It looks set to be another season of consolidation in the Sky Bet League Two for Yeovil Town who will be hoping to finish their season with a flourish in order to secure a mid-table finish.

The Glovers, under the guidance of former player Darren Way, are currently 17th in the standings ahead of today's clash and they will be hoping to start March off on a positive note after enduring a mixed February, which saw them pick up three wins, one draw and two defeats.

Although their league form has been far from spectacular, Yeovil did enjoy a long

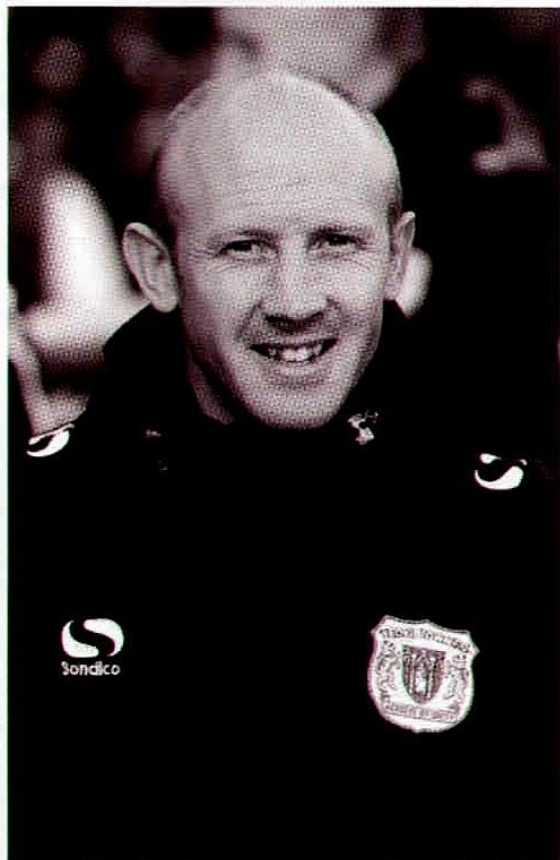
run in The Emirates FA Cup, defeating Southend United, Port Vale and Bradford City to set up a glamour Fourth Round Tie against Manchester United at Huish Park, which they lost despite producing a brave display.

Way has built a squad mixed full of youth and experience with veteran frontman Francois Zoko ably supported by talented youngsters in the ilk of Otis Khan, Rhys Browne and Sam Surridge.

The last meeting between these two sides was a dramatic one as Keshi Anderson struck in the dying minutes to secure a 2-1 victory for Town at Huish Park in November 2017.

did you know?...

THE CLUB'S NICKNAME "THE GLOVERS" IS A REFERENCE TO THE HISTORY OF GLOVE-MAKING IN THE TOWN OF YEOVIL, WHICH BECAME A CENTRE OF THE INDUSTRY DURING THE 18TH AND 19TH CENTURIES.



THE MANAGER

DARREN WAY

Darren Way has been at Yeovil Town for the club's entire period in the EFL as a player, coach and now manager.

He first arrived at Huish Park as a combative midfielder in 2000 and became a club legend by helping the Glovers achieve promotion from the National League in 2003 and League Two in 2005, as well as lifting the FA Trophy in 2002.

After leaving for Swansea City in January 2006, Way returned to Somerset on loan in 2007, before signing permanently ahead of the 2008/09 season.

However, Way's playing career was ended on December 17th, 2008 when he was involved in a severe car accident.

The determined character defied the doctor's prognosis of not being able to walk again by returning to Yeovil as a coach, working under Russell Slade, Terry Skiverton and Gary Johnson - achieving promotion to the Championship with the latter.

Two years after the club's solitary season in the second tier, Way worked under Paul Sturrock as first team coach, before taking interim charge in December 2015.

He was appointed as permanent boss after six games and led Yeovil to safety during the 2015/16 season by a margin of 14 points, putting together a six-game unbeaten run in the process and turning the club's fortunes around.

The Town legend signed a new three-year contract in the summer of 2016 to keep him at Huish Park, before guiding the Glovers to a 20th place finish during the 2016/17 campaign, accruing the club's highest points tally in the last four campaigns.

ARTUR KRYSIAK

Goalkeeper Artur Krysiak joined the Glovers at the beginning of the 2014/15 season from Devon outfit Exeter City.

After joining Birmingham from his hometown club in Poland for £60,000 in 2008, Krysiak spent time out on loan at Gretna, York, Swansea, Motherwell and Burton Albion before joining The Grecians two years later.

Krysiak made 142 appearances for Exeter over four seasons primarily as the number one keeper, before agreeing to join Yeovil on a two-year deal at the beginning of the 2014/15 season after the expiry of his contract at St James Park.

Under contract until the summer of 2018, the Polish stopper reached the 100-appearance milestone towards the end of the 2016/17 campaign.

NATHAN SMITH

The defender arrived at Huish Park for his second spell with Yeovil at the beginning of the 2014/15 season.

Smith, who was signed from non-league Potters Bar in 2008, became an instant hit with the Glovers faithful going on to make 119 appearances scoring once – a 30-yard rocket against Stockport.

The Londoner joined Chesterfield at the start of the 2011/12 season and spent three years with The Spireites being named Players' and Supporters' Player of the Season for the 2012/13 campaign.

Smith, who has two caps for Jamaica, re-joined Town ahead of the 2014/15 season and has since gone on to make over 250 appearances for the club – more than any other player since reaching the EFL in 2003.

RYAN DICKSON

Left-back Ryan Dickson returned for a second spell at Huish Park in the summer of 2015.

The experienced defender, who has made over 300 EFL appearances, enjoyed a loan spell at Huish Park in 2012 from parent club Southampton, where he made five appearances scoring once before returning to St Mary's.

Cornish born Dickson began his career with Plymouth Argyle in 2004 before joining Brentford in 2008 where he would go on to attract the attention of Southampton.

He spent three years in Hampshire including three loans before joining Colchester in 2013 and spent the 2014/15 season with Crawley, becoming a firm fans' favourite.

TOM JAMES

23

The versatile defender Tom signed for Yeovil in January 2017 from Championship outfit Cardiff City.

The Cardiff-born defender became a key part of the Bluebirds' Under-21 side before arriving in Somerset, having made his first-team debut against Chelsea in the Premier League in May 2014.

Having represented Wales at Under-19 level, James can operate across the back four and was snapped up by Darren Way, who tried to sign the young defender prior to the start of the 2016/17 season.

Having made three appearances towards the end of the 2016/17 season, James extended his Glovers stay until the summer of 2019 after agreeing a new deal.

OTIS KHAN

The talented youngster started his career at Manchester United before joining Sheffield United in 2012, enjoying loan spells at Buxton, Matlock Town and Barrow before being snapped up by Barnsley in January 2016.

Comfortable central or out wide, Khan scored on his Glovers debut netting in the 2-0 opening day victory against Notts County at Huish Park in League Two before going on to end the season with eight goals and five assists to his name.

A key part of Town's attacking force, Khan signed a new two-year deal ahead of the 2017/18 season.

CONNOR SMITH

Connor Smith joined Yeovil on a free transfer from Plymouth Argyle ahead of the 2017/18 season, penning a two-year deal.

An academy product at Watford, the former Republic of Ireland under-21 international made his debut for the Hornets in 2012 before spending brief stints with Gillingham and Stevenage.

Smith left Watford by mutual consent and signed permanently with AFC Wimbledon where he achieved promotion to Sky Bet League One via the play-offs.

He earned his second promotion in as many years, going up automatically with Plymouth in 2016/17.

RHYS BROWNE

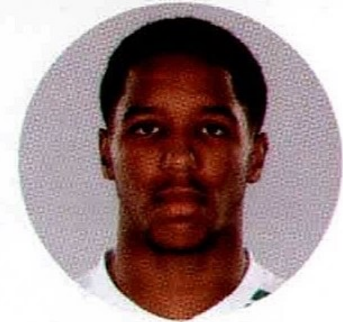
The tricky winger was signed from Grimsby Town for an undisclosed fee in the summer, putting pen to paper on a two-year contract at Huish Park.

Browne spent his youth career at Norwich City and Charlton Athletic, winning the FA Youth Cup with the latter.

With the Addicks he got international recognition, making his debut for Antigua and Barbuda in a World Cup qualifier against St Lucia in 2015 before moving to Aldershot Town where he netted six goals in his debut year.

The Romford-born wide man then moved to Grimsby with the Mariners loaning him to Macclesfield Town for the second half of the 2016/17 campaign.

He scored a number of impressive goals for the Silkmen including one at Wembley in the FA Trophy final which led to Darren Way bringing him to Huish Park.

JAMES BAILEY

The Yeovil Captain joined the club on a free transfer in July 2017, putting pen to paper on a two-year deal that ties him to the club until 2019.

Bailey began his career at Crewe Alexandra before transferring to Derby County. He made 64 appearances for the Rams in four years and was loaned out to Coventry City twice.

Barnsley purchased his signature in 2014 and after a season, he left for a new challenge.

Pune City in India was Bailey's next destination where he played against big names such as Florent Malouda, Simao and Helder Positaga.

After a solitary campaign in Asia, Bailey spent time in Canada before returning to England with Carlisle United.

The Cumbrians offered him a new deal at the end of their 2016/17 play-off campaign but he opted for pastures new with Town.

FRANCOIS ZOKO

The experienced striker initially arrived at Huish Park in November 2015 on a short-term deal, which was then extended until the end of the season.

Zoko, who has played for a host of clubs including Carlisle United, Notts County, Stevenage, Blackpool and Bradford, scored eight goals in 29 appearances during the 2015/16 season, becoming an integral part of Darren Way's side.

Having agreed to remain in Somerset, the former Ivory Coast Under 23 international finished the 2016/17 season as Town's top scorer with 13 goals, pushing him into the top 10 list of goalscorers since the club reached the EFL in 2003.

An integral part of Yeovil's strike force, Zoko signed a new deal to keep him at Huish Park until the summer of 2019.

SAM SURRIDGE

Sam Surridge joined on a season-long loan from AFC Bournemouth two days prior to the start of the 2017/18 season.

The Cherries youngster scored eight goals in 10 appearances on loan at Poole Town last term and was promoted to Eddie Howe's first-team having continued his good goalscoring form for Bournemouth Under-21s.

He featured heavily in pre-season for the Dorset outfit and went on their 10-day training camp to Marbella in the summer. He has scored six goals for the Glovers so far this term.

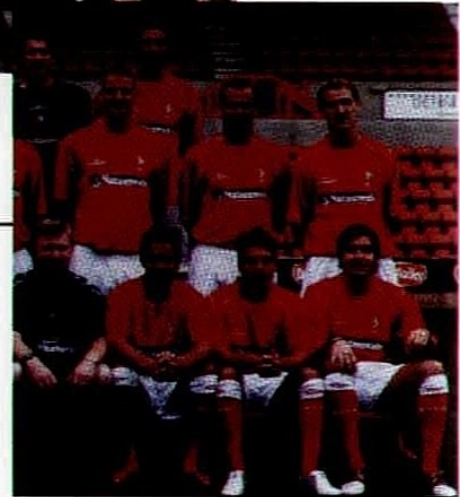

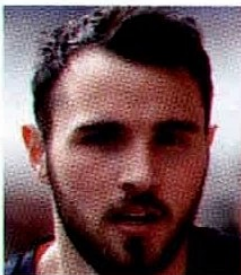

JAKE KEAN

The 6'5" stopper had been at Blackburn for five years when he linked up with League One strugglers Yeovil on loan in September 2014. He was at Huish Park for just a month before going to Oldham for the second half of the season. Jake left Ewood Park in the summer to sign for Norwich, from where he joined Town on an emergency loan in April 2016. With both Lawrence Vigouroux and Ty Belford injured he played three games in eight days. STFC 3 apps / YTFC 5



LEIGH BARNARD

Signed on a free transfer from Portsmouth by John Trollope in 1982, Leigh spent seven years at the County Ground - from 1982 to 1989 - during which Town rose from the basement to the second tier. In 1986, he scored the goal at Mansfield which clinched the Fourth Division title. Leigh assisted Yeovil during his first season at Fratton Park, joining the Somerset club on loan early in 1978. NICK NAGY

A sturdily-built 6'2" defender from Budapest, Miklos 'Nick' Nagy came to the UK soon after the last War, starting his career at Scunthorpe. After a one-month trial, Louis Page gave him a part-time pro contract at Town in August 1951. He made 35 appearances at centre-half for the reserves but two of his three games in the Third South were at inside-right. Nick left for The Huish in July 1952 and won a Southern League championship medal there in 1955. STFC 3 apps

KEVIN AMANKWAAH

After almost five years as a pro at Ashton Gate, Kevin left City to assist League Two leaders Yeovil in February 2005 - and he stayed in Somerset until the summer of 2006. Kevin arrived at the County Ground on a free two years later and in 2009/10, under his former boss Danny Wilson, he helped Town to a play-off final. Kevin was assigned squad number two for 2011/12, but his contract was terminated at the end of August. STFC 102 apps / YTFC 59



STAN EARL

When new Town boss Bert Head arrived in November 1956 to replace player-coach Geoff Fox, Stan filled the vacancy at left-back. He had broken into the Orient first team when Stan Charlton was sold to Arsenal a year earlier, the O's losing just two of the 23 games in which Earl played on their way to winning the Third South title. But Jimmy Lee and then Walter Bingley soon came to the County Ground so Stan left for Yeovil in January 1958, staying there until 1960. STFC 25 apps





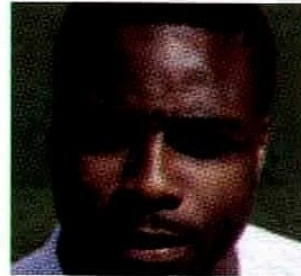
STAN HARLAND

Town's Wembley skipper in 1969, Stan had arrived from Carlisle in the summer of 1966 for a little over £6,000. A hugely talented midfielder, Terry suffered a catalogue of injuries which restricted him to barely a hundred games in ten years as a professional. He started out as a 15-year old apprentice at the County Ground in 1966, signing pro forms in November 1968. Terry's best return came in 1974/75, when he made 28 appearances, but his season ended on Boxing Day. Town cancelled his contract in February 1976 and he signed for Yeovil 18 months later. JON OBIKA

Jon had no less than four loan spells at Huish Park - netting 18 goals - either side of his first spell at Swindon at the end of 2010/11. He had spent most of the previous season in Somerset - until being loaned to Millwall in February by parent club Tottenham - and was also there for the 2011/12 campaign. Danny Wilson's penultimate signing for Town, he was largely ignored by successor Paul Hart. Jon returned on a two-year deal in 2014, scoring in each of his first four Town games. ANDY WILLIAMS

Andy first joined Yeovil in July 2010 from Bristol Rovers, finishing top scorer there in 2011/12. He made the switch to Swindon in the June, netting on his debut - his 26th birthday. But just three days after Mark Cooper took charge in August 2013, Andy was off to Huish Park on a season-long loan. That, however, finished abruptly when he ruptured a cruciate ligament in mid-October. His return to action in 2014/15 saw him top score for Town with 22 goals. STFC 105 apps / YTFC 88



HOWARD PRITCHARD

Signed from Ashton Gate in July 1981, the Welsh winger had been relegated with City in his last two seasons there. Unfortunately, he made that a hat-trick in 1982 when Town fell into the basement. Howard managed only one League goal that season - at City! He was rather more prolific in the F.A.Cup during his stay with Town, netting eight in eight games. Howard moved to Yeovil in November 1990, soon after the opening of Huish Park. STFC 76 apps / YTFC 38



DON ROGERS

Somerset-born, at Old Mills near Paulton, The Huish was the venue for Don's first away trip with Town's first team - a Second Round F.A.Cup tie in November 1962. The winger went on to net 90 goals in just three seasons on his way to a 180-goal haul that would make him Swindon's third highest scorer of all time. After four years in the capital, Don came back to end his career in Wiltshire, spending two months on loan at Yeovil in 1977 when former teammate Stan Harland was manager there. STFC 490 apps



Swindon-born centre-forward **DICK PLUMB** made 337 appearances for Yeovil, netting 150 goals for the club in two spells at The Huish - from 1968 to 1970 and 1974 to 1978 - placing him second in the list of top post-War goalscorers there. He had begun his career as an apprentice at the County Ground, in May 1962, and two years later was in the line-up that played Manchester United in the semi-final of the F.A.Youth Cup. By that time Dick had joined the pro ranks at Town but was unable to break into Bert Head's first team squad and moved on to Bristol Rovers in May 1965.

I've really enjoyed it. At first I wasn't in the team but I thought it was down to myself to get back into the team and since I've been back in I've really enjoyed it.



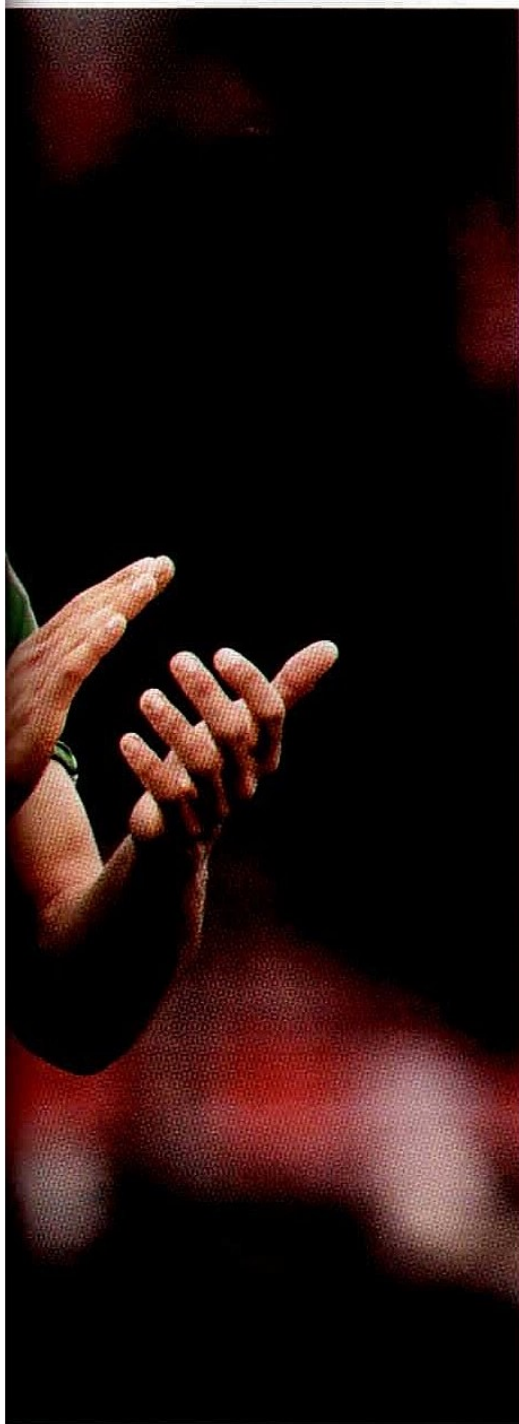

WE KNOW THE SCORE- DO YOU?

This April is Bowel Cancer Awareness Month and Swindon Town Football in the Community and Swindon Town Football Club are supporting the eighth annual Know the Score campaign.

Bowel cancer is the UK's fourth most common cancer, with over 41,200 new cases each year. It's also the second biggest cancer killer. Every 90 minutes three people die of the disease. That's 44 people each day - the equivalent to four football teams - but it needn't be that way. Bowel cancer is treatable and curable especially if diagnosed early. Over 95% of bowel cancer patients will survive the disease for five years or more if diagnosed at the earliest stage.

Symptoms of bowel cancer can include:

- Bleeding for your bottom and/or blood in your poo
- A change in bowel habit lasting three weeks or more
- Extreme tiredness for no obvious reason
- A pain or lump in your tummy
- Unexplained weight loss

Most people with these symptoms won't have bowel cancer, but if you have one or more of these, or if things just don't feel right, visit your doctor. You're not wasting anyone's time by getting it checked out. If it's not serious, your mind will be eased, and if it is bowel cancer, the earlier you are diagnosed, the better the chance of successful treatment and cure. A trip to your doctor could save your life.

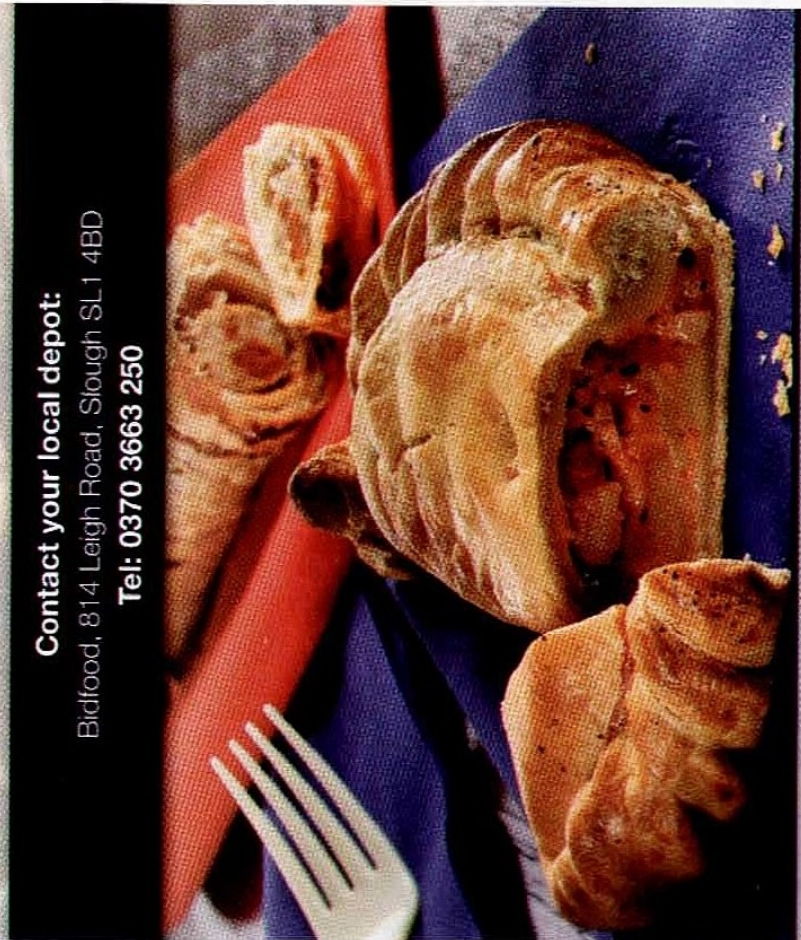

BY ROAD

Leave the M4 at Junction 26 and take the A4051 towards Newport. After going under a flyover on the A4042, you will reach a large roundabout where you take the second exit keeping in the filter lane towards the City Centre/Railway Station. At the next roundabout take the first exit going across the river onto the B4591 towards Maindee. At the traffic lights bear right onto Chepstow Road and then take the first right into Corporation Road. Take the next right into Grafton Road and the entrance to the ground is down on the left.



PARKING

There is no parking available for fans in the main club car park, although you will be able to find street parking around the ground. City centre car parks are located 15-minutes walk away.



BY TRAIN

Newport Railway Station is situated around a quarter of a mile away from the stadium and is a short walk. The station is served by trains from London Paddington, Bristol Temple Meads and Birmingham New Street. As you come out of the main station entrance turn left along the main road. Follow this road until you reach a large roundabout, then take the pedestrian underpass down underneath the roundabout and at the centre turn left towards Clarence Place/River Usk. After you have come back up to street level you should see a bridge in front of you going across the river. Cross the bridge and then take the first right-hand turn into Rodney Parade and the stadium is down this road on the left.



PUBS

There is a clubhouse at the ground which does admit away fans. Alternatively, there is the Excelsior Club on Corporation Road and a Wetherspoons called the Godfrey Morgan on Chepstow Road.
