



We're lucky to have Sky Sports here, as well as football fans around the world watching tonight on their local channel which adds a bit of extra excitement, but we need to treat this like any other game, ignore the cameras and focus on our performance.

Our last time out here was

against Lincoln in tricky conditions and we were disappointed to lose the game. I was pleased with the commitment shown by the players, we showed real passion and desire and didn't deserve to come away with nothing.

We defended well and limited

Collective Responsibility...







"The players need to take some responsibility and manage games more effectively."

Lee Collins was the first man through the door at Forest Green following promotion to League 2 in May.

The experienced centre back has quickly established himself as one of the first names on the team sheet and having played in a variety of roles in the first few games, has now found himself at the heart of an experienced back four which is looking to tighten things up defensively.

"We're heading in the right direction and are starting to find the right balance and gel as a unit" says Collins. "We need to learn when to play and when we need to go long, but we're looking more solid and have been unlucky with the last few goals.

"We had to go back to basics for the Lincoln game because of the weather and we did it really well. It was a proper nitty gritty League 2 game and I think we deserved to win it, but at the moment we're conceding sloppy goals through individual errors. The same happened in the Port Vale game where we played really well and should have won but we

made another mistake – and we've got to stamp that out.

"At the moment it feels like we're making one mistake in a game and we're getting punished for it. But that's how League 2 works – as we progress we're playing better defensively and we'll definitely progress up the table."

These errors have led to frustration for manager Mark Cooper and have so far blighted the club's debut EFL campaign.

Collins says: "The players need to take some responsibility and manage games more effectively. The manager will work on our game plan all week and is doing everything completely right and then come the Saturday the players won't execute it for some reason.

"I look at the gaffer at half time or full time and wonder how he can handle it. He's done everything he can but it's up to us for the 90 minutes.

"We're letting him down - I think he's a fantastic manager – with the coaching we get and the style of play, any footballer would be happy to be a part of it."

Collins has worked with some well-respected managers in the past including Chris Wilder and

Aidy Boothroyd, so how does Cooper compare?

"The main thing about him is his man management is second to none. All managers want to be great coaches — and he's a fantastic coach — but the gaffer goes beyond that and will really help these lads to progress as he nurtures them, it's a pleasure to watch.

"A lot of managers have ruined young players by not working with them properly, but he'll sit down and talk them through what they're doing well and help people to recover from and eradicate their mistakes."

Collins suggests that the manager the fans see on a Saturday is very different to the one that trains the team on a weekday.

"Matchdays are totally different to the day-to-day – the gaffer gets involved in the game and as a fan I'd be disappointed if he wasn't getting animated. But he's got the right temperament on a Monday or Tuesday to be able to pull a player to the side and explain how he could be doing better."

Despite on the pitch frustrations and the challenging start to the season, Collins is feeling happy at the club and has moved his young family west.

"I met my missus eight years ago and her family all live in Newport so we've moved there – near to Doidgey. With our third kid on the way this summer it made perfect sense for me to move to FGR and it's fantastic to have all the family around us."

With his faith in the manager, his family around him and his determination to succeed, the future is looking bright for Lee Collins and it's only a matter of time before the results on the pitch match that positive outlook.

the Academy and first team staff.



After eight league fixtures Swindon Town sit in 8th place in the Sky Bet League Two table having won 50% of their games so far.

On Saturday The Robins came flying out of the blocks racing to a 2-0 lead within the opening 13 minutes of their tie with Stevenage. Although Boro clawed a couple of goals back Swindon went on to win the tie 3-2 to banish the demons of a narrow 1-0 away loss to Notts County the week before.

Having found themselves relegated last season, they will be looking to get themselves back into the third tier of English Football at the first time of asking.

David Flitcroft was handed the reins at The County Ground at

the beginning of the season after the departure of Luke Williams – who couldn't stop Swindon from being relegated last season.

With over 400 league starts for clubs in Northern England from Preston to Bury during his playing days, Flitcroft was offered his first management job in January 2013 as he made the step up from an assistant manager role at Barnsley into the club's top job.

During his first spell as manager he kept the Tykes' Championship status intact on the final day of the season and was offered a new rolling one-year contract ahead of the new campaign.

Results on the pitch took a downturn leading to Flitcroft

losing his job at Oakwell in
November 2013 but it took
just 9 days to get back on his
feet as he was appointed the
new manager of Bury. Having
made over 120 appearances
for the club as a player, he
took the team from the face of
relegation to a 12th-place finish
in the top half of the table.

In his first full season he led
The Shakers to promotion
from League Two before an
uncompromising start to a
League One season that saw his
side go 11 games without a win
which saw him leave the club.


The 43 year old has been given a new opportunity in management by Swindon Town this year and will seek to replicate his previous League Two success with The Robins this time around.



Having played every minute of league football so far, Lancashire has held the backline together since joining The Robins from Shrewsbury in the summer. The former Crystal Palace youngster was handed the captain's armband ahead of the 17/18 season.




Deadline day signing Anderson joined Swindon on loan from Crystal Palace and got his first goal for the club on Saturday against Stevenage. He featured as part of Frank De Boer's Asia Cup squad so is well thought of by the Eagles hierarchy.



A new attacking option for David Flitcroft's side after making the switch from Morecambe. After spells at Everton and Liverpool, he moved to Spain to sign for Racing Santander in the summer of 2011. However, the move fell through due to serious financial problems at the Cantabrian club.



With five goals in seven starts for Swindon, Norris heads the list of the top marksmen for the club. The number 9 managed just six goals last season, so is well on his way to a much more successful campaign this time around.

CULTURE PREVAILS

Port Vale 1-1 FGR

For the third away fixture in succession, Rovers were locking horns with a club and stadium that was virgin territory for me. Port Vale FC at Burslem in the Potteries. Although there would be a full turn out by Compo, Foggy, Clegg, Mr & Mrs Morse and other friends, several were travelling independently. Yours truly and Mrs Rambling man were staying 'up north' with t'friends.

So far in the league, 3 away games and 3 emphatic defeats. Analysis was required to correct this poor record. Two things stood out:

- None of the journeys had featured intermediate cultural destinations other than Motorway Service stations and they don't count
- 2. I had not worn by lucky cream jumper, as despite our unpredictable summer climate, no fixture had necessitated dressing like a Grimsby trawler-man

Saturday 16th was a cool early Autumn day, but still not cold enough for the jumper to be summoned. Anyhow, something had to be left in reserve for later season. Thus the obvious remedy for the team's malady was culture, innit bruy?

So it was that we set course for Stafford Castle, our transport Mrs R-M's diminutive black Up! Despite the worst excesses of M6, we arrived at this historic free-to-enter destination by elevenses.

The castle is supposed to be the UK's best preserved example of a motte & bailey defensive structure. The trend was started by Willy the Conqueror in the eleventh century. Fresh from thumping Alfred at Hastings, he didn't yet have a





Home Office Visa and wasn't sure how long he'd stay in Britannia.

So, he and his mates needed decent seats of defence to quell the natives. They decided to throw up small hills (motte: Norman French for a 'heap') with timber forts atop. Below, a palisade fence would retain the bailey – an enclosure for hovels, farm animals and so on.

Stafford Castle goes back to around 1100 but was upgraded to more durable masonry through the following centuries and saw service during the English civil war. The stone ruin we scrambled over originated with the Plantagenets mid fifteenth century but has suffered damage and decline until coming into public ownership about 50 years ago. Well worth a stomp about and has a great visitor centre.

On then to the Potteries. In the heyday of porcelain manufacture, all roads led to the cluster of 6 towns namely Burslem, Tunstall,



Hanley, Stoke-upon-Trent, Longton and Fenton. Controversially, in 1910 the Six Towns were unwillingly united to form a city called Stoke-on-Trent. Generations later, many in the other 5 communities are unforgiving.

Port Vale is one few English league clubs not to be named after a geographical location. Its title is a reference to the valley of ports on the Trent & Mersey canal. Vale has moved through 3 grounds at Cobridge & Hanley before settling as Burslem Port Vale at Vale Park in 1950. 105 years in the football league, it has never played in the top tier and now props up the other 91, just below FGR. Only a couple of decades ago, fierce rivals Stoke City occupied the same 'old second division' and the opposite extremes of fortune since cut Vale supporters to the quick.

Will Randall took off down the left early into the second half, but nobody could connect with his powerful cross.




