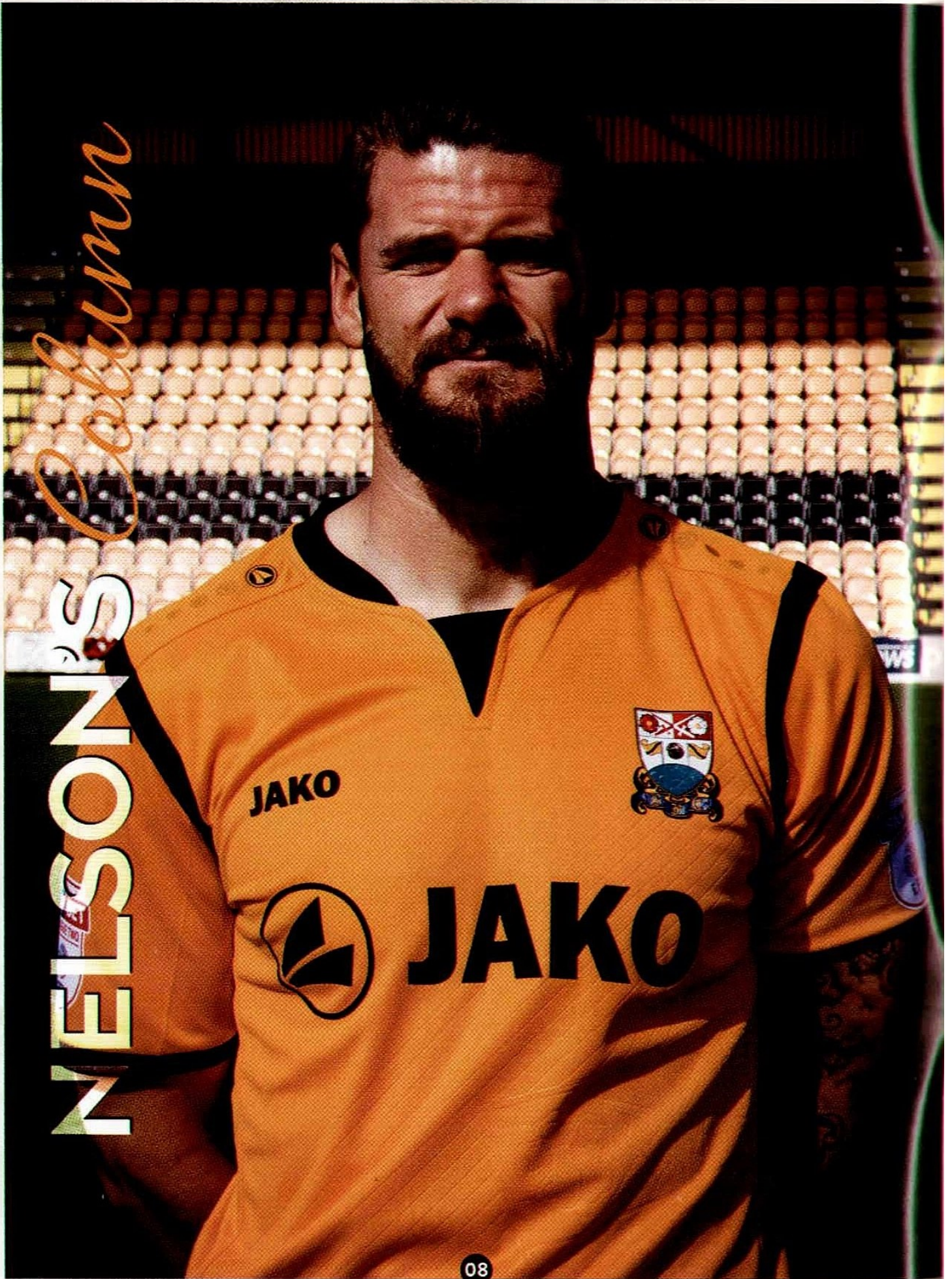
Normally, performances come first and the support will follow, but we need your support now and it will be very important to us.

Happy New Year! Welcome back to The Hive London for the first Sky Bet League Two match of 2018 which sees Barnet take on Swindon Town.

I grew up locally to Swindon Town so this is a fixture that I have been looking forward to ever since they were revealed back in June. Arguably, our best 'Away Day' of 2017 came at the County Ground in September. A wonderful 4-1 win for the Bees in the late summer sunshine and a match that had it all!

The Bees got off to the best possible start when Shaq Coulthirst pounced on a defensive error to give Barnet the lead. Soon after, Ricardo Santos was fouled at a corner and Jamal Campbell-Ryce slotted home the resulting penalty.

A red card for our hosts made their task more difficult and when Shaq Coulthirst doubled his personal tally, he put the game beyond doubt. But that wasn't enough for him, he bagged his first professional hat-trick with a goal that if scored by one of the best players in the world, we'll all still be talking about. Even the home fans surrounding the press box found it only right to applaud.

Swindon pulled a goal back through Norris before the game became 10v10 when Blackman received a red card for an off the ball incident. The 246 members of the Bee Army that made the

trip were sent home happy.

Other contenders for the Best 'Away Day' of 2017 could include the following:

Newport County 1-2 Barnet – Mark McGhee's first win in charge of the Bees, and what a win! 1-0 down with 88 minutes on the clock, 2-1 up by the time the fourth official showed 6 additional minutes! And they were probably the 6 longest minutes of the season!

Brighton 1-0 Barnet – Yes, I have put this in the list despite it being a defeat. 678 Barnet fans out singing the 10,000+ home supporters was a sight and noise to behold. Barnet put in a brave, battling performance and deserved to at least take the match to extra time against Premier League opposition.

Hartlepool 0-2 Barnet – 203 Barnet fans made the long trip to the North East and were given a result that made the journey worthwhile. Goals from Akinola and Akinde secured three points for the Bees.

Leyton Orient 1-3 Barnet – An Away Day missed by the Bees faithful this season, purely for its locality. Ricardo Santos bagged a brace on his second appearance for the club and Curtis Weston sealed the win and sent 730 Barnet fans home happy.

SEASON of goodwill? Not for Sheffield Wednesday and Middlesbrough, who both sacked their managers after the Teesiders' 2-1 triumph at Hillsborough last weekend. Carlos Carvalhal bit the bullet after two-and-a-half years in charge of the Owls, whilst Garry Monk's miserable stay at the Riverside lasted just six months. So will ruthlessness prevail? Here are... other clubs in recent years whose Christmas gift to the gaffer was a P45 - and how they fared.

ALAN PARDEW // SACKED // BY CRYSTAL PALACE ON DEC 22

Though a place outside the bottom three, Pards could hardly argue that Palace weren't on a harrowing trajectory. At the time of his dismissal, the Eagles points-per-game average for the calendar year 2016 was worse than any other team in England. In fact, it was the fourth-worst in top-flight history. Chairman Steve Parish saw the writing on the wall, appointed Sam Allardyce and the resulting surge to safety was as predictable as turkey curry on Boxing Day.



BOB BRADLEY // SACKED // BY SWANSEA ON DEC 27

Poor Bob. On Christmas Day he was preparing a Premier League side. On New Years' Day he was back with the folks in the States, his English adventure a total write-off. Appointed at the behest of Swansea's American owners, the former USA boss won two of his 11 games was quite patently out of his depth. Sacked following a 4-1 defeat to West Ham, Bradley was replaced by Paul Clement. The ex-Derby manager led the Swans to safety - only to suffer the exact same fate 12 months later.



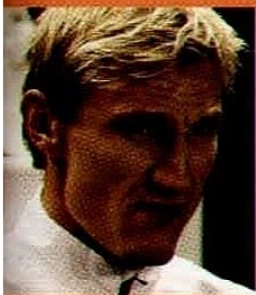
RICARDO MONIZ // SACKED // BY NOTTS COUNTY ON DEC 29

Moniz played lovely football but didn't win games; when the immediate return to League One did not materialise, the Dutchman was sent packing. What followed was pure mayhem. First came former Palace hardman Jamie Fullarton, a complete rookie who somehow managed to lose the dressing room in just two months. Eight defeats in 12 saw him follow Moniz out of the door. Mark Cooper arrived and did manage to see out the season, only to be denied a new contract. All that for a net loss of four league places.



SAMI HYYPIA // SACKED // BY BRIGHTON ON DEC 22

A giant of a centre-half, a dead loss of a manager. Though the Finn took over during a transitional period, his six-month reign brought dire football and defeats galore. Officially a resignation, Hyyppia simply jumped before he was pushed. Little did anybody realise then the enormous favour he'd done the Seagulls. In his stead came Championship specialist Chris Hughton and, within two-and-a-half years, Brighton were in the Premier League.



MALKY MACKAY // SACKED // BY CARDIFF ON DEC 27

Oh dear. Whilst subsequent revelations might have sealed Mackay's fate anyway, his dismissal was still an unmitigated disaster. On the day of his departure, the newly-promoted Bluebirds hadn't once occupied the Premier League relegation zone. Once Ole Gunnar Solskjaer arrived, they became a permanent fixture. Cardiff were eventually relegated in 20th position and the Norwegian departed after a month of floundering in the Championship.

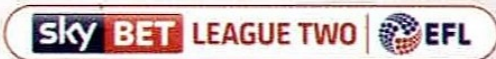

Cheltenham nearly took an early lead but Andre Blackman was in the right place at the right time to head clear off the line before Eisa hit the rebound well over the crossbar.

Jamie Stephens conceded an indirect free-kick in his own area when his attempt to clear a backpass flew up in the air and he caught the ball. Jamal Campbell-Ryce blocked the effort behind for a corner kick.

Dawson opened the scoring in the 32nd minute with a finish at the far post after getting on the end of Mohamed Eisa's was given space to deliver a dangerous ball across the face of goal.

The visitors doubled their lead in the 6 minutes later when Winchester was allowed to weave his way through the Barnet back line to score.

The Bees best chance to get back into the game came midway through the second half when they went racing down on goal, two-on-one. Shaquile Coulthirst opted to shoot instead of playing John Akinde over to his right through on goal, and it was blocked by Jamie Grimes.

It could have been worse for Barnet but Will Boyle's free header went well wide before the tricky Eisa curled a shot narrowly past the post.

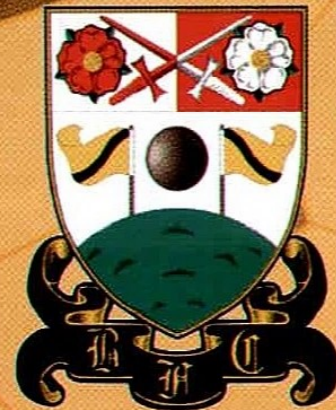

WHAT'S THE BUZZ

JOSH PALMER

Newport County is investigating reports that Danny Cowley, the manager of Lincoln City, was hit by coins that were thrown from the stands in the game between the two sides last weekend. The game, which ended as a 0-0 draw, saw County defender Mark O'Brien receive a straight red card in the 53rd minute for a bad foul, which angered the home fans. Cowley said: "We were getting pelted verbally and physically". In a statement, the Exiles said: "Newport County AFC is currently investigating reports of objects being thrown from the Hazell Terrace during the match against Lincoln City". The South Wales side also said that they are working with the FA and have a 'zero tolerance policy' towards such behaviour.

Three National League sides have considered an appeal to the FA on a matter which they have described as "vindictive". Sutton United, who are in a playoff spot and Bromley and Maidstone United who are several points away from reaching a playoff spot, all have 3G pitches, which are currently allowed in the National League, but not in the Football League. All three clubs have labelled the league's policy on the matter as "vindictive", as National League rules state that: "any club which wins promotion but does not install a grass surface to comply with EFL rules would subsequently be demoted to National League North or National League South, and could also be fined". This comes after part-time side Sutton re-laid their pitch last season when hosting the likes of Leeds United and Arsenal in the FA Cup - at a cost of £500,000. An appeal is not likely to take place until as late as June.

Boxing Day's round of fixtures saw several former Barnet players getting on the scoreboard. Among them was Nicky Bailey who scored in the 45th minute, the second goal for Sutton United, in their 4-0 win away to a ten man Boreham Wood. Playing for the hosts in that game were David Stephens and Tom Champion, who picked up a yellow card. Luke Coulson played 90 minutes for Ebbsfleet United as they hosted Bromley, whilst Aaron McLean remained on the bench for the side, with the side winning 2-1. Graham Stack and Gavin Hoyte featured for Eastleigh as they drew 1-1 with Torquay United. Jake Hyde picked up an injury 32 minutes into his Maidenhead United sides' 1-0 victory against Solihull Moors.

Former Swansea City and Leeds United manager Garry Monk has revealed that he was "shocked" to have been removed from his managerial position at Middlesbrough last weekend, despite a 2-1 win away at Sheffield Wednesday. Monk was released from his duties just hours after the victory and was replaced by Tony Pulis on Boxing Day. "Just hours earlier we had enjoyed what we felt was the side's best away performance of the season in our win against Sheffield Wednesday" said Monk. Boro's Academy manager Craig Little took charge of their home game against Bolton Wanderers on Tuesday, with Pulis watching from the stands. "My staff and I were surprised by the timing of the decision", said 38-year-old Monk, who took over at the Riverside club as recently as last June.

Many of the games in the third round of the FA Youth Cup have taken place. Some of the notable scores in the round so far are: Blackpool winning 1-0 away to West Ham United, Plymouth Argyle drawing 0-0 with Manchester City, with Argyle advancing on penalties, Blackburn Rovers winning 2-1 against Stoke City, a 2-2 draw between Derby County and Manchester United, with County progressing after having won on penalties, Ipswich Town winning 2-1 away to Everton and Newcastle United winning 5-0 away to Brighton and Hove Albion. Also into the fourth round of the competition are Dagenham and Redbridge, Swansea City, Fulham, Chelsea, Middlesbrough, Colchester United, Reading, Southampton, Reading, Bury, Arsenal, Aston Villa, Liverpool, Tottenham Hotspur, Sheffield United, Charlton Athletic, MK Dons, Norwich City, Stevenage, Nottingham Forest, AFC Bournemouth, Crystal Palace, Burnley, Birmingham City, Leicester City and West Bromwich Albion.



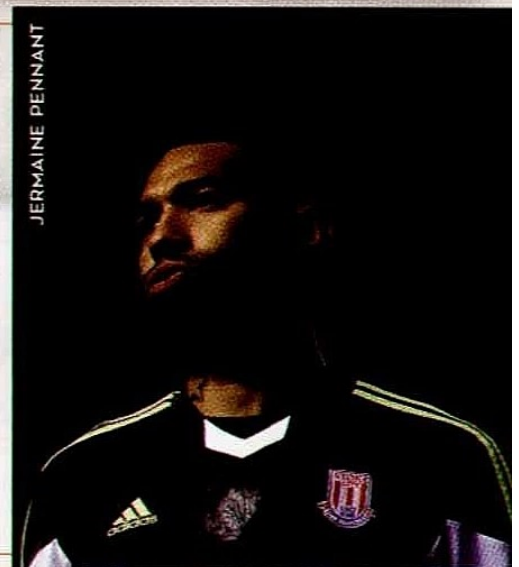

League 1 side Charlton Athletic have recalled academy product Josh Umerah from his loan at Wycombe Wanderers due to injury. The forward, who spent the second half of last season on loan at Kilmarnock, playing four times, joined the Adams Park club at the end of August, with the initial deal supposed to be running up until 15th January. However, the 20-year-old has not played for the Buckinghamshire club since mid-October due to an ankle injury. He had made 7 appearances for the Chairboys, scoring twice, after having made just 3 first team appearances for Athletic.

Despite previous claims that he will be leaving the Essex club, chairman and manager Glenn Tamplin has revealed that Jermaine Pennant will be staying with Billericay Town. Tamplin has brought in several high profile players to the Isthmian League Premier club in the last few months, with Paul Konchesky, who left last month, Pennant, Jamie O'Hara, Kevin Foley and former Bee Sam Deering.

It had been claimed that the former Arsenal, Birmingham City, and Liverpool winger would be leaving the club after just four months, due to not being able to get into the starting 11, but it has now been revealed that he will be staying, after having taken a pay cut.

The 34-year-old re-negotiated his contract in order to stay with the club. "Jermaine plays the same position as Sam Deering and that is a problem. Jermaine is a big name and I think he needed to stand out like Sam Deering does, and he didn't" said Tamplin. "I want to take this opportunity to explain how genuine and fare (SIC) Jermaine has been to enable him to stay at the club". Tamplin said on Twitter after reports emerged that he was leaving the club.

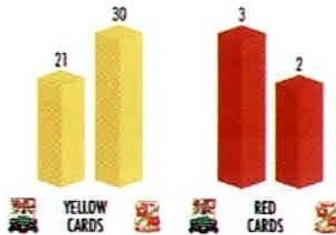

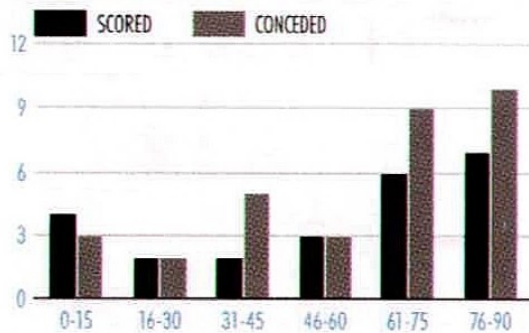

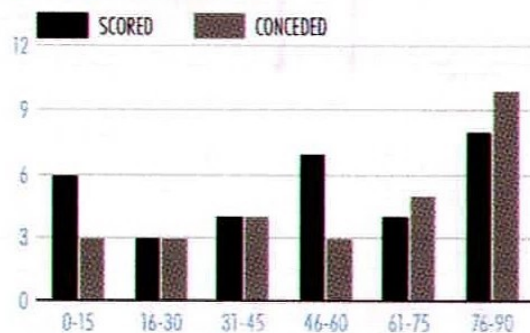

MIKE SUMMERBEE

ERNIE HUNT & MIKE SUMMERBEE

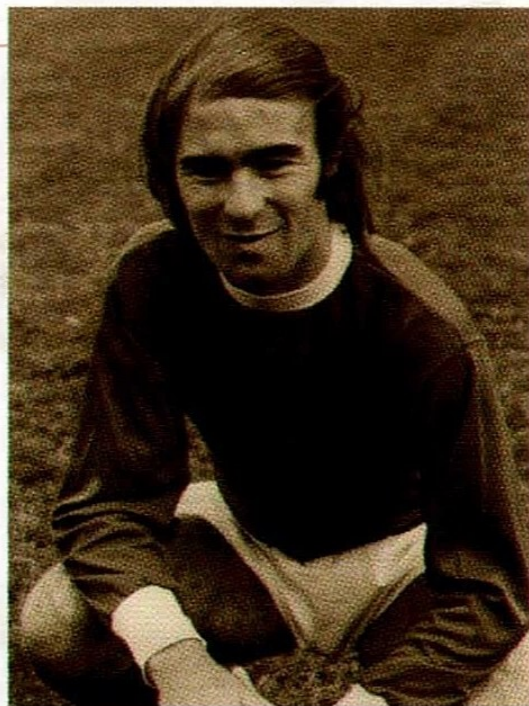
England U-23 striker Ernie Hunt was Swindon Town's leading marksman in four successive seasons including their 1962-63 promotion triumph. Born locally, he turned professional at the County Ground in March 1960 and netted 82 goals in 214 League games for Swindon prior to joining Wolves for £40,000 in September 1965. He was top scorer as they regained top-flight status in 1966-67 and moved to Everton in September 1967, then Coventry City in March 1968. Later with Doncaster and Bristol City, featuring in their 1973-74 FA Cup run, he ran the Full Pitcher pub in Ledbury, then became a window cleaner.

Brilliant winger Mike Summerbee was capped eight times by England after leaving Swindon Town. Signing professional at the County Ground in March 1960, he starred in Swindon's 1962-63 promotion success and was leading marksman in 1964-65. He netted 39 goals in 218 League games prior to joining Manchester City in August 1965, amassing a vast collection of domestic and European honours under the Joe Mercer/Malcolm Allison partnership at Maine Road. Later playing for Burnley, Blackpool and Stockport County, he became a successful businessman and his son Nicky also starred for Swindon Town.

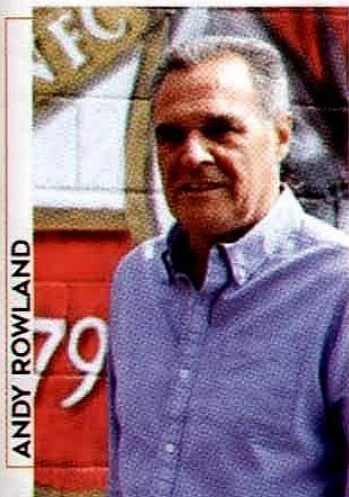
DON ROGERS & PETER NOBLE

England U-23 winger Don Rogers scored twice in Swindon Town's 1969 League Cup final success. Signing professional at the County Ground in October 1962, he featured in Swindon's 1962-63 promotion campaign and was ever-present in four successive seasons. He starred as Swindon won promotion again in 1968-69 and the Anglo-Italian Cup in 1970, reuniting with Bert Head at Crystal Palace in November 1972. Moving to QPR in September 1974, he rejoined Swindon in March 1976 and netted 148 goals in 412 League games overall for the Robins, then played for Yeovil Town. He ran his sports shop in Swindon.

Striker Peter Noble was ever-present in Swindon Town's 1968-69 promotion and League Cup 'double' triumph. Starting with Consett, he joined Newcastle United in November 1964 and moved to Swindon in January 1968. He scored their winner in the League Cup semi-final replay and netted twice in Swindon's 1970 Anglo-Italian Cup final success. Scoring 62 times in 216 League games while at the County Ground, he joined Burnley in June 1973 and was an FA Cup semi-finalist in 1973-74. He was top scorer in 1978-79, then played for Blackpool. Later running his own sports shop in Burnley for 20 years, he died in May 2017.



PETER NOBLE

ALAN MAYES & ANDY ROWLAND

ANDY ROWLAND

Fast striker Alan Mayes was leading marksman as Swindon Town reached the League Cup semi-finals in 1979-80. Initially with QPR, he joined Watford in November 1974 and helped win the Fourth Division title in 1977-78. He moved to Swindon in February 1979 and formed an exciting partnership with Andy Rowland. Sold to Chelsea for £175,000 in December 1980, he rejoined Swindon in July 1983 and was top scorer in 1983-84, netting 65 goals in 151 League games overall before joining Carlisle United in July 1985. He later played for Blackpool, Wycombe Wanderers and had a spell as Harrow Borough manager.

Former England Youth striker Andy Rowland was Swindon Town's leading marksman in two consecutive seasons. Initially with hometown Derby County, he moved to Bury for £7,000 in August 1974 and was ever-present in 1975-76. He helped them to reach the League Cup fifth round in 1977-78 and was top scorer three times, reuniting with Bobby Smith at Swindon for £80,000 in September 1978. Featuring in their 1979-80 League Cup run and 1985-86 Fourth Division title campaign, he netted 80 goals in 287 League games while at the County Ground and was later the Robins' coach, serving them for 18 years.

STEVE WHITE & DUNCAN SHEARER

Ex-England Schoolboy striker Steve White was top scorer in Swindon Town's 1986-87 promotion success. Initially with Mangotsfield United, he joined Bristol Rovers in July 1977 and moved to Luton Town in December 1979. He helped win the Second Division title in 1981-82, joining Charlton Athletic as part of the Paul Walsh deal in July 1982. Returning to Bristol Rovers in August 1983, he joined Swindon in July 1986 and starred alongside Duncan Shearer. He was a promotion winner again in 1992-93, netting 83 goals in 244 League games before moving to Hereford United in August 1994, then Cardiff City and Bath City.

Striker Duncan Shearer was capped seven times by Scotland after leaving Swindon Town. He impressed with Inverness Clachnacuddin prior to joining Chelsea in November 1983 and moved to Huddersfield Town in March 1986. Joining Swindon for £250,000 in June 1988 and twice helped them qualify for the Second Division play-offs. He was leading marksman in four successive seasons, netting 78 goals in 159 League outings before being sold to Blackburn Rovers for £750,000 in March 1992. Moving to Aberdeen in July 1992, he later played for Inverness Caledonian Thistle and was Buckie Thistle's player-manager.

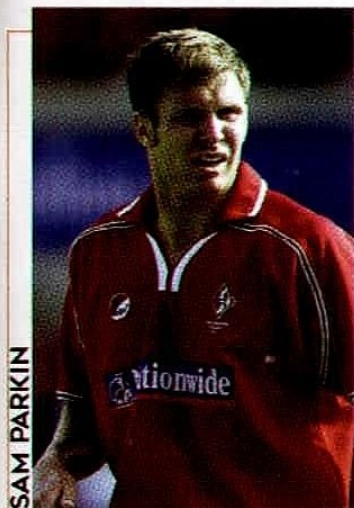


DUNCAN SHEARER

SAM PARKIN & TOMMY MOONEY

Ex-England Schoolboy striker Sam Parkin was Swindon Town's leading marksman in three successive seasons. He turned professional with Chelsea in August 1998 and moved to Swindon in August 2002, starring alongside Tommy Mooney as they qualified for the Second Division play-offs in 2003-04. Scoring 67 goals in 124 League games prior to joining Ipswich Town for £450,000 in July 2005, he moved to Luton Town for £325,000 in August 2006 and helped win the Johnstone's Paint Trophy in 2009. He joined Walsall in July 2009, then played for St Johnstone, Queen of the South, St Mirren and Exeter City.

Striker Tommy Mooney missed just one match as Swindon Town qualified for the Second Division play-offs in 2003-04. Initially with Aston Villa, he joined Scarborough in August 1990 and starred as they reached the League Cup fourth round in 1992-93. He moved to Southend United in July 1993, then Watford in March 1994. A key figure in their 1997-98 Second Division title triumph and 1998-99 First Division play-off final success, he moved via Birmingham to Swindon in July 2003. He netted 19 goals in 45 League games before joining Oxford United in July 2004, then Wycombe, Walsall and UD Marbella.

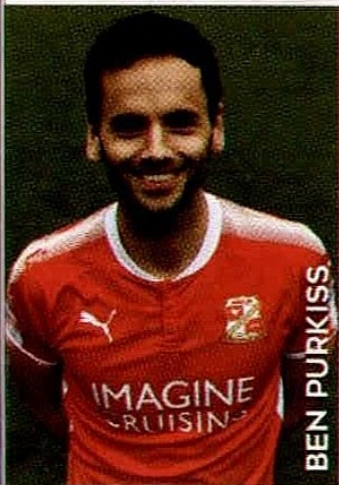
LAWRENCE VIGOUROUX (GK)

The firm fan favourite first arrived at The County Ground in August 2015 on a season-long loan deal from Premier League outfit Liverpool. He wasted little time in making the number one jersey his own and he finished his debut campaign in Wiltshire with 36 outings under his belt. However, Vigouroux really came to the fore during the 2016/17 campaign, producing a string of brilliant displays to keep twelve clean sheets, despite the Reds' relegation to the Sky Bet League Two.



MATT PRESTON

Walsall youth product Preston made 50 senior appearances for the Saddlers over three senior seasons at the Bescott Stadium. In 2014, he had a very brief loan spell at IBV in Iceland and more successful loan spell at Barwell in the Northern Premier Division. He joined Swindon in September 2017.



BEN PURKISS

33-year-old full back Purkiss joined Swindon in June 2017 from Port Vale Preston. A product of the youth academy at Sheffield United, Purkiss has also played for Gainsborough, York, Oxford, Darlington, Hereford and Walsall.



MATT TAYLOR

Veteran midfielder Matt Taylor has been capped at England Youth level and one appearance for England 'B'. He began his senior career at Luton before a move to Portsmouth in 2002 and helped Pompey into the Premier League. He would make 203 appearances before he moved from the south coast to Bolton in January 2008. He would drop down to the Championship in 2011 and help West Ham to promotion back to the top flight. A spell at Burnley began in 2014, and stayed with the Lancashire club following relegation. He would earn promotion to the Premier League for the third time in his career at Turf Moor. He joined Swindon this summer from Northampton where he had spent a season.



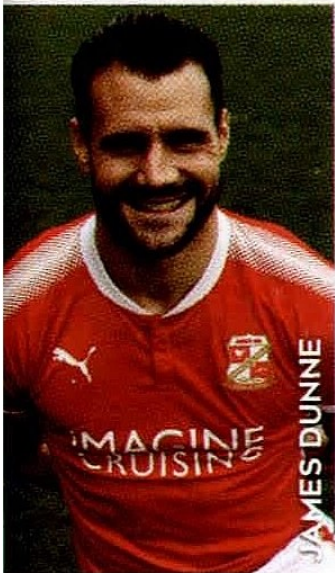
OLLY LANCASTHIRE

A free agent signing in the summer, Lancashire was quickly handed the captain's armband and he has been an ever-present in the league. The centre-back is a reliable presence at the heart of the defence.



PAUL MULLIN

The 23-year-old forward joined Swindon in the summer of 2017. He spent his youth career at both Everton and Liverpool before joining Huddersfield. A loan spell at Vauxhall Motors followed before a permanent move to Morecambe where we would make 140 appearances over three years.

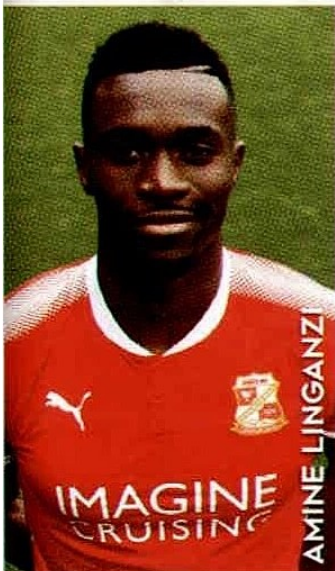


Another summer signing for the Robins, holding midfielder Dunne joined after being released by Cambridge United. His senior career started at Arsenal but he failed to make an appearance for the Gunners. A loan move to Nottingham Forest was also disappointing for the player and he joined Exeter in 2009. He'd make 127 appearances for the Grecians. He has also had time at Stevenage, Portsmouth and loan spells at St Johnston and Dagenham & Redbridge.



The 22-year-old started in non-league with Redhill, Maidstone and Tamworth. He was loaned back to Maidstone and then Stafford Ranger before being signed by Bolton for £10,000. He has made appearances for Notts County, Wigan and Forest Green. He scored twice for Forest Green in the play-off final to help Rovers earn promotion to the Football League for the first time.

Congolese midfielder Amine Linganzi's career began in the youth system at Saint-Etienne. He'd make four appearances for the French side before a move to Premier League Blackburn Rovers in 2009/10. A loan at Preston North End preceded a permanent move to Accrington Stanley in 2012. A move to the South-East with Gillingham followed before time at Frejus Saint-Raphael. He was part of Portsmouth's 2016/17 League Two winning side.



Luke Norris bolstered Town's attacking options in August 2016 after arriving from Gillingham for an undisclosed fee, putting pen to paper on a three-year deal at The County Ground. The powerful striker, who has previously plied his trade for Hitchin Town, Brentford, Boreham Wood, Northampton Town and Dagenham & Redbridge, opened his account for The Reds in November 2016 against Exeter City.

Crystal Palace loanee Keshi Anderson began his senior career with Barton Rovers, scoring 32 goals in 53 games in all competitions. He earned a trial with Brentford against Palace and scored a hat trick in 6 minutes. Palace signed him in February 2015. For the second successive season the Bees had reached the 3rd Round of the FA Cup and were rewarded with an away tie with Swindon from League One. A gritty performance at the County Ground secured a 1-1 draw and resulted in this replay under the floodlights at Underhill. Barnet were forced to make one change from the first match with their goal scorer in that game, Adam Birchall, moving up from the bench to start in place of the suspended Ashley Carew. The game was also significant because it marked the opening of the South Stand, a development that completely changed the look and feel of Underhill.

Swindon had the first real chance of the game, played in front of a crowd of 2,810, when Michael Leary was forced to clear the ball over the bar to deny Sofiane Zaaboub. But Barnet were holding their own with Jason Puncheon masterminding the Bees' attacks. He spotted Swindon 'keeper Peter Brezovan off his line and tried a 30 yard lob but that landed on top of the net. Meanwhile at the other end Bees' keeper Rob Beckwith was also being kept busy

with shots from Lee Peacock and Zaaboub. This was an end to end cup tie and it was inevitable that the deadlock would be broken and that happened in the 41st minute when Billy Paynter controlled Zaaboub's through ball on his chest before swivelling and drilling the ball past Devera and under Beckwith into the Bees' net.

The first half was breathless and that continued into the second. As early as the 46th minute

Puncheon delivered a perfect pass to Akurang, on the Swindon goal line, but he couldn't sort his feet out and Jerel Ifil cleared much to the disbelief of the Barnet fans. However, the Bees got the goal they deserved on 52 minutes. The ball fell to Neil Bishop who shanked his shot to the right wing where Puncheon picked it up, drove at the by-line, and drilled in a cross to the near post that deflected off Paynter into his own goal.

The game was now even but that only lasted 15 minutes. Leary scythed down Zaaboub, in front of referee Andy Penn who had no hesitation in showing a red card reducing the Bees to ten men. The game now changed with the Bees coming under pressure and hanging on to see the game into extra time. In that half hour the teams tired and the game lost its pace although there were some chances with Puncheon going close from a free-kick and Ismail Yakubu clearing off the line.

Now the tie came down to a penalty shoot-out.

Swindon took the first kick. Paynter stepped up and crashed the ball against the bar. Andy Thomas took the first Barnet penalty tucking the ball into the left hand corner. Christian Roberts took Swindon's second penalty and he drilled the ball past the left post, Yakubu took Barnet's second kick but he hit it wide of the right post so, after four kicks, it was 1-0 to the Bees. Hasney Aljofree took Swindon's third and after a very lengthy run up smashed the ball high into the back row of the South Stand. Joe O'Cearuill took Barnet's third kick placing the ball in the right corner to make it 2-0. This put pressure on Miguel Comminges who had to score to keep Swindon's hopes alive but his effort was well saved by Beckwith to take Barnet through to a 4th Round tie with Plymouth. Swindon set a record being the first senior English team not to score in a penalty shoot-out.

A MAN FROM THE MATCH - BILLY PAYNTER

Billy Paynter was both hero and villain in this cup tie, scoring for both teams in normal time and then missing a penalty in the shoot out. He played for Swindon for three seasons between 2007 and 2010 scoring over 50 goals, which was his most prolific period in a long career. Paynter got his breakthrough into football at League 1 Port Vale scoring over 30 goals in 158 appearances that earned him a move to Championship Hull

and then Southend before returning to League 1 with Swindon. After his success at Swindon Paynter moved back to the Championship with Leeds before joining Doncaster and was in their side that got promoted to the Championship in 2013. After a brief spell with Carlisle, Paynter joined Hartlepool in 2015. Consequently, Paynter faced Barnet twice in 2015-2016 although he failed to score in either game. In 2016-2017 Paynter was an unused substitute for Hartlepool at the Hive and was injured for the return tie in April 2017. Barnet's win in that game, at The Victoria Ground, resulted in Dave Jones being sacked as Hartlepool manager and Paynter was appointed joint caretaker manager for the last few games of the season to avoid Hartlepool's relegation to the Conference. Unfortunately, that was unsuccessful and Paynter was released.

CAR PARKING

There is a large car park at the ground which I believe is £5.00 but getting out quickly after the game will prove a problem.

A spy has told me that free parking is available in the industrial estate close to the ground. Just before the stadium down the hill, turn left. Worth checking out.



KEY PERSONNEL

Harry Kewell is the current Head Coach at Crawley. Sydney born Harry made over 300 appearances for Leeds Utd and Liverpool, where he won a Champions League title in 2005 before a spell at Galatasaray in Turkey. He also won 56 caps for Australia. He took over the reins here in May 2017.



BRIEF DIRECTIONS BY ROAD

Nice and straightforward this one! From the M25 take the M23 southbound and exit at Junction 11 (signposted A264 Horsham, Pease Pottage Services) Follow the signs for A23(N) Crawley town centre. Stay on this road for about a mile until the bottom of the hill and turn left at the roundabout and you will see the ground on your left and entrance to car park.

DIRECTIONS BY TRAIN

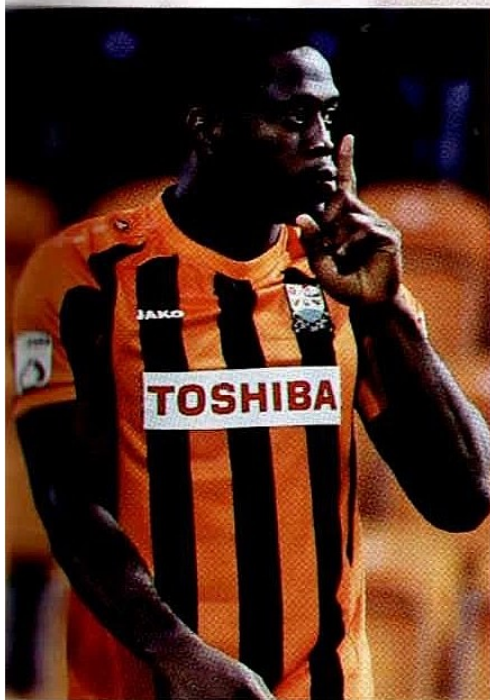
A couple of options open to you. The Crawley area is serviced by two stations. Three Bridges is a fair distance from the ground and your best bet is a 10-minute taxi ride which should cost around £6.00. Crawley Station is about a mile from the ground (calculate your own walking times please). Turn left out of the station and after 1/4 mile turn left into the Brighton Road (A2219) and cross over the railway. 3/4 further on you will see the stadium to your right, access via the underpass. The number 10 bus from opposite the station runs to the ground. By Air: Gatwick Airport is the nearest facility to the ground – flights daily.

EATING AND DRINKING LOCALLY

There is a bar at the stadium at the back of the Bruce Winfield Stand called the 'Redz Bar', which allows visiting supporters. Entrance to this bar is gained from outside the stadium. The closest pub to the stadium is the Half Moon on Brighton Road (A2219). This is about a five-minute walk. Another pub close by is The Downsman, which is on Wakehurst Drive, just off Southgate Avenue.

THE GROUND DESCRIPTION

The stadium was opened in 1997 after Crawley had spent many years at the Town Mead Ground. Both end terraces are fully covered and wrap slightly around the corners towards the main stand which is quietly impressive occupying most of the touchline. Opposite is the new East Stand, a semi-permanent structure opened in 2013. The North of KRL Terrace is reserved for away fans.



PREVIOUS MEETING & MEMORIES


Our last visit was in August 2016 when a John Akinde goal won us a point in a 1-1 draw. One outstanding visit to the Broadfield Stadium was in our promotion winning season 2004/5. Two exemplary finishes from Giuliano Grazioli were capped but a breathtaking volley by Dean Sinclair to win the game 3-1. The goal is available to view on YouTube and frankly, it is a stunning finish. Good "stack" from the Bees fans behind the goal too!

At Crawley's previous home Barnet fans sampled The Walls Of Jericho Experience in 1994 after the late Carl Hoddle's stunning Match Of the Day Goal Of the Month candidate - it should have won it. "Hoddle by name, Hoddle by nature" commented Barry Davis. The retaining wall directly behind the goal collapsed as hundreds of Bees fans celebrated. The blame has over the years fallen upon long-time supporter Robin 'The Tank' and was captured for posterity by the BBC. I hasten to add no one was seriously hurt and Tank has been very sought after in the demolition industry ever since.

CELEBRITY WATCH

Sporting heroes and villains galore for your autograph books - World champion boxer Alan Minter, gorgeous gymnast and TV presenter Suzanne Dando, gold medal-winning athletes Daley Thompson and Sally Gunnell all hail from these parts, How about a dip with swimmer Sharon Davis as well? Gareth Southgate went to school here and 1970's Barnet legend (who also played a couple of games for Chelsea) Marvin Hinton used to live here. Infamous 1940's acid bath murderer John Haigh was a season ticket holder at Crawley and The Cure used to rehearse in the social club at the old Town Mead ground between 8.00 and '10.15 Saturday Night' but that was 'Never Enough'.

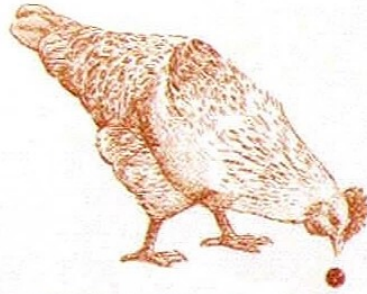
