

When former Manchester United midfielder and Scottish international Macari became the Robins' player-manager in the summer of 1984, he joined a club in the doldrums. Rarely a side to warrant inclusion on the back pages of the nationals, a League Cup final triumph over Arsenal at Wembley in 1969 was the most noteworthy achievement in the Wiltshire outfit's 105-year history. Worse still, the club had spent three seasons in the ignominy of Division Four, finishing the 1983/84 season in an all-time low 17th position. But the arrival of the brilliant Scot changed everything. Macari led a revival in which the club soared from near the bottom of Division Four to just a couple of victories away from the top flight in a staggeringly short spell. This is a tale of unprecedented success and unfortunate consequences. Forty years after Macari arrived at the County Ground, his legacy at the club still burns brightly.
