## **GOOD AFTERNOON AND WELCOME TO THIS AFTERNOON'S SKY BET LEAGUE TWO MATCH WITH SWINDON TOWN.**

I would like to welcome everyone connected with the Wiltshire club, including manager Phil Brown, his players, staff, and all of the Swindon supporters as they make the trip to Devon.

Deadlines dictate that I am writing these notes before our trip to Port Vale on Tuesday, but a great deal has happened since we last met Swindon back in August in what was our second league match of the season. I recall then saying that I thought Swindon would be challenging for promotion come the latter stages of the campaign, and it seems indeed that is the case as we meet in an important clash at St James Park.

Those who can remember our last meeting will know that we went ahead at the County Ground through Liam McAlinden, before we were pegged back in the second-half when the hosts levelled through Kaiyne Woolery as the points were shared. It was a very even match and I expect a similarly tough test this afternoon. Swindon are now under the management of the experienced Phil Brown, who took on the role earlier this month, and I am sure he will be keen

to continue his strong start to life with the Robins after they recorded an impressive 3-1 win away from home against Cambridge United last time out.

Recent matches for us have seen us put in some good performances without managing to collect maximum points from our games. We welcomed Yeovil Town to St James Park in our last home match and, despite us creating a host of chances, were held to a goalless draw. We then made the trip north to Morecambe where we were disappointed to have lost the game having gone ahead from a composed finish by Pierce Sweeney. We created a number of good chances throughout the match, but as I said at the Globe Arena following the final whistle, we struggled to keep our efforts on target and we needed to be more clinical. Something of which we are keen to rectify today.

We have a number of opportunities to put that result right, none more so than today where we come up against a Swindon side who we are level on points with, before we make the trip to Port Vale on Tuesday night. Finally, I must thank those of you who made the long trip to Morecambe last weekend, as well as those of you who continue to get behind us at St James Park.

## FERACE - A HISTORY

If you've never visited the Famous Exeter City Real Ale and Cider Emporium on a matchday, you'll find it tucked around the corner in the centre spot. Over the next few programme issues, we will be serialising the history of this great little bar, writes Martin Ellicott.

A long time ago the people at Princesshay donated a space in the soon to be demolished version of Princesshay, in Bedford Square, for the Trust to open a shop for fundraising. In this shop, myself and Alan Gover built a counter.

At the same time, we'd noticed that the bar in the new spot was ridiculously over crowded on a matchday, and the design of it left an awful lot to be desired. When we realised the shop was so close we decided to chop up a section of that shop counter, put it on wheels and serve bottles from a corner of the bar area, to take pressure off the main bar. Bottle Bar v1 was born and was an instant hit, though sales straight away concentrated around bottled ale and cider despite smaller size lager bottles being also available.

It was a huge success, and we couldn't pass the bottles out fast enough. Around this time the first paid bar person got involved, Steve Baker, with Neil Le Milliere offering his help whenever it was busy but on an unofficial and unpaid basis – the odd free beer became the standard pay of our volunteer barmen.

We will have the next instalment in the Cheltenham Town programme on Monday, April 2.

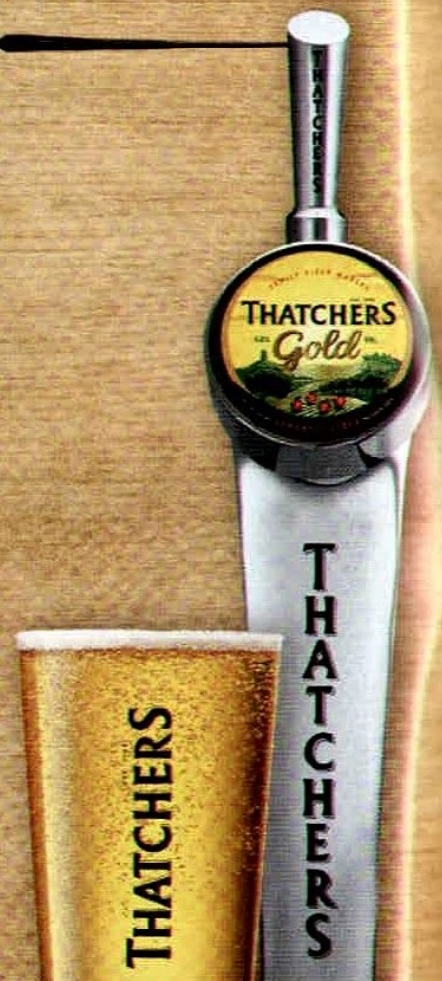



One hundred years ago, on the 25th March 1918, during the final year of the First World War, footballer Walter Tull was killed in action at the age of just 29.

Before the outbreak of war in 1914, Tull's playing career had seen him make more than 100 senior appearances for Northampton Town, before becoming the first infantry officer of black heritage in the British Army to lead his men into battle. From the football pitch to pitch battle, he made history and was an inspiration to others.

To mark the centenary of Walter Tull's death, the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government and Big Ideas in conjunction with the EFL, Football Association and Premier League's Football Remembers initiative invite schools, football teams and youth, arts and voluntary groups to celebrate his life and achievements through Tull 100 – Football Remembers.

## SINCE BREAKING HIS LEG AGAINST BLACKPOOL ON FEBRUARY 25, 2017, IT HAS BEEN A LONG AND PAINFUL ROAD TO RECOVERY FOR ROBBIE SIMPSON.

The popular striker first looked like he might be making a comeback in August when he appeared as a late substitute in City's 4-3 victory away at Cheltenham Town.

However, a set-back put him on a treatment course to heal a bone growth that was digging into his achilles. Thankfully now though, Robbie is back! He has featured in three games recently – including a memorable win against Crewe Alexandra – and is hoping to play his part in City's end of season promotion push.

SIMON LARKINS caught up with Robbie, before Tuesday's match with Port Vale, to chat about his injury, the support he has received from everyone at Exeter and how he views the promotion race with 10 games to go.

**THE GRECIAN:** Hello, Robbie you have made three appearances on your comeback from a broken leg. How are you feeling?

**ROBBIE:** I am feeling good. I don't think I have missed a training session now for nearly two months. So I am feeling good and it was nice to get some minutes in those games and they were a few special minutes in that game against Crewe Alexandra, which was good to be part of. I just hope to get some more minutes now whenever Tis calls upon me.

**THE GRECIAN:** You broke your leg last February and initially it looked like you might get back at the end of August, with you making an appearance in the latter stages of our win against Cheltenham. What stalled your progress then?

**ROBBIE:** I had a bit of bone growth in my heel and it was digging into my achilles. I have been told it is quite common when you have an ankle injury as severe as I had. It is because you don't quite have the same shock absorption and spring and mobility in your ankle, so your ankle sometimes tries to compensate for that by growing a bit of extra bone to compensate for the load. My bone decided to grow in a very awkward place and dig into my achilles so it was causing me extreme pain. I couldn't walk one day. I think it was after the Newport County match. I was on the bench that day and driving home I had to get out of my car and I collapsed. So I phoned up straight away and said that I might need to go to hospital. I saw the surgeon again, a few times actually, and debated whether to have more surgery. I decided not to and try to go through a course of treatment. It was quite a slow build up process again though, which was very frustrating having come back from the initial injury. However, touch wood, it is now all cleared up and it is good to go.

**THE GRECIAN:** Was that one of the most difficult points for you over the last 12 months when you realized you might have to have surgery again?

**ROBBIE:** Yes, because it is kind of rollercoaster really. You think you are back and you are on a high. I came on against Cheltenham earlier in the season in what was a good win and then in the next game I felt my achilles and there is nothing I could do about it. So, yes it was really, really frustrating. I got quite low, especially when there was talk of more surgery which would have kept me out for the best part of another year. It was good that I avoided that and hopefully the injury is behind me now and I can kick on and contribute some more in the upcoming games.

**THE GRECIAN:** How difficult has the road back to full fitness been in general. Have you been out for a lot longer than you initially thought you would?

**ROBBIE:** Well from the initial injury I actually came back a lot quicker than expected. The surgeon originally said it could take the best part of a year and I was back training and playing within five months. So, in that respect, the injury recovered really quickly and, obviously, with the set back that I had it was just a matter of time.

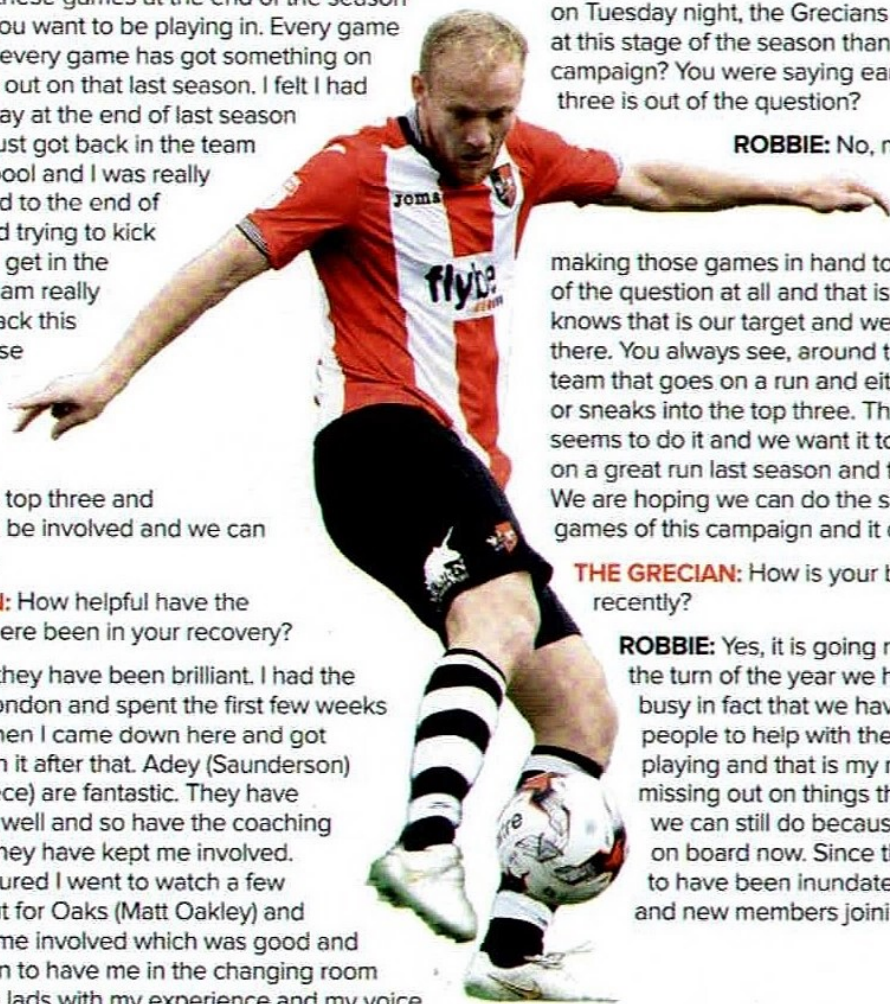

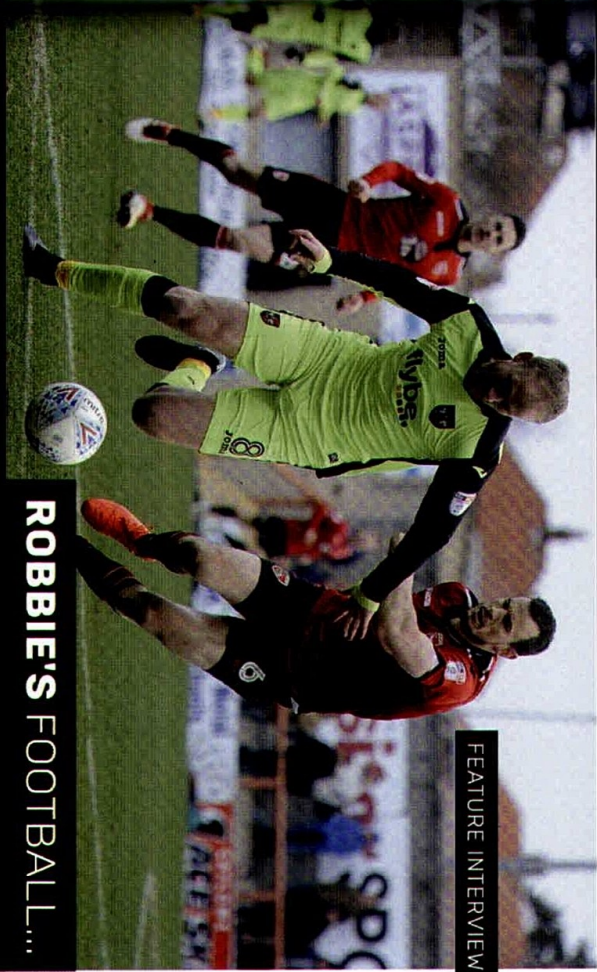

## ROBBIE'S FOOTBALL...

### FIRST...

**...senior appearance?** In the Football League it was for Coventry away at Cardiff. I think it was Niran Park back then, because it was a long time ago. That was my first appearance in the league and it was in the Championship, but my first senior appearance was in non-league for Cambridge City. I can't remember where it was but I managed to score.

**...goal?** Non-league it was on my debut for Cambridge City but my senior debut for Coventry wasn't actually against Cardiff it was in a cup match against Notts County and I scored that game as well. One I slotted home from five yards with my left foot and the one for Cambridge City was a header from the edge of the box that looped over the keeper. Nothing special.

**...time you met Tis?** The first time I met Tis was when he selected me for the England Universities side. We trained down at Lilleshall. I remember thinking he was very chilled for a manager because I had been used to managers in the non-league because I was playing for Cambridge City. The managers in non-league are very different to Tis, they are very old school.

### BEST...

**...goal you've scored?** The best goal I have scored would be the one at Anfield in the FA Cup against Liverpool. I don't like to talk about it, but Dean Furnham slid one through the lines to me from midfield and I have had a terrible touch out of my feet but it sat up nicely and I have just swung my left foot at the volley and it went in.

**...player you've played with?** He is a good friend of mine so I have got to say him and I am going to get sick from him for it and the rest of the lads, but Scott Dann.

**...piece of footballing advice you've been given?** It was when I got released as a youngster from Norwich and the manager told me 'this isn't the end for you'. I wanted to kill him because he had just released me but I think he could see that I was quite resilient and that I had something about me to bounce back by dropping down to non-league. So the advice really, is to just never give up.

### WORST...

**...defeat you've been involved in?** I think when I was at Coventry we got beat 4-0 down at Plymouth. That was a bad game, a really bad one. And another one I can think of is Charlton away. We needed a draw to stay up and we were 3-0 down at half-time and ended up losing 4-0. We ended up staying up though and we were celebrating at the end and clapping the fans, but they were booing us.

**...decision that has been given against you?** I got sent off at Yeovil one year when I went in on the keeper, but the ball was there to be won. I had done the exact same challenge a minute before as well and the referee hadn't given anything, not even a foul.

**...celebration you have seen or done?** I knew this was coming, I don't know whether you have seen it but I scored against Sheffield Wednesday for Coventry and I went to do a knee slide and my knees got stuck in the turf and I fell flat on my face.

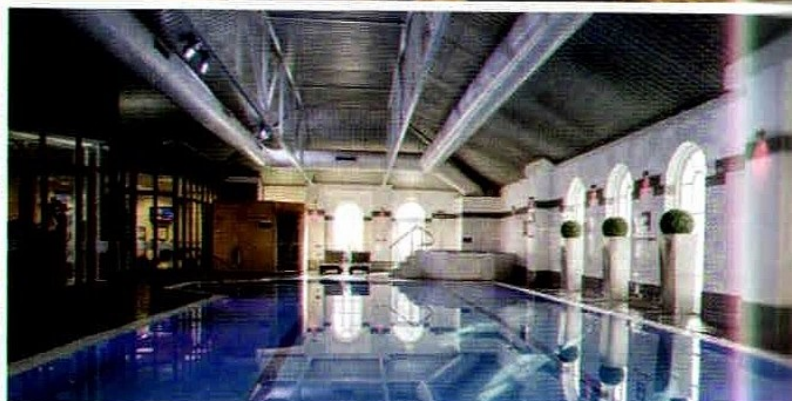

# TONY MORRIS

Tony Morris was born in Heavitree and educated at Ladysmith, Whipton Infants, Summerway, Pinhoe Primary and Exeter School. He became a regular Big Banker in 1955. Though exiled since 1963 as a writer for numerous publications (Racing Journalist of the Year in 1990), he is still City-mad. Proud father and grandfather of staunch City fans. Here are his latest thoughts ON football and the Grecians.



**MOST CLUBS HAVE THEIR UPS AND DOWNS OVER THE YEARS, AND OUR VISITORS TODAY HAVE CONFORMED TO THAT GENERAL RULE, PROVIDING THEIR SUPPORTERS WITH MOMENTS OF AGONY AND ECSTASY, ALONG WITH A SUBSTANTIAL QUOTA OF MEDIOCRITY.**

When I started to follow football at City's level, the worst team around was Walsall, rock bottom of our division for three seasons in a row. In those days the worst clubs had to apply for re-election to the Football League at the end of the season, their fate decided by the other members of the division, and Walsall survived every time.

In the 1954/55 season they were able to celebrate their third re-election by climbing from 24th place to 23rd, relegating Colchester United to the foot of the table. In the campaign after that, when I began to take my autograph book along to matches at the Park, there were new whipping boys in Division Three South – none other than Swindon Town. They were four points adrift of Crystal Palace at the bottom.

Ted Buckle scored the only goal of the game to give us victory in our encounter at St James Park in October 1955, but we had a much livelier meeting at Swindon a year later, when we won 5-3, all the goals being scored in the first half.

The Robins were founder-members of Division Three along with City, beginning with a 9-1 rout of Luton Town on the opening day of the 1920/21 season. After 98 years that remains their biggest league win, but we can hardly say it's been downhill ever since.

In the 1968/69 campaign they not only clinched promotion from Division Three, also creating one of football's greatest shocks, defeating Arsenal 3-1 to lift the League Cup at Wembley. Don Rogers, with a double on the day, was suddenly a folk hero.

Swindon again achieved the unlikely in 1992/93 when a play-off victory in what we then called Division One took them into the Premier League. If it came as no surprise that their only season at the elite level resulted in bottom place while conceding 100 goals, but it had been a tremendous feat to get there, beyond the wildest dreams of their keenest supporters.

Now the Robins are rivals with City in the quest for promotion from the bottom tier, and they come to St James Park in fine form. It's time for our lads to invoke the spirit of 1989/90, when our last nine games produced seven wins and two draws. It's clear we need something similar now.

**EXETER CITY'S UNDER-18s SUFFERED THEIR FIRST LOSS OF THIS SEASON'S MERIT LEAGUE WITH A 3-1 HOME DEFEAT TO AFC BOURNEMOUTH LAST SATURDAY.**

In what was a close affair, City started solidly and created a couple of decent chances during a competitive first-half. James Dodd and Lucas White were both looking to break the deadlock for Dan Green's men but the opening goal came from another source.

After 35 minutes, a well-worked corner saw the ball fall kindly for Jack Sparkes inside the penalty area. The forward sent a half-volley past the Cherries' goalkeeper to make it 1-0.

Exeter's youngsters took that one-goal advantage into half-time but a slow start to the second period from the home side allowed the south coast club to mount a comeback.

On 60 minutes, a counter-attack from the away team led to a nice pass slid in to an advanced Bournemouth player and the striker coolly took his one-on-one opportunity to level the scores.

The turnaround was completed 10 minutes later when a failed clearance from the Grecians resulted in the ball breaking nicely for their opponents. The visitors punished the mistake by burying the chance to lead 2-1.

On 73 minutes the Cherries wrapped the game up. One long ball from the Dorset side wasn't dealt with, resulting in Bournemouth taking their chance and making it 3-1.

Despite tactical changes and substitutions, the away side held on to inflict a defeat on Exeter's under-18s for the first time since early February.

Following the match, coach Dan Green said: "It was a close affair, and in the first half in particular, we gave a really good account of ourselves.

"Here the biggest thing we could learn is that against good players it only takes one lapse in concentration and you can get punished. We have hard working, dedicated players in the squad that will learn from this. The pressure of knowing our mistakes will be punished is a good thing, it gives us the opportunity to learn and develop whilst being tested, this is where improvement and growth takes place."

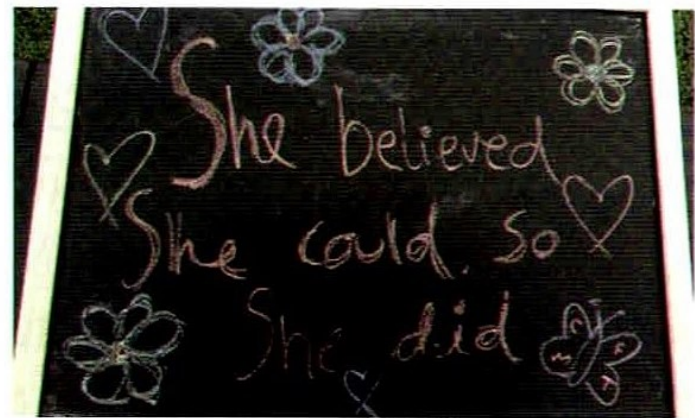

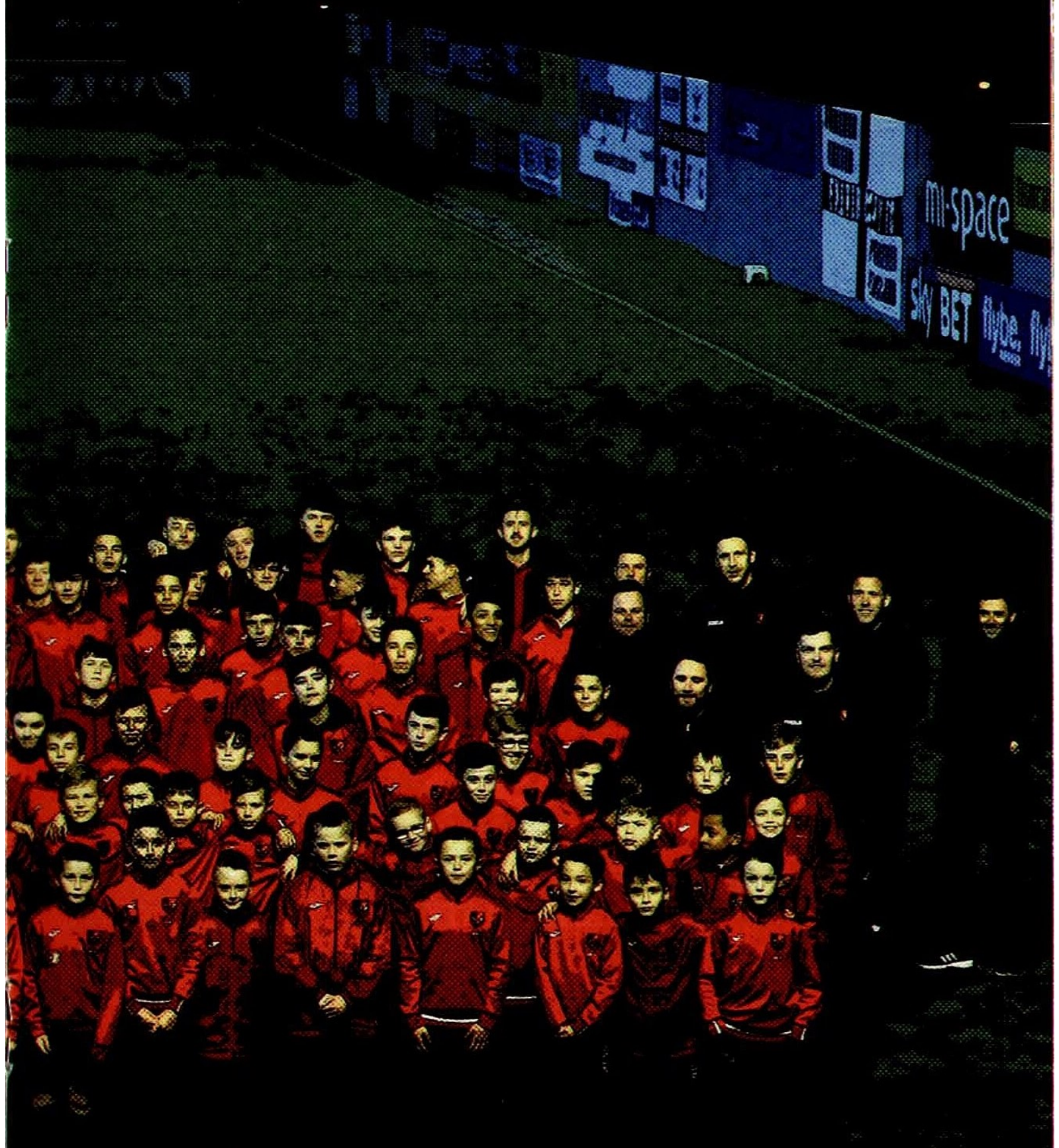

# FIRST, BEST AND WORST

## ...with **Richard Logan**

**R**ichard Logan spent five years at St James Park having joined from Weymouth in 2007. He went on to score 48 goals for the club as he turned himself into a fans favourite at City in a career which began with Ipswich Town. Following his departure from Ipswich he went on to represent the likes of Boston United, Peterborough United, Shrewsbury Town and Lincoln City before he was signed by Paul Tisdale when the Grecians were playing Conference football. Richard went on to help the club to back-to-back promotions before he departed in 2012 for Wycombe Wanderers.

SIMON LARKINS caught up with the former Grecian to discuss some of his Exeter City first, best and worst moments...



## FIRST...

### SENIOR APPEARANCE?

My first senior appearance was against Wolverhampton Wanderers. That was when I was at Ipswich Town when I was 16. George Burley was the manager and I remember getting called into the squad. When I got told I was on the

bench I was obviously very happy, but also a bit scared and nervous. I only came on for the last five minutes of the match but it was a game that was on Sky Sports and I had a couple of touches that weren't too bad, but to make your debut at that age it was a special moment. It was a great atmosphere at Wolves away. They had a big crowd there and it was an amazing feeling.







## Days at Exeter?

I joined Exeter City from Weymouth but I can't remember my first appearance (a 1-0 win over Woking) for the club because I was there so long. There was myself, Steve Tully and Lee Elam who all moved across from Weymouth. Steve and Lee went over first from Weymouth and I said to them 'any chance of getting me over there' and they said 'yes, come over for a week's training' and then I signed until the end of the season. So, I have to thank Tully and Lee because they are the ones who got me over there and Paul (Tisdale) gave me a chance. It was good to have the familiar faces in the dressing room that I recognised and in the second half of the season we did really well. Obviously, we lost in the play-off final to Morecambe that season. That was a bit gutting, but after we lost that final Paul called me the next day and told me they weren't going to keep me. I tried to beg and plead. I said I didn't care about the wages and in the end he came up with something and I stayed. That was good that I did because we did very well over the next couple of seasons. We got promoted back to back, which was great.

## Goal for Exeter?

I don't really remember many of my goals for Exeter. I do remember one I got against Morecambe in the first few weeks I was there, though, as it was a screamer. I remember going to celebrate with Jamie Mackie because I felt he should have been in the team and when I scored a run over to him.

# BEST...

## Goal for City?

The goal against Morecambe was probably the best technically, but the one that meant the most to me was the header against Torquay United in the play-off semi-final at Plainmoor. The scores had been levelled up until then, and Wayne (Wayne Carlisle) cut back onto his left foot and delivered a great cross and I did what I normally do and got my head on it and it was great with all the fans there. You know playing with Wayne what he is going to do. He used to take one touch and then just whip it in, so you have got to be in there. It was good for me because I was good at heading so I knew what was coming. I knew what he was going to do because we were on the same wavelength. In that match, we had to be strong mentally, after going behind. I think they (Torquay) thought they had won the tie when they scored the first goal, so to get that goal and to get to Wembley was the best goal for me. It is the one I enjoyed the most. We had a lot of good players in that team with the likes of Ryan Harley and Rob Edwards. That run Rob did for our first goal – Ryan's goal – he ran through about four players. When we scored that goal I think we had the belief that we could just keep going. They looked like they were tiring and we just kept playing, kept passing the ball and we got our rewards from it.





## Player you've played with?

When I was younger, I didn't play a lot of games with him, but it would have been Kieron Dyer. Later on in my career, though, it would be Stanno (Adam Stansfield). His work ethic, was brilliant. He used to give everything. At Exeter, I learnt that you have got to work hard and Stanno was where I got that from. He was one of those players who would always give 110 per cent. He would go above and beyond. He'd be doing some of my running for me. I always look at someone like Stanno when I think of the good players I played with. He was a good friend of mine and I really looked up to him. If it wasn't for him, I probably wouldn't have had the years that I did at Exeter. He prolonged me staying there as well. The Exeter City fans really appreciated him for that work ethic as well. He was one of those players that didn't care about the wages he got. If you only paid him £1, he would do the same thing. He would just run, and run and give everything. They will never forget him for that and neither will I.

## Piece of advice you've been given?

When I was at Exeter, I wasn't lazy but I wasn't working hard enough. I was just going through the motions. Paul (Tisdale) got hold of me and said, always keep on the move. I realized that I had to keep on the move even if it doesn't happen just don't stop. I think Paul is probably one of the best coaches I worked under. I worked under George Burley and Joe Royle at Ipswich but I think Paul should manage at a higher level as the years go on because the detail he puts into the sessions on the other teams was brilliant. He would know everything about the opposition and we would always have a game plan. His training was immense as well, with keep ball sessions and two v twos. All the possession stuff he used to do. He is the real deal. I think if he wants to move, he could definitely manage at a higher level. He is, without doubt, one of the best managers I have worked with.



# WORST...

## Decision given against you?

I got a booking at Wycombe thanks to Cheggars (Exeter City photographer, Keith Stone). Cheggars told me to come over to him if I scored, but when I went over to him he pulled me into the crowd and I got a yellow card for it. He owes me a few beers for that as well because the fine came out of my wages, I didn't have much left that month. In fairness, he did apologise and offer to pay my fine but I said don't worry about it. We still stay in contact and have a little bit of banter about it. Other than that, I can't remember too many decisions. I was a bit of a hustle and bustle player. You just get on with it as a big centre forward, you realise you are going to get knocks.

## Defeat?

I would say the Morecambe game when we lost in the play-off final at Wembley. I really thought we were going to go up that season and all my family were there. They all think you are going to win as well and all your best mates have come to watch. So to lose that, it hurt a little bit. We were all gutted as a team after that and to get back on the coach on the way back you know the season is done and you haven't made it and you have got to go again next season. That was a tough loss for us. However, we had to pick ourselves up and I think it fired us up for the following season when of course we did go up.

## Half-time rollicking you have had?

That was against Curzon Ashton in the FA Cup. I struggled in that game against their left back. He just bullied me and I couldn't get past him. I think going into the match I thought it was going to be an easy game and at half-time we were 3-0 down. Paul (Tisdale) gave me absolute pelters and I got subbed at half-time. That was probably the worst I have ever had from Paul at half-time. I was never that lazy again, thinking that it was going to be easy going away to Curzon Ashton on a cold Saturday afternoon. Paul is not known for his half-time rollickings. He is usually quite calm. He usually just talks and pulls you to one side and tells you what you can do better. So that was the first time I have really seen him go crazy at me. I wasn't used to that so I knew I must have been having a shocker. It maybe happened a few more times but that is the one I remember the most. I still talk to the lads about it now, Curzon Ashton away.

Sitting three places below the Grecians in ninth, Swindon Town currently have their eyes set on a play-off berth. Although results in recent weeks have not always gone their way, bearing in mind some recent off-field troubles, the squad have held together remarkably well.

Having experienced a loss and a draw at the start of February, the Robins fought back well against play-off rivals Mansfield Town, dispatching the Stags courtesy

of a brilliant strike from veteran midfielder, Matty Taylor. Although they suffered a 3-2 defeat the following week to high-flying Wycombe Wanderers, showing a determination that characterises this Swindon side, they fought back the next week, beating Port Vale by the same score line.

Having rounded off the month with a tight-fought reverse against Chesterfield, the Robins were rocked by the sudden departure of manager David Flitcroft, who opted to join Mansfield. This was reflected in the following week's result, a 3-0 defeat at home to Cheltenham Town. Despite this, the recent appointment of Phil Brown appears to have steadied the ship, with the Robins running out convincing winners away at Cambridge United. Having led 1-0 at the break, through a Luke Norris header, the in-form Mark Richards quickly doubled their lead. Although the U's pulled one back, Richards hammered home once again, slotting a signature penalty to secure a 3-1 victory.

Having spent the next six seasons as Sam Allardyce's assistant, he opted to strike out on his own, stepping into Derby County's hot-seat in 2005. It was with Hull City that he made his name, though, taking the Tigers into the Premier League for the first time in their 104-year history. ### Phil Brown on...

He left Kenilworth Road in 2002, joining Harry Redknapp's Portsmouth, where he won the Championship the following season. He would go on to spend the next nine seasons in the top flight before joining West Ham United in 2011. It was not long, however, before he was back in the big time, winning the Championship play-offs with the Hammers at the end of his first year. Since leaving Upton Park in 2013, he has enjoyed spells with Burnley, with whom he won the Championship again, and Northampton town. Having signed for Swindon during the summer, he has been in inspired form, netting five goals and providing an astonishing 14 assists.

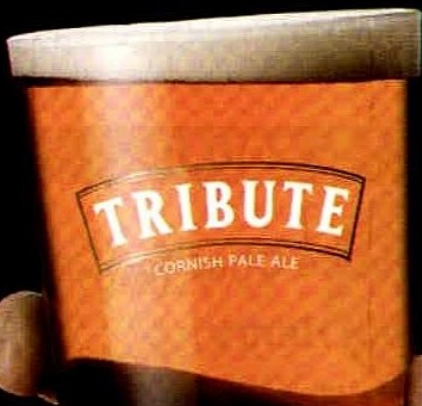

# THEY'VE PLAYED FOR BOTH:



## THE FOOTBALLERS WHO TURNED OUT FOR CITY AND SWINDON TOWN

**AHEAD OF TODAY'S GAME AT ST JAMES PARK, WE'VE DECIDED TO TAKE A LOOK AT FIVE FAMOUS FACES TO HAVE PLAYED FOR BOTH THE GRECIANS AND THE ROBINS.**

Midfielder **Martin Ling** came through the ranks with Exeter City as an apprentice and made his league debut aged 16. Ling went on to make 117 appearances for the club over a three-year period, scoring 14 goals during that time, before leaving for the Robins in a deal worth £25,000 in 1986. The midfielder's first spell with Swindon was brief, making just two appearances before leaving for Southend the same year. However, Ling would return to the Robins in 1991 and was part of the promotion winning side to the Premier League in 1993. He played 150 league matches for Swindon, scoring 10 goals and also had a brief spell managing the club in 2015, before resigning due to health reasons.

**Jamie Cureton** spent one season with the Robins during the 2005/06 campaign, scoring seven times in 30 appearances before signing for Colchester United. Cureton also enjoyed two spells with the Grecians, either side of his time with Leyton Orient. The striker scored 17 times in 41 games during the 2010/11 season and found the back of the net on 21 occasions in 40 appearances in the 2012/13 campaign.

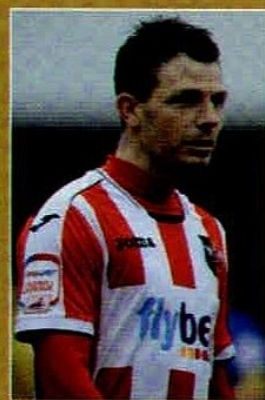
Towering defender **Kevin Amankwaah** spent five seasons with the Robins after joining from Swansea City in 2006. Amankwaah made 89 appearances during that time, chipping in with five goals. The defender was released by the club in 2011 and had brief spells with Burton Albion and Rochdale, before making the move to St James Park in the summer of 2012. However, Amankwaah was released at the end of the 2012/13 season, after making 34 appearances for the club.

Striker **Sam Parkin** made the move from Chelsea to Swindon in 2002, and quickly became a fans favourite after scoring a hat-trick on his debut against Barnsley. Parkin spent three years with the Robins scoring 67 goals in 124 appearances. The forward enjoyed spells in Scotland towards the end of his career with St Johnstone, Queen of the South and St Mirren before making the move to Exeter in 2013. Parkin also scored on his debut for the Grecians, in a 2-1 win over Bristol Rovers but the forward was released at the end of the season after making 29 appearances.

Welsh born forward **Christian Roberts** joined the Grecians from boyhood club Cardiff in 2000, spending two years at St James Park. Roberts impressed during his time in Devon, where he made 87 appearances for the club, scoring 18 times, before leaving for Bristol City in 2002. The forward joined Swindon in 2004 and spent four years at the County Ground making over 100 appearances, before a serious knee injury hampered his playing career.

# BACK TO THE FUTURE

## 1962/63 PROMOTION WINNERS

**MIKE TURNER:** Ex-England youth goalkeeper who played 75 league games prior to joining Torquay United in July 1964, then hometown Bridport. He spent over 20 years with Plessey, settling in Poole.

**MAURICE OWEN:** Long-serving favourite, previously top scorer, who netted 150 goals in 555 league games before joining the coaching staff. He later settled back in Abingdon and died in July 2000.

**JOHN TROLLOPE:** Record appearance holder who became Swindon's coach, then manager from November 1980 until March 1983. Awarded the MBE, he had a spell as the Robins' youth team boss.

**KEITH MORGAN:** Right-half who netted six goals in 325 league games while at the County Ground, moving to hometown Trowbridge in July 1967. He has since been a builder and decorator in Swindon.

**KEN McPHERSON:** Versatile centre-half who scored three times in 107 league games for the Robins. He later ran a grocery business, then was a porter at Walgrave hospital and now lives in Nottingham.

**BOBBY WOODRUFF:** Moved to Wolves in March 1964, then Crystal Palace, Cardiff City, Newport County and Gloucester City. He was a sales rep for a sports firm before working with young offenders.

**MIKE SUMMERBEE:** Young winger who joined Manchester City in August 1965, then Burnley, Blackpool and was Stockport's player-boss. The England international became a successful businessman.

**ERNIE HUNT:** Leading scorer who moved to Wolves in September 1965, then played for Everton, Coventry City and Bristol City. He became a publican in Ledbury, then a window cleaner in Gloucester.

**JACK SMITH:** Centre-forward who moved to Brighton in January 1964, then Notts County and Margate. He managed Ramsgate and Bath City, then was Portsmouth's youth coach and died in May 2008.

**CLIFF JACKSON:** Ex-England schoolboy who joined Plymouth in June 1963, then Bert Head's Crystal Palace, Torquay and Cambridge City. He worked in community sports projects and lives in Devizes.

**ARNOLD D'ARCY:** Winger who moved to Cheltenham in July 1964, then Gravesend & Northfleet. He was a painter and decorator with Peter Chamberlain in Swindon for 36 years, settling in Southmoor.



## 1969 LEAGUE CUP WINNERS

**PETER DOWNSBOROUGH:** Ever-present goalkeeper who made 274 league appearances before joining Bradford City in November 1973. Later working at a power station, he has settled in Elland.

**ROD THOMAS:** Welsh international right-back who followed Dave Mackay to Derby County in November 1973. Later with Cardiff, Gloucester and Newport County, he became a publican in Stroud.

**JOHN TROLLOPE:** Record appearance holder who became Swindon's coach, then manager from November 1980 until March 1983. Awarded the MBE, he had a spell as the Robins' youth team boss.

**JOE BUTLER:** Versatile midfielder who netted 18 goals in 362 league games prior to joining Aldershot in August 1976, then played for Witney Town. He has since run his own taxi firm in Swindon.

**FRANK BURROWS:** Central defender who became Swindon's assistant-boss. He has held various coaching and management posts, including spells in charge of Cardiff City, Portsmouth and Swansea.

**STAN HARLAND:** Ever-present captain who joined Birmingham in December 1971. He managed Yeovil and Gravesend & Northfleet, then ran a delicatessen in Yeovil until his death in September 2001.

**DON HEATH:** Winger who moved to Oldham Athletic in July 1970, then Peterborough United, Hartlepool, Crook Town and Gateshead. Settling back in his native Stockton, he became a buyer for ICI.

**ROGER SMART:** Striker who netted 43 goals in 349 league games before joining Charlton Athletic in May 1973, then Bath City, Melksham and Trowbridge. He was licensee of The Plough in Swindon.

**JOHN SMITH:** Ex-England under-23 international who joined Walsall in June 1971. Briefly their manager, then Dundalk's player-boss, he managed a social club in Harlesden until his death in February 1988.

**PETER NOBLE:** Striker who netted 62 goals in 216 league games before joining Burnley in June 1973, then played for Blackpool. He ran his own sportswear business in Burnley and died in May 2017.

**DON ROGERS:** England under-23 winger who reunited with Bert Head at Crystal Palace in November 1972. Later with QPR, Swindon again and Yeovil Town, he has since run his own sports shop in Swindon.





## Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS traces what happened to four of Swindon Town's greatest post-war teams



### 1985/86 FOURTH DIVISION CHAMPIONS

**KENNY ALLEN:** Experienced goalkeeper who made 45 league appearances before rejoining Torquay United in December 1986. Settling in Newton Abbot, he was a postman, then a driver for a hospital.

**CHRIS RAMSEY:** Right-back who joined Southend United in August 1987. He later coached football in Malta and the United States, then became Leyton Orient's YDO and managed Newham Ladies.

**DAVE HOCKADAY:** Left-back who moved to Hull City in September 1990, then Shrewsbury. Later managing Forest Green Rovers and Leeds United, he is coach at South Gloucestershire & Stroud College.

**LEIGH BARNARD:** Midfielder who joined Cardiff City in October 1989. He rejoined Swindon as community officer, then coached in the United States and now teaches at Abbotsfield School in Hillingdon.

**DAVE COLE:** Central defender who netted three goals in 69 league games, moving to Torquay in November 1986, then Rochdale and Exeter. He then worked at a jeweller in Cheltenham, settling in Wales.

**COLIN CALDERWOOD:** Scotland international who later played for Spurs, Villa and Forest, then managed Northampton, Forest and Hibernian. He has since assisted Chris Hughton at various clubs.

**DAVE BAMBER:** Striker who netted 31 goals in 106 league games before joining Watford in June 1988, then Stoke City, Hull City and Blackpool again, where he now runs his own damp proofing company.

**CHARLIE HENRY:** Midfielder who moved to Aldershot in August 1989, then Cheltenham and Fairford Town. He worked locally for Rover and now for his brother-in-law, making stainless steel urinals.

**COLIN GORDON:** Striker who moved to Wimbledon in June 1986, then Reading, Fulham, Birmingham City and Leicester. He later managed Stourbridge and is now chairman of Kidderminster Harriers.

**BRYAN WADE:** Striker who netted 18 goals in 60 League games before joining Swansea City in August 1988, then played for Brighton, Frome and Trowbridge again. He is now a builder in his native Bath.

**CHRIS KAMARA:** Much-travelled midfielder who later played for Stoke City, Leeds United, Luton Town and Sheffield United, then managed Bradford City and Stoke. He is now a summariser for Sky TV.



### 1992/93 PLAY-OFF WINNERS

**FRASER DIGBY:** England under-21 goalkeeper who joined Crystal Palace in August 1998, then Barry, QPR and Kidderminster. Later Swindon's commercial manager, he now works for Sports Solutions GB.

**NICKY SUMMERBEE:** England under-21 international who later played for Manchester City, Sunderland, Bolton, Leicester City, Bradford City, Swindon again and Tranmere. He is now involved in property.

**PAUL BODIN:** Welsh international left-back who joined Reading in June 1996, then was Bath City's player-manager and held coaching posts including back at Swindon. His son Billy plays for Preston.

**GLENN HODDLE:** Ex-England international midfielder who was player-boss until June 1993, then managed Chelsea, England, Southampton, Spurs and Wolves. He has since been a football summariser.

**COLIN CALDERWOOD:** Scotland international who later played for Spurs, Villa and Forest, then managed Northampton, Forest and Hibernian. He has since assisted Chris Hughton at various clubs.

**SHAUN TAYLOR:** Ever-present central defender who moved to Bristol City in September 1996. Later Forest Green Rovers' assistant-boss, he has held coaching posts at Exeter City and Torquay United.

**JOHN MONCUR:** Hard-tackling midfielder who joined West Ham in June 1994. Since hanging up his boots in May 2003, he has become a born-again Christian and was briefly chairman of Grays Athletic.

**ROSS MacLAREN:** Scottish favourite who became reserve team boss. Later Aston Villa's chief scout and Notts County's assistant-manager, he now owns the Blue Bell Inn in Kirk Langley, Derby.

**DAVE MITCHELL:** Australia international striker who moved to Millwall in October 1993. He has since coached Sydney Olympic, Sydney United, Parramatta Power, Perth Glory and now Kedah.

**MARTIN LING:** Midfielder who joined Leyton Orient in July 1996, becoming their manager. He then managed Cambridge United, Torquay and Swindon before returning to Orient as director of football.

**CRAIG MASKELL:** Striker who joined Southampton in February 1994, then Brighton, Happy Valley, Leyton Orient. He has since assisted Steve Cordery at Hampton & Richmond, Aylesbury and Staines.

## THE NEWS THAT JORDAN MOORE-TAYLOR COULD BE OUT FOR SOME TIME HAS CERTAINLY COME AS A BLOW TO CITY'S PROMOTION HOPES.

It seems that the Grecians' central defensive area has been cursed this season, just as it was at the start of last season, as Troy Brown and Moore-Taylor have been sidelined with injuries for chunks of the season. The lengthy lay-offs have robbed Exeter of their first-choice defensive pairing and disrupted continuity in a key area of the pitch. Brown and Moore-Taylor complement each other well and there can't be too many better central defensive partnerships in the division.

Yet, if there is one silver lining, it is that Exeter boast a number of players who can fill the void between now and the end of the season. Dean Moxey has demonstrated his versatility in switching from left-back to play at centre half and he has done a decent job in a position he would be first to admit is not his most comfortable. Troy Archibald-Henville has had his injury problems as well, but he has rarely let Exeter down when he has been thrust into the side. His aerial presence will be invaluable between now and the beginning of May as will his physical stature which will be well suited to certain games.

Elsewhere, Luke Croll is steadily making his return from injury and he could feature over the coming weeks as the games come thick and fast. And then there is Jordan

Storey who performed so admirably in his first full start for the club in a 1-0 defeat at Luton Town.

The 20-year-old certainly possesses all the attributes to become an accomplished defender at this level and Moore-Taylor's injury setback will provide him with more opportunities.

For all of the chopping and changings at centre half, Exeter boast one of the best defensive records on home soil.

In their 18 league matches at St James Park they have conceded just 14 goals. Only Coventry, who have shipped 13 goals, have a better defensive record in the whole division. It is on the road where Exeter have struggled more defensively. Heading into Tuesday night's trip to Port Vale, they had conceded 26 goals in 18 matches – a statistic which will need to improve if they are to muscle their way into top-three contention.

At the other end of the pitch, Jayden Stockley has shouldered his fair share of goal scoring duties this season having plundered 17 goals, ahead of the trip to Port Vale, since arriving from Aberdeen at the end of August. Yet it is vital other players chip in over the last nine games if the season is to end in promotion.

Swindon Town arrive at St James Park with the best away record in the league having secured 11 wins from 19 games on the road. With Exeter boasting the same number of home victories, it promises to be an intriguing encounter.

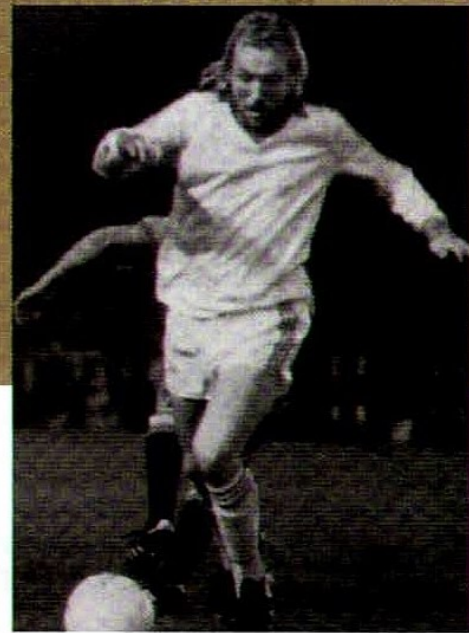

## JOHN DELVE

**BORN IN EALING IN SEPTEMBER 1953, JOHN WAS AN ENGLAND SCHOOLBOY INTERNATIONAL BEFORE HE SIGNED PROFESSIONAL TERMS WITH QUEENS PARK RANGERS IN 1972.**

Although he only made 15 appearances for Rangers, Plymouth Argyle were convinced to part with £30,000 in return for John's services in 1974. The midfielder was a consistent name on the team sheet as the Pilgrims won promotion to the Second Division in 1975.

John continued to be a regular in the team until the emergence of Gary Megson in 1977, leading to the midfielder losing his place in the team, making his final appearance for Argyle in February 1978, a 3-0 defeat at Cambridge.

After being released at the end of the season, John made his way up the Devon Expressway to join Exeter City. The midfielder went on to score 20 goals in 215 appearances for the Grecians, the highlight coming

in 1981 when John captained the side to a famous 4-0 victory over Newcastle United in the FA Cup.

John left the Grecians in 1983 to join Hereford United, aged 29. Over four seasons with the Bulls resulted in over a century of league appearances, and 11 more league goals for the Londoner.

The midfielder then dropped down to non-league in 1987, as he joined Gloucester City where he made a handful of appearances, before re-joining Exeter City for a brief spell in 1988.

After 13 appearances and one more goal, John left City for a second time to drop back into non-league, signing for Elmore, then Minehead and finally Taunton Town, where the midfielder finished his career.
