et me kick-off these notes by extending a warm welcome to Steve Evans, his staff, players, directors and fans of Mansfield to Wiltshire for today's game.

It has been a while since we last had a game here and I've been really proud of the boys' efforts over

the last few games. We've had to navigate a tough schedule which has seen us come up against some very tough teams and the lads have given me absolutely everything. I really couldn't have asked for any more and we are all geared up and ready to go again with the business end of the season fast approaching.

Our last game here turned out to be a real thriller against Crewe Alexandra and it was a match that really showed the quality of the squad we have got at our disposal. We had to make changes at 3-1 down and sometimes they work and sometimes they don't, but the changes we made on the day

certainly did work and the secondhalf saw us put on a real front-foot performance. There was a real purpose to what we did and you can see the added quality of Marc Richards and Timi Elsnik. The most pleasing aspect for me, however, was the fact that even at 3-1 down we stayed on task and we stuck to the game-plan. It was a real spirited fightback and I was chuffed for the players and for the fans.

Transfer Deadline Day saw us add one and lose two and I want to place on record my thanks to John Goddard and James Brophy and we wish them well for the next stage of their careers. We were able to bring in Rollin Menayese from Bristol Rovers and, as you would have seen from the last couple of games, he has already settled in really well and his strength, power and mobility just gives me another option at the back.

Our busy away schedule started at Stevenage and we really had to grind the game out. It was important that we got our noses in-front early and it was always going to be a difficult encounter given their recent record at home. It was a case of everyone sticking to their task, doing their jobs and we had some top performances throughout the team. The lads ran for each other, it was a really galvanised performance and we thoroughly deserved the three points and the clean sheet.

I was left with mixed emotions following our trip to Lincoln City last weekend. It was always going to be a tough game, Lincoln's fans generate a real hostile atmosphere and I thought we did brilliantly. Sometimes it can be easy to go hiding after going a goal down and a man down so early on but we didn't, we came out fighting and we thoroughly deserved to take a lead in at the break. There was a real galvanised spirt and we handled everything that they threw at us in the second-half. It was just bitterly disappointing that we couldn't hold on in the end, there looked to be a foul on Reice Charles-Cook for their equaliser but I was immensely proud of the boys' efforts and that could prove to be a vital point come May.

It proved to be a frustrating night on what was a very cold evening at Accrington Stanley. The pitch wasn't bad



as it looked and I felt we started with a real intent and a real purpose. However, we allowed them to get into the game and we found ourselves two goals down. We did well to get back into the game but a couple of questionable decisions have really halted our momentum, but credit to Accrington because they are a very good team.

The loss hurt but I can't fault the players because they gave absolutely everything to this football club once again and there is still so much to play for.

Today is another big game and we have been much improved at home so far this year. We have worked very hard on the training ground since Tuesday to get the



Good Afternoon and welcome back to The Energy Check County Ground for today's visit of Mansfield Town. Let me start by extending a warm welcome to the Directors, Management, Players, Staff and Supporters of Mansfield to Wiltshire.





It has been a while since our last game here and, barring Tuesday night's result at Accrington Stanley, the team have been on a very good run of form in recent weeks having secured four wins and a draw from our last seven outings. This included a 4-3 win against Crewe Alexandra in our last game here and I'm sure you all left the ground feeling thoroughly entertained! It had everything and I am sure you will all agree that the boys showed great character to come back from 3-1 down to win 4-3. There is nothing better than a last-minute winner and Marc Richards certainly showed why the manager was so keen to bring him to the football club. It was also brilliant to see Timi Elsnik back in action and, after seeing his impact since his return, there is no doubt that he will be vital for us as we head into the final months of the season

Following this, we embarked on three back to back away games starting with a trip to Stevenage in the final game of January. It was a completely different game to Crewe but one where once

again the boys showed their character to secure a huge three points. Ollie Banks, who has been excellent for us since signing in January, got on the scoresheet again and the team did well to really dig in and grind out an important win. It was then a long trip to Lincoln City last Saturday where the team were met by a real hostile atmosphere at Sincil Bank, Lincoln have carried on their momentum from last season where they won promotion and they are enjoying another fine campaign, so we were all well aware that it was going to be another tough fixture. And so it proved as we found ourselves a goal down and a man down following Matt Preston's dismissal for a professional foul inside the area. However, as they have been showing week in and week out, Dave Flitcroft's side were up to the challenge and were able to take a lead in at the break thanks to goals from Marc Richards and Ollie Banks, who have both enjoyed fine starts to their Swindon careers. It was then a real solid defensive display from us in the secondhalf as we dealt with everything Lincoln had to throw at us, which made the last-gasp equaliser all the more difficult to take. But, given Lincoln's recent form and especially at home, it was a point we would have taken before the game and it is something we can build on going forward.

Tuesday saw us make the long trip for the re-arranged fixture against Accrington Stanley. Again, the

conditions were far from ideal but the game was able to go ahead, despite the freezing temperatures. However, it proved to be another frustrating night at the office with Accrington taking a 2-0 lead and, despite a Marc Richards penalty giving us a way back into the game, another sending-off made it an uphill battle and we were unable to secure an equaliser.

Before we move on to today's game, last week saw the closing of the January Transfer Window and it was a fairly quiet Deadline Day for us. We were able to bring in highly-rated centre-back, Rollin Menayese from Bristol Rovers and his pace and power will give us another option at the heart of the defence. Going in the opposite direction were Johnny Goddard and James Brophy, who sealed permanent transfers to Stevenage and Leyton Orient respectively. I would like to personally give my thanks to the pair for their services to the club and, on behalf of everyone at the football club, we would like to wish them the best of luck for the future.

On to today and we should be in for another thrilling afternoon of football with Mansfield, like us, looking for another win to close the gap on the top three. Steve Evans has recruited well this season and things seem to be finally clicking together with our opponents currently nestled inside the Play-Off places. However, we have been much improved at home so far in 2018 and long may that continue starting with a win this afternoon as we look to keep the pressure on the top three.






### HENRY HEADS OUT ON LOAN

Swindon Town Football Club can confirm that Will Henry has joined Hampton & Richmond Borough FC on loan.

The young Goalkeeper will remain with the Vanarama National League South outfit until the end of the season.

Henry, who has made ten appearances since making his debut in 2016, has gone out on loan to gain regular first-team football with Stuart Moore and Reice Charles-Cook ahead of him in the pecking order at SN1.

The 19-year-old will be available to make his Hampton & Richmond Borough debut against Whitehawk today.

### TOWN BRING IN MENAYESE

Swindon Town made just the one new signing on Transfer Deadline Day with the addition of Rollin Menayese.

The centre-back arrived from League One outfit Bristol Rovers on loan until the end of the season, and made his debut in the 2-2 draw away at Lincoln City last week.

Menayese, who is 20-years-old, will bolster Dave Flitcroft's defensive options and he will provide an aggressive and aerially dominant presence to the back-line.

The 6'3 defender was born in the Democratic Republic of the Congo but moved to South Wales with his family, where he was quickly snapped up by Cardiff City.


He captained the Bluebirds at every youth level and he was also selected as the Skipper for Wales at U16 and U17 level.

After being released by City in December 2016, Menayese joined Weston-super-Mare and started twenty-two games for the National South side.

His form caught the eye of Bristol Rovers and he signed a pre-contract agreement with the Gas in February 2017, before officially joining in the summer.

Rollin has featured in four Sky Bet League One games for Rovers this term, including starts away at Northampton Town in a 6-0 win and away at Scunthorpe United.

His impressive progress was rewarded with a new contract in January and he will now spend the remainder of the 2017/18 campaign at SN1 in a bid to gain more first-team football.



The Stags are starting to hit top form at just the right time as they look to maintain their promotion assault with the 2017/18 campaign reaching its conclusion.

Managed by Steve Evans, who is able to boast nine promotions on his CV, Mansfield have been there or thereabouts all season but they have really started to turn the style on in recent weeks to cut the gap on the top three. They have won their last three league games on the bounce and are unbeaten in their last nine outings in the Sky Bet League Two.


Mansfield have a squad packed to the brim with quality and experience and their efforts this season have been led by star forward Danny Rose, who has contributed fifteen goals to the cause so far this season. The likes of Kane Hemmings, Lee Angol and Jimmy Spencer have also chipped in with goals this term, while Peterborough United striker Ricky Miller was brought in last month to further bolster their strikeforce.

The likes of Krystian Pearce, Zander Diamond, Jacob Mellis, Paul Anderson and Alex MacDonald give Town some solid experience down the spine of their team, while a core of talented youngsters help to make a fine balance which will only help Mansfield's automatic promotion hopes during the run-in.

It was Swindon who had reason to cheer the last time these two sides met with efforts from John Goddard, Amine Linganzi and Luke Norris sealing a 3-1 success at Field Mill in October 2017.

## THE MANAGER

Nine-time promotion winner Steve Evans was unveiled as Mansfield Town's new boss in November 2016, following Adam Murray's departure.

Evans put pen-to-paper on a two-and-half-year deal at One Call Stadium and boasts an outstanding track record of nine promotions in a career spanning over two decades.

Born in Glasgow, he honed his skills as a striker with the Bolton Wanderers academy before going on to amass more than 150 appearances and over 40 goals playing for Clyde, Albion Rovers, Ayr United, Hamilton Academical and St. Johnstone.

Unfortunately, a knee ligament injury cut short his playing days and he stepped over to the other side of the white line as manager of non-league outfit Stamford, whom he led to successive United Counties League Premier Division honours.

Between 1998 and 2007, two stints at Boston United followed where he guided the Pilgrims all the way from the Southern Football League into the League Two.

Evans then took the reins of Crawley Town in 2007 and in the five seasons that followed he secured two promotions, a clubrecord points haul of 105 and a memorable FA Cup run in the 2010/11 season, before being knocked out by Premier League giants Manchester United after a 1-0 defeat at Old Trafford.

The Scottish manager then added two more promotions to his portfolio between 2012 and 2015, as he masterminded Rotherham United's path to the Championship from League Two.

He parted ways with the Millers in 2015 and was subsequently appointed Leeds United manager. The 54-year-old steered the Whites to a respectable mid-table finish and a fifth round FA Cup tie against Watford, where they bowed out after a 1-0 defeat.



### CONRAD LOGAN

Mansfield signed former Leicester City goalkeeper Conrad Logan just a few days after the conclusion of the 2016/17 season. During a 10-year spell with the Foxes after moving to England, the Irishman enjoyed a loan stint with then-League Two club Stockport County, amongst others, where he won promotion via the playoffs. County beat local rivals, and Logan's future club, Rochdale 3-2 at Wembley as the shot-stopper capped off a fine season in his first loan spell with the North West club. After leaving Leicester in 2015, the 'keeper made the switch to Hibernian for the last two months of the 2015/16 season and quickly wrote himself into the Scottish club's folklore, helping them to win the Scottish Cup.



### RHYS BENNETT

Defender Rhys Bennett enjoyed a fine first season at One Call Stadium as he completed every minute of every game in Sky Bet League Two. He capped off a superb maiden season by winning the Chad Readers' Player of the Year, the Supporters' Player of the Year and the Players' Player of the Year, Bennett has also been a regular so far this season.



### KRYSTIAN PEARCE

Krystian Pearce has amassed over 300 appearances during his career and boasts experience at this level and above. The defender began his career on the books of Birmingham City, but made his senior debut for Notts County during a loan spell at Meadow Lane in the 2007/08 campaign. He's also represented the likes of Port Vale, Scunthorpe United and Peterborough United, before joining Mansfield and he has become a vital figure at the heart of the defence for The Stags.

### ZANDER DIAMOND

Mansfield Town opted to bring Northampton Town Player of the Season Zander Diamond to One Call Stadium following the defender's decision to turn down a new contract at Sixfields.

He began his career with Scottish side Aberdeen in 2003 and spent eight years at the Pittodrie Stadium. The former Scotland under 21 international made over 200 appearances for The Dons before joining Oldham Athletic for a solitary season in 2011. He won back-to-back promotions with Burton Albion and was also part of the Northampton side that stormed to the League Two Title. He's the current Skipper of Mansfield.

### JACOB MELLIS



Mansfield added to their squad with the impressive acquisition of talented midfielder Jacob Mellis from League One side Bury. The 26-year-old began his career as a youth team scholar at Sheffield United, before joining Premier League champions Chelsea for £1m in 2007. He was a member of the Blues' youth team that reached the FA Youth Cup Final under Paul Clement in 2008. Has been a regular for Mansfield so far this term.



### WILL ATKINSON

Versatile midfielder Will Atkinson joined Mansfield Town in May 2017 after turning down the offer of a new contract at former club Southend United. The 28-year-old previously spent a month on loan at One Call Stadium in 2008, making 12 appearances in the amber and blue. Began his career with Hull and was part of the Bradford City side that reached the League Cup Final in 2011/12. Also has promotions on his CV with both Bradford and Southend.

### ADAM KING

Stags' manager Steve Evans fought off interest from several League One clubs to sign 22-year-old Adam King from Swansea City in the January transfer window. The Swans spotted King's talents when he was a teenager with boyhood heroes Hearts and swooped to buy the versatile midfielder in 2014. He has since enjoyed loan spells in League One, with Crewe Alexandra in 2015-16, scoring five goals in 26 appearances and Southend United the season after. Has also represented Scotland at U18, U19 and U21 levels.

### PAUL ANDERSON

Experienced Championship winger Paul Anderson joined boss Steve Evans' squad after leaving League One side Northampton Town at the end of the 2016/17 season. After swapping Hull City for Liverpool as a youngster, Anderson was a regular in their under 18s' side which won the 2006 FA Youth Cup and his outstanding performances earned him a spot on the first team's bench for their Champions League Round of 16 second leg against Benfica. He moved on to Swansea City and was named their Young Player of the Year, before going on to have spells with a number of EFL clubs.

### JIMMY SPENCER

Striker Jimmy Spencer joined Mansfield Town following his departure from promotion-winning Plymouth Argyle. The 25-year-old forward spent 12 years with Huddersfield Town from the age of seven and made his professional debut for League Two side Morecambe after joining the Shrimps on a season-long loan deal. He scored eight goals in 32 League appearances for the Lancashire side before returning to the Terriers, where he signed a new two-year contract. Spencer fired Plymouth to promotion last season and he will be hoping to do the same with Mansfield this term.

### **DANNY ROSE**

The Stags fought off competition from League One clubs to capture Bury frontman Danny Rose in May 2016. Rose's committed displays in his first season at One Call Stadium has led him to become a firm fans' favourite, regularly putting his body on the line against physical centre-halves and always providing a goal threat. ### CAMERON BELFORD

The elder of the goalkeeper siblings, Cameron joined Mansfield at the beginning of 2014/15, being allocated squad number 23. But he signed for Northern Premier League Rushall Olympic before making a first team appearance for the Stags. And before the season was out he had come to Swindon. On the final day, he was called into action from the bench when brother Ty was red-carded - saving a penalty with his first touch! He signed for Forest Green last month.




A Yorkshireman, Ted arrived at Swindon from Birmingham in May 1931. After a couple of appearances at left-back, he took over from Harold Stansfield on the other flank in the October. 
### **KEVIN HORLOCK**

Signed in July 1991 on a free transfer from West Ham, the Hammers had to pay £300,000 to get Kevin back in 2003 ! He played as an orthodox left-back in his early days with Town, but he was soon handed a central midfield role and made almost forty Premiership appearances there. By 1995/96 Kevin had added goals to his game, netting 16 as Swindon lifted the Second Division title. He made five appearances as a substitute for Mansfield towards the end of 2007/08. ### KEN MELLOR

Ken joined the Stags from his home-town club Leicester in July 1957, playing regularly in the final season of the Third North. After helping them avoid the drop to the Fourth in 1959, Ken came south to Swindon - where he was preferred at centre-half to veteran 'Garth' Hudson. But after losing his place in December, Ken was given another chance in April - replacing the injured 'Bronco' Layne at centre-forward! Ken hit three goals in seven games. STFC 32 apps / MTFC 71





### MIKE GRAHAM

After making 18 top flight appearances during four years with Bolton, Mike signed for Swindon in July 1981. He made maximum appearances for Town in 1982/83 but looked set to leave in 1984, until the appointment of Lou Macari persuaded him to stay. But Mike went a year later - to Field Mill a few weeks after Colin Calderwood had made the same move south. Mike helped Mansfield to finish three places behind Town in the race for the Fourth Division title. STFC 163 apps / MTFC 168



### DAVE SYRETT

Dave joined the pro ranks at the County Ground in November 1973 after first signing shortly before his 16th birthday. Following a loan spell at Wolves, he netted 15 goals for Town in both 1975/76 and 1976/77. Dave then joined the Stags and was top scorer in his first season there with 16 goals - but he could not save them from relegation from the old Second Division. He sadly passed away in July 2016, aged just 60. STFC 135 apps / MTFC 79



### IFFY ONUORA

Clasgow-born, Iffy spent the first five years of his pro career at Huddersfield before joining Mansfield in the summer of 1994. He started only 17 games in two seasons at Field Mill. His only full season with Swindon -1998/99 - was a prolific one as he netted 20 goals despite playing in a struggling side. Swindon, rapidly heading for administration, were forced to sell Iffy early in 2000. He returned to the County Ground in 2004, being manager for 40 games from September 2005. ### RAY CLARKE

A former Tottenham reserve, Ray netted just twice in his one season at the County Ground, in 1973/74. His first was in the first Sunday fixture played by Town - against Bolton - and the other brought a rare victory that season, at Hull on Easter Monday. He moved to Fourth Division Mansfield in the summer, hitting thirty goals as the Stags lifted the title - and followed that with 29 in 1975/76 when they did the 'double' over Swindon, Ray scoring in both games. ### **EDDIE MUNNINGS**

Winger Eddie had only played in his native Lincolnshire prior to signing for Swindon in June 1930. He scored in a 4-1 win over Queens Park Rangers on his debut but added only two more before switching to Hull City in the following summer. Eddie then made a surprise move back to the County Ground in 1932 and netted 11 goals. He moved to Mansfield in 1933 and then, a year later, returned to his hometown club Boston - having left there in 1927. STFC 48 apps / MTFC 32



### STEVE PEPLOW

Signed by Fred Ford in May 1970 on a season long loan from Liverpool, Steve had to wait ten months before being given a League outing. The move became permanent when the loan expired, but he still spent most of the season in the reserves. Steve finally hit form in 1972/73, netting seven in 23 starts, before being dropped by new boss Les Allen. Dave Mackay took him to Forest In the following summer, but by December he found himself at Field Mill, where he grabbed three goals in a four-game loan spell. STFC 45 apps / MTFC 4



HARRY MARTIN - seen here in 1954 - was part of the backroom staff at the County Ground for twenty years. During his playing days he had made over 400 League appearances plus one for England in 1914.

If there is one trait you can take from the last few games then it is the fighting spirit we have shown and that will be key to our promotion chances, won't it?



We have taken on board the feedback from the previous planning application notice and the third public consultation and we believe this amended plan has taken into consideration the points raised at these meetings.


