telling him to work on his right-foot. I spent hours and hours kicking the ball against the wall and he won't do that quite yet. The penny hasn't dropped with him yet but I'm sure it will.

Finally, Barnet are the visitors this afternoon and it is a perfect opportunity to bounce straight back isn't it?

Of course it is. We've had a whole week to work on the training pitch and to iron out any issues. We've been able to look at the way Barnet set-up, look at their strengths, their weaknesses and it is an opportunity for us to get three points at home. What we need to do is turn The County Ground into a fortress. Because it is one of if not the biggest stadiums in the league, teams will enjoy coming here because of the surroundings, but what we need to do is make sure that they don't enjoy their day and we need to make sure that we don't give points away like we did on Saturday. It is another big game, Barnet have been in League Two for a few seasons now and I'm sure their players are aware of what it takes to win football matches at this level. We need to be more ruthless in both boxes because, ultimately, that's where games are won and lost so we need to take our chances and defend as well as we can. If we do that then we have a good opportunity of being successful today.

It was good that we didn't pick up too many injuries in the off-season, we've had a few since then but none of them have been too

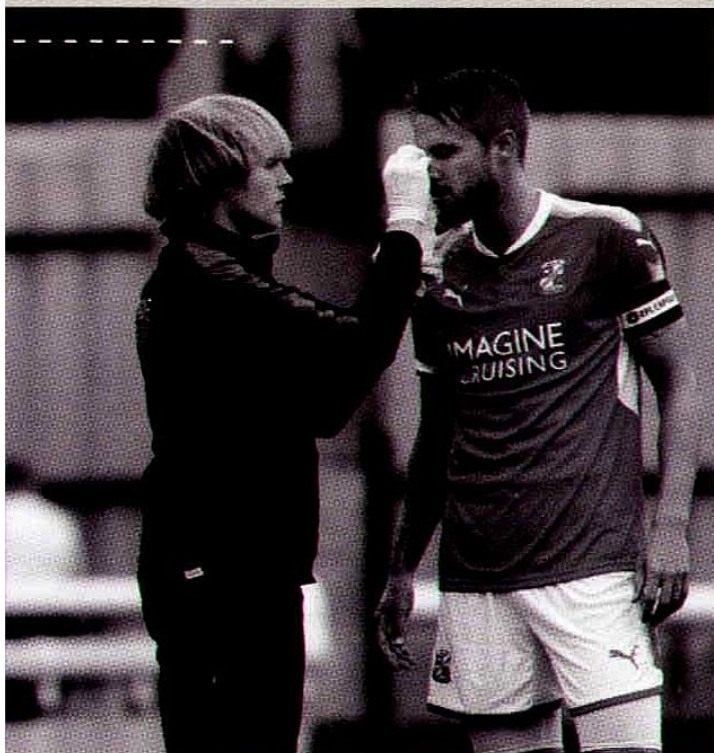
serious touch wood. Hopefully we can get them all back on the pitch as soon as possible.

We all know that Luke Norris suffered what looked to be quite a serious shoulder injury on the opening day, but his quick return is down to Luke himself. He's a credit to himself really. Everyone saw that he was in quite a lot of discomfort at the Carlisle game but he's very eager to get out there and play and we got very lucky that it wasn't something more serious. He's not had any problems since which is obviously a huge positive.

We've currently got John Goddard and Kyle Knoyle on the treatment table but they are both doing very well. Johnny is making good progress and Kyle is making fantastic progress, so I would expect to see them back in and around the squad in the not too distant future.

On a general note in terms of my work with injured players, my day typically starts a little bit earlier than some of the other staff and I'll assess and review players to see where their fitness status is at and then let the manager know before a certain time so he knows who is training and who isn't.

From there I'll either cover training or be pitchside doing rehab drills with the players that are close to returning to full training. Alternatively, I'll be in the gym working with them to get them stronger, to get them fitter and to give them the best chance of returning and making sure that the injury doesn't reoccur.

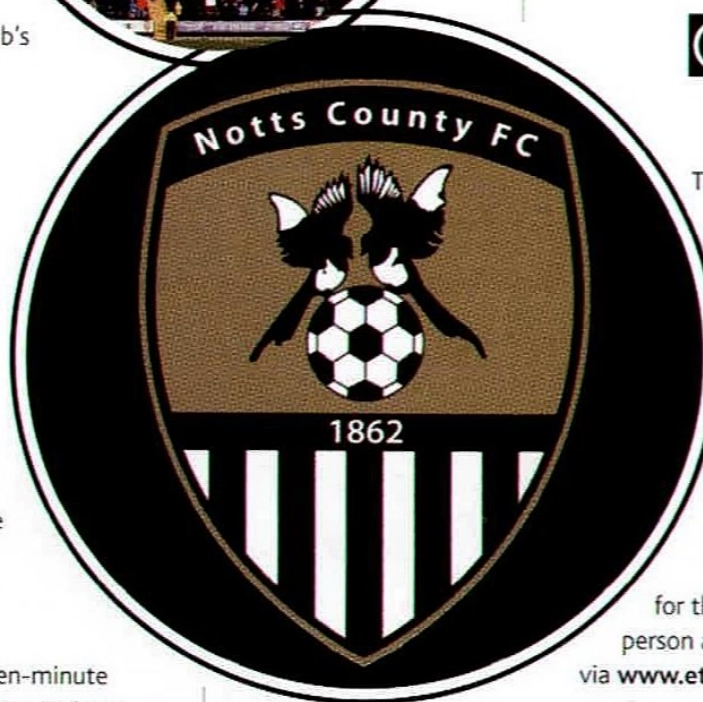
PUBS

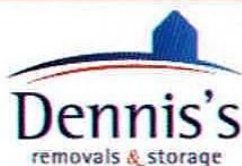
